

EXPRESSING THE SENSE OF THE SENATE TO DISCOURAGE HANDSHAKING AS IT POSES DANGER IN HEALTH AND CAN ESCALATE THE SPREAD OF VIRUS AND GERMS

WHEREAS, the handshake is known as a social custom all over the globe when recognizing a person one may encounter, as a sign of respect and courtesy, or even as an everyday greeting. It is considered part of proper etiquette and universal decorum as it conveys trust and confidence. While the actual gesture may vary between cultures, the touching of hands remains a general element;

WHEREAS, despite the associated social graces, the handshake poses significant health risks, and has been identified as a means for passing ailments and respiratory viruses (COVID-19) as stated by the World Health Organization. A study conducted by the American Journal of Infection Control revealed that handshakes transfer most of E. coli bacteria as compared with fist bumps and high fives;

WHEREAS, on 31 December 2019, a novel coronavirus was identified in Wuhan, Chin, which quicky spread throughout the globe. As a result, a pandemic was declared in a matter of months, infecting millions and killing thousands all over the world;

WHEREAS, said Corona Virus, which is the cause of the COVID-19 disease, can be easily transmitted from one person to another when virus-infected droplets are released to the air or onto surfaces through sneezes or coughs. These droplets may reach the nose, mouth, or eyes of a person as he or she touches contaminated objects and surfaces, or comes into sustained close contact with somebody who has been infected. They may also be spread as a carrier exchanges a handshake with others;

WHEREAS, citizens are urged not to use the handshake as a form of greeting to protect oneself and also other people. Even during the flu season every cold months of the year, it is recommended to skip handshakes to prevent infecting others;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved, to express the sense of the Congress to discourage handshaking and promote hand hygiene to minimize the spread of infectious diseases, bacteria and viruses.
