AN ACT

PROTECTING CONSUMERS AND USERS AGAINST FORCED E-BILLING, ADDING FOR THIS PURPOSE A NEW PROVISION AND AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7394, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE CONSUMER ACT OF THE PHILIPPINES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	Section 1. – A new Article 51-A is hereby inserted in Republic Act No. 7394.
2	otherwise known as the Consumer Act of the Philippines, to read as follows:
3	"SEC. 51-A. BILLING STATEMENTS AND OTHER TRANSACTION
4	DOCUMENTS MAY BE SENT IN PRINTED OR ELECTRONIC
5	FORM AT THE OPTION OF, AND WITHOUT ANY ADDITIONAL
6	COST, TO CONSUMERS. THE CONSUMERS' RIGHT TO SELECT
7	THE MODE IN WHICH THEY RECEIVE THEIR BILLING
8	STATEMENTS AND OTHER TRANSACTION DOCUMENTS MAY
9	NOT BE CONDITIONED ON THE VALUE OF THE PRODUCTS OR
10	SERVICES PROVIDED IN THE TRANSACTION."

11 Sec. 2. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, executive orders, presidential decrees, 12 presidential proclamations, letters of implementation, rules and regulations or parts 13 thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified 14 accordingly. 1 Sec. 3. *Separability Clause*. - If any provision of this Act is declared invalid or 2 unconstitutional, the provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force 3 and effect.

Sec. 4. *Effectivity*. - This Act shall take effect upon its approval fifteen (15)
days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of
general circulation in the Philippines.
