RESOLUTION

CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL
ARNIS TEAM AND THEIR COACHING STAFF FOR WINNING FOURTEEN
GOLD MEDALS, FOUR SILVER MEDALS, AND TWO BRONZE MEDALS AT THE
30TH SOUTHEAST ASIAN GAMES HELD IN ANGELES CITY, PAMPANGA

WHEREAS, Arnis, the National Martial Art and Sport of the Philippines as declared in Republic Act No. 9850, was last featured in the Southeast Asian Games (SEA Games) in 2005 and has been included as a regular sport for the 2019 SEA Games, with competitors from Cambodia, Myanmar, Vietnam and the Philippines;

WHEREAS, the Arnis events of the SEA Games were held at the Angeles University Foundation in Angeles City, Pampanga from December 1 to 3, 2019 and were divided into live stick, padded stick, and Anyo categories for men and women, with the live stick and padded stick events further separated into weight divisions, and the Anyo events into traditional and non-traditional categories;

WHEREAS, the Philippine National Arnis Team (PNAT) delivered strong performances against worthy competitors throughout all the categories, and managed the incredible feat of landing twenty podium finishes overall, with fourteen gold medals, four silver medals, and two bronze medals across all the categories;

WHEREAS, this feat of PNAT made them, by far, the most bemedaled Philippine Team in the 30th SEA Games and their fourteen gold medal haul is predicted to be more than ten percent of the total gold medal haul of the Philippines in this biennial event;

WHEREAS, behind the success of the PNAT is a passionate and hardworking coaching staff headed by Grandmaster Richardson C. Gialogo whose astute guidance and discipline led the team to its ultimate victory;
