

AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7610, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "SPECIAL PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AGAINST ABUSE, EXPLOITATION AND DISCRIMINATION ACT", AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 13 of the 1987 Constitution provides that, "the State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being. It shall inculcate in the youth patriotism and nationalism, and encourage their involvement in public and civic affairs." The State, thus, places primordial importance to the rights and needs of minors since they are considered to be vulnerable to all forms of abuse and exploitation. Most laws are geared towards promoting their best interests such as Republic Act No. 9344 otherwise known as the "Juvenile Justice and Welfare Act," as amended, and Republic Act No. 7610, or the "Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act."


In 2019, the Senate Committee on Cultural Communities conducted an investigation, in aid of legislation, on the closure of fifty-five (55) Lumad schools for indigenous children in the Davao region. Public hearings unfolded findings that the minors, some as young as nine (9) years old, were taught how to fire weapons and sing a different national anthem, among others. Worse, they are persuaded to leave their homes in order to join a cause they do not yet fully understand.

Under the circumstances, the minors were deprived of their right to education, to a life free from armed conflicts, and to develop their full potential. This bill seeks to expand the definition of child abuse to include indoctrination, training, recruitment, transportation, or taking in order to engage in activities detrimental to their well-being, and to penalize the same.

Thus, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7610, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "SPECIAL PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AGAINST ABUSE, EXPLOITATION AND DISCRIMINATION ACT", AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Declaration of Policy. – The State upholds the right of every child to
 maximize his/her full potential and become a responsible member of the society, able
 to make sound decisions and contribute to the community in his/her own way.

It shall be the policy of the State to ensure that a child grows in an environment conducive to his/her full development, with access to quality education, under the ambit of protection and guidance of his/her parents or legal guardians, and with care to treat them as zones of peace, free from exposure and participation to any kind of armed conflict.
