## RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, TO DETERMINE AND ASSESS THE **RESPONSE AND ACTION PLANS OF THE PROFESSIONAL REGULATION** COMMISSION (PRC), THE SUPREME COURT (SC), THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION (CSC), THE NATIONAL POLICE COMMISSION (NAPOLCOM), THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION (CHED), AND THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (HEIs), ON THE **ENTRANCE** OF ITS RESPECTIVE AND LICENSURE CONDUCT **EXAMINATIONS AMID THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND IN PREPARATION** FOR THE NEW NORMAL

1 WHEREAS, on 30 January 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) 2 declared the outbreak of Coronavirus (COVID-19) disease as a public health 3 emergency of international concern;

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted a lot of countries worldwide, placing the global count of confirmed coronavirus cases to 5,335,868 million and the total number of global deaths to 341,549 as of 24 May 2020, according to Johns Hopkins University's case tracker;

8 WHEREAS, serious health concerns on coronavirus along with the lockdown 9 measures in different countries have affected almost all sectors globally including the 10 education sector, which saw an interruption on the academic year and a forced 11 cancellation or postponement of classes and examinations;

WHEREAS, Mr. Gwang-Chol Chang, Chief of United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Section of Education Policy has indicated that based on the organization's rapid global analysis, 58 out of 84 surveyed countries had postponed or rescheduled exams, 23 introduced alternative methods such as online exam, 22 maintained exams, while 11 countries cancelled
examinations altogether;

3 WHEREAS, for the first time, in March 2020, 280 sixth-year medicine 4 undergraduates of the Imperial College London took a remote final exams online 5 composed of 150 questions in a span of three hours;

6 WHEREAS, in the Philippines, the Professional Regulation Commission 7 postponed 24 licensure exams from March to July 2020 due to the continuous 8 spread of COVID-19 in the country;

9 WHEREAS, on 29 April 2020, the Supreme Court issued Bar Bulletin No. 11, s. 10 2020 which postponed the 2020 Bar examinations to 2021 due to the increasing 11 number of COVID-19 cases in the country, as well as the social and economic 12 disruption caused by the pandemic;

WHEREAS, the Civil Service Commission suspended the Career Service
Examination-Pen and Paper Test (CSE-PPT) nationwide scheduled on 15 March 2020
with expected participants of 293,845 individuals;

16 WHEREAS, the Philippine National Police Entrance and Promotional Exam on 17 26 April 2020 was suspended and re-scheduled tentatively in October 2020 by the 18 NAPOLCOM;

19 WHEREAS, according to CHED Chairman Prospero De Vera III during the 20 Senate's Committee of the Whole hearing on 21 May 2020, several colleges and 21 universities have opted to waive entrance examinations and instead assess students' 22 admission based on their high school general average;

23 WHEREAS, in the same hearing, Chairman De Vera III informed the upper 24 chamber that there are some state universities and colleges (SUCs) who are keen to 25 have a combination of an online test and physical test;

WHEREAS, despite the cancellation, postponement, and modification of different exams nationwide, the concerned agencies and other stakeholders should work on crafting plans that will safeguard the integrity of all examinations while assuring that minimum recommended health protocols are well in place with due regard to the specific needs of individuals with disabilities, with less conducive environment, with no access to internet, and those who are currently in isolation;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the 1 2 Senate of the Philippines, to direct the appropriate senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, to determine and assess the response and action plans 3 of the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), the Supreme Court (SC), the Civil 4 Service Commission (CSC), the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM), the 5 Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and the public and private Higher 6 Education Institutions (HEIS) on the conduct of their respective entrance and 7 8 licensure examinations amid the COVID-19 pandemic and in preparation of the New 9 Normal.
