AN ACT

INSTITUTIONALIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF TIMBANGAN NG BAYAN CENTERS IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE MARKETS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE CHAPTER II, TITLE III OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7394 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "CONSUMER ACT OF THE PHILIPPINES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	Section 1. Chapter II, Title III of Republic Act No. 7394, otherwise known as
2	the "Consumer Act of the Philippines" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	"CHAPTER II
4	"Art. 61. X X X
5	"Art. 62. X X X
6	"ARTICLE 62-A. ESTABLISHMENT OF TIMBANGAN NG BAYAN
7	CENTERS. – ALL PROVINCIAL, CITY AND MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENTS,
8	THROUGH THEIR PROVINCIAL, CITY AND MUNICIPAL TREASURERS,
9	SHALL ESTABLISH ACCESSIBLE TIMBANGAN NG BAYAN CENTERS IN
10	ALL PUBLIC AND PRIVATE MARKETS, INCLUDING MALLS,
11	SUPERMARKETS, WET MARKETS, DRY MARKETS, AND WHEN
12	PRACTICABLE, IN FLEA MARKETS OR TIANGGES, SPECIALTY STORES,
13	AND GROCERY STORES, WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE LOCALITIES.

THESE CENTERS MUST HAVE THE NECESSARY WEIGHING AND
 MEASURING INSTRUMENTS WHICH SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO ALL
 PERSONS WHO NEED TO CONFIRM THE ACCURACY OF THE WEIGHT
 QUANTITY OR MEASUREMENTS OF PRODUCTS PURCHASED OR
 ABOUT TO BE PURCHASED.

THE MARKET OR MALL SUPERVISOR SHALL BE IN CHARGE OF 6 7 THE SAFEKEEPING AND MAINTENANCE OF THE WEIGHING AND MEASURING INSTRUMENTS AND SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR 8 MAINTAINING A RECORD OF EVERY PRODUCT FOUND TO BE 9 LACKING IN QUANTITY OR IS SUBSTANDARD IN DIMENSION, AS 10 WELL AS THE ESTABLISHMENT WHERE THE SAME WAS BOUGHT 11 INCLUDING THE NAME/S OF THE PROPRIETOR/S OR MANAGER/S 12 THEREOF. 13

"A CERTIFICATION DULY ISSUED BY THE MARKET OR MALL SUPERVISOR OR HIS/HER AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE REFLECTING THE CONTENTS OF SUCH RECORD SHALL BE *PRIMA FACIE* EVIDENCE OF A VIOLATION OF ARTICLE 64 OF THIS ACT.

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18 "THE PROHIBITED ACTS PROVIDED UNDER SECTION 64 OF
 19 THIS ACT SHALL LIKEWISE APPLY TO *TIMBANGAN NG BAYAN* 20 INSTRUMENTS.

 MARKET AND LARGER THAN A GROCERY IN WHICH SHOPPERS

"ART. 62-C. ASSISTANCE TO PROVINCIAL, CITY AND 22 MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENTS. - THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND 23 24 INDUSTRY (DTI) SHALL PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO PROVINCES, 25 CITIES AND MUNICIPALITIES IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF TIMBANGAN NG BAYAN CENTERS NATIONWIDE UNDER ITS 26 CONSUMER PROTECTION AND OTHER RELEVANT PROGRAMS AND 27 PROJECTS: PROVIDED, THAT PRIORITY SHALL BE ACCORDED TO 28 PROVINCES, CITIES AND MUNICIPALITIES BELONGING TO FOURTH, 29 FIFTH AND SIXTH INCOME CLASSIFICATIONS. 30

9	"Art. 65. Penalties. – a) Any person who shall violate the provisions of
10	paragraphs (a) to (f) and paragraph (I) of Article 64 OF THIS ACT or its
11	implementing rules and regulations shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine
12	of not less than [Two hundred pesos (P200.00)] FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS
13	(P50,000.00) but not more than [One thousand pesos (P1,000.00)] THREE
14	HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P300,000.00) or by imprisonment of not
15	[more] LESS than one (1) year BUT NOT MORE THAN FIVE (5) YEARS or
16	both upon the discretion of the court.
17	b) Any person who shall violate the provisions of paragraph (g) of
18	Article 64 for the first time shall be subject to a fine of not less than [Five
19	hundred pesos (P500.00)] FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (P50,000.00) BUT
20	NOT MORE THAN THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS
21	(P300,000.00) or by imprisonment of not less than one (1) [month] YEAR
22	but not more than five (5) years or both $[_{\overline{7}}]$ upon the discretion of the court.
23	c) The owner [-], possessor or user of instruments of weights and
24	measures enumerated in paragraphs (h) to (k) of Article 64 OF THIS ACT
25	shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than [Three hundred
26	pesos (P300.00)] FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (P50,000.00) BUT NOT
27	MORE THAN THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P300,000.00) or
28	BY imprisonment of not [exceeding one] LESS THAN (1) year BUT NOT
29	MORE THAN FIVE (5) YEARS $[_7]$ or both $[_7]$ upon the discretion of the court:
30	PROVIDED , THAT TWO (2) SUCCESSIVE VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT
31	SHALL AUTOMATICALLY RESULT IN THE CANCELLATION OF THE
32	BUSINESS PERMIT OF THE ERRING INDIVIDUAL OR BUSINESS

ESTABLISHMENT."

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Sec. 2. *Implementing Rules and Regulations* – Within sixty (60) days from the approval of this Act, the Department of the Interior and Local Government and the DTI shall, in coordination with the Union of Local Authorities of the Philippines, the League of Provinces of the Philippines, the League of Cities of the Philippines, the League of Municipalities of the Philippines, and other relevant government agencies and stakeholders, promulgate the rules and regulations to effectively implement the provisions of this Act.

Sec. 3. Separability Clause. – If any provision, section or part of this Act shall
 be declared unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, invalidate or
 impair any other provisions, sections or parts hereof.

Sec. 4. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations
 which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified
 accordingly.

Sec. 5. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its
 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation or in the *Official Gazette.*
