#### AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8178 OR THE "AGRICULTURAL TARIFFICATION ACT OF 1996," AS AMENDED

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Last year's rice crisis saw inflation skyrocket, consumer prices ballooning to 5.2%, way past Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas' 2% target. The largest segment of that increase was ascribed to inflated rice prices, reaching P75.00-P100.00 per kilogram in Zamboanga City and parts of the Visayas.

While Congress' speedy passage of the Rice Tariffication Act last February 2019 quickly brought rice prices and inflation down, large-scale rice importation had the opposite effect of local rice prices crashing to P27.00 per kilogram, *palay* or unmilled rice falling to an unheard - of P7.00 per kilogram.

While the Philippines' compliance with its World Trade Organization (WTO) obligation to impose a bound tariff rate system through the Rice Tariffication Act is important, recent experience once again asserts government's role in managing, regulating, and even intervening in national rice supplies to guarantee food security and farmers' income. As a fundamental Filipino staple, the crucial, political, and economic role that rice plays in Filipino society can neither overstated or left unregulated.

This bill seeks firstly to expand the function of the national rice buffer to cover both natural catastrophes and commodity crises. It explicitly defines the power of the President to automatically undertake safeguards and other measures in the event of both a rice shortage, such as occurred in September 2018, and the rice surplus, as endured through February 2019. Further, financial assistance is also sought for farmers displaced by wholesale importation and other impacts of agricultural modernization.

## AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8178 OR THE "AGRICULTURAL TARIFFICATION ACT OF 1996," AS AMENDED

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 3 (e) of R.A. No. 8178 is hereby amended to read as follows: 1 2 "SEC. 3 (e) 'Buffer Stock' refers to the optimal level of rice inventory 3 that shall be maintained at ALL TIMES FOR USE DURING 4 **EMERGENCIES, IN ORDER** [any given time to be used for emergency 5 situations and] to sustain the disaster relief programs of the government 6 during natural or man-made calamities, AS WELL AS DURING 7 COMMODITY MARKET CRISES, FOR THE PURPOSE OF 8 STABILIZING PRICES IN THE COMMUNITY MARKET AND 9 ENSURING FOOD SECURITY;" 10 11 XXX SEC. 2. Section 7 (a) of R.A. No. 8178 is hereby amended to read as follows: 12 "Sec. 7. Powers of the President. - Consistent with the Philippine 13 national interest and the objective of safeguarding Filipino farmers and 14 consumers, the President is hereby empowered to act with full delegated 15

authority subject to the provisions of the CMTA. in the following 2 circumstances:

"(a) The President may increase, reduce, revise, or adjust existing rates 3 of import duty up to the bound rate committed by the Philippines under the 4 WTO Agreement on Agriculture and under the ATIGA, including any 5 necessary change in classification applicable to the importation of 6 7 rice: *Provided,* That the power herein delegated to the President shall only be exercised when Congress is not in session: *Provided, further,* That any 8 order issued by the President adjusting the applied tariff rates shall take 9 effect fifteen (15) days after publication; 10

(b) In the event of any imminent or forecasted shortage, or such other 11 12 situation requiring government intervention, the President is empowered for 13 a limited period and/or a specified volume, to allow the importation at a lower applied tariff rate to address the situation. Such order shall take effect 14 immediately and can only be issued when Congress is not in session; 15

HOWEVER, WHEN THERE IS AN EXCESSIVE SUPPLY OF 16 IMPORTED OR LOCAL RICE RESULTING IN A CRASH IN LOCAL 17 18 RICE PRICES, THE PRESIDENT MAY SIMILARLY STOP OR PROHIBIT FURTHER IMPORTATION FOR A LIMITED PERIOD AND 19 FOR SPECIFIED VOLUME UNTIL SUCH TIME AS BOTH RICE SUPPLY 20 AND PRICES STABILIZE; and 21

(c) In case the calculated out-quota tariff rate referred to under Section 22 23 6 (c) of this Act exceeds one hundred percent (100%), the provision of Paragraph 1, Section 1608(a) of the CMTA shall also not apply. 24

- The power herein delegated to the President may be withdrawn or 25 terminated by Congress through a Joint Resolution." 26
- SEC. 3. Section 8 of R.A. No. 8178 is hereby amended to read as follows: 27

28 "SEC. 8. Maintenance of Rice Buffer Stock. – The NFA shall, in accordance with the **IMPLEMENTING** rules, regulations, and procedures to be 29

4 SEC. 4. Sections 13 (a) and (d) of R.A. 8178 is hereby amended to read as 5 follows:

"(a) Rice Farmer Financial Assistance – A portion of the excess rice tariff 6 revenues shall be released to the DA and shall be used for providing direct 7 financial assistance to rice farmers who are farming two (2) hectares and 8 below regardless of whether they continue farming rice or not as 9 compensation for the projected reduction or loss of farm income arising 10 11 from the tariffication of the quantitative import restrictions on rice. FARMWORKERS DISPLACED BY FARM MECHANIZATION AND 12 OTHER MODERNIZATION SCHEMES, LISTED IN THE REGISTRY 13 SYSTEM FOR BASIC SECTORS IN AGRICULTURE (RSBSA) ARE 14 ALSO ENTITLED TO DIRECT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE: 15

(d) Crop Diversification Program – [A portion of the excess tariff revenues
 shall be released to the DA and shall be used for productivity-enhancement]
 TWENTY PERCENT (20%) OF THE RICE FUND SHALL BE MADE

 farmers seeking to diversify production [towards] TO other crops[.],

23 SEC. 5. Sections 14 of R.A. 8178 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 14. *Beneficiaries of the Rice Fund.* - The beneficiaries of the Rice
 Fund shall be those farmers and farmworkers and their dependents listed
 in the Registry System for Basic Sectors in Agriculture (RSBSA), and rice
 cooperatives and associations accredited by the DA AND OTHER KEY
 STAKEHOLDERS OF THE RICE VALUE CHAIN, INCLUDING INPUT
 SUPPLIERS, SERVICE PROVIDERS, RICE MILLERS, AND RICE BASED FOOD MANUFACTURERS. Within one hundred eighty (180) days

SEC. 6. Sections 15 of R.A. 11203 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 15. Rice Industry Roadmap. - Upon the effectivity of this Act, the DA, 7 together with the NEDA, Department of Finance (DOF), DBM, DAR, National 8 Irrigation Administration (NIA), TESDA, PCIC, National Anti-Poverty 9 Commission (NAPC) Farmer Sectoral Council Representative and other 10 government agencies concerned, including rice farmer representatives, 11 shall be given a maximum of one hundred eighty (180) days to formulate 12 and adopt the rice roadmap to restructure the government's delivery of 13 support services for the agricultural rice sector. 14

15 "The following principles shall govern the development and implementation16 of the roadmap for the rice industry:

"The rice industry roadmap shall be implemented through a
complementation of the DA's rice sector programs as funded by the GAA,
and the Rice Fund created under this Act."

SEC. 7. *Separability Clause.* - If any portion of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the portions or provisions which are not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SEC. 8. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, decrees, executive issuances, rules and regulations inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 9. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
