IMPOSING STIFFER PENALTIES FOR CHILD ABUSE, EXPLOITATION AND DISCRIMINATION, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7610, AS AMENDED

EXPLANATORY NOTE

It is deplorable that Filipino children are coerced by circumstance, poverty, or by their own families into exploitative labor practices and situations that are prone to all manners of abuse. A 2018 report have documented that Filipino children are among those who experience the worst forms of child labor, which includes commercial sexual exploitation, backbreaking labor in agriculture, and dangerous tasks in gold mining, among others.

The same report has shed a damning light to the plight of these children, which are estimated to be at 3.2 million, with approximately 3 million involved in unsafe labor. Perhaps more disturbing is the use of children by syndicates in their distribution network, where they are given tasks in the procuring, distribution, and selling of illegal drugs¹.

Exploitation of children, sometimes even by their own families, have been fueled by the COVID-19 pandemic and made easier with existing technologies. From March to May of this year alone, the country's Department of Justice have received 279,166 cases of online sexual exploitation involving children². It is not hard to imagine that so much more cases are occurring unreported. As such, this bill is proposing stiffer penalties on perpetrators who abuse and exploit children in any and all ways.

It is of paramount importance that children's rights and welfare are secured, especially those who are most vulnerable.

In light of this, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.



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IMPOSING STIFFER PENALTIES FOR CHILD ABUSE, EXPLOITATION AND DISCRIMINATION, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7610, AS AMENDED

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 9 of Republic Act No. 7610, otherwise known as the "Special Protection of Children Against Child Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act", is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 9. Obscene Publications and Indecent Shows. — Any person who shall hire, employ, use, persuade, induce or coerce a child to perform in obscene exhibitions and indecent shows, whether live or in video, pose, or model in obscene publications or pornographic materials or to sell or distribute the said materials shall suffer the penalty [of *prision mayor* in its medium period] FROM FOURTEEN (14) YEARS, EIGHT (8) MONTHS AND ONE (1) DAY TO SEVENTEEN (17) YEARS AND FOUR (4) MONTHS.

"If the child used as a performer, subject or seller/distributor is below twelve (12) years of age, the penalty shall be [imposed in its maximum period] THIRTY (30) YEARS AND ONE (1) DAY TO FORTY (40) YEARS.

"Any ascendant, guardian, or person entrusted in any capacity with the care of a child who shall cause and/or allow such child to be employed or to participate in an obscene play, scene, act, movie or show or in any other acts covered by this section shall suffer from penalty [of *prision mayor* in its medium period] FROM SEVENTEEN (17) YEARS, FOUR (4) MONTHS AND ONE (1) DAY TO TWENTY (20) YEARS."

"If the child used as a performer, subject or seller/distributor is below twelve (12) years of age, the penalty shall be [imposed in its maximum period] THIRTY (30) YEARS AND ONE (1) DAY TO FORTY (40) YEARS.

"Any ascendant, guardian or person entrusted in any capacity with the care of a child who shall cause and/or allow such child to be employed 1 or to participate in an obscene play, scene, act, movie or show or in any 2 other acts covered by this section shall suffer the penalty [of prison mayor in its medium period] FROM SEVENTEEN (17) YEARS, FOUR (4) 3 MONTHS AND ONE (1) DAY TO TWENTY (20) YEARS." Sec. 2. Section 10 of the same Act as amended, is hereby amended to read as 5 follows: 6 7 "Sec. 10. Other Acts of Neglect, Abuse, Cruelty or Exploitation and Other 8

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38 39 Conditions Prejudicial to the Child's development. -

"(a) Any person who shall commit any other acts of child abuse, cruelty or exploitation or be responsible for other conditions prejudicial to the child's development including those covered by Article 59 of Presidential Decree No. 603, as amended, shall suffer the penalty [of prison mayor in its medium period] FROM TWELVE (12) YEARS, AND ONE (1) DAY TO FOURTEEN (14) YEARS AND EIGHT (8) MONTHS.

"(b) Any person who shall keep or have in his company a minor, twelve (12) years or under ten (10) years or more his junior in any public or private place, hotel, motel, beer joint, discotheque, cabaret, pension house, sauna or massage parlor, beach and/or tourist resort or similar places shall suffer the penalty [of prison mayor in its maximum period] FROM FOURTEEN (14) YEARS, EIGHT (8) MONTHS AND ONE (1) DAY TO SEVENTEEN (17) YEARS AND FOUR (4) MONTHS and a fine of not less than [Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000)] FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P500,000.00): Provided, That this provision shall not apply to any person who is related within the fourth degree of consanguinity or affinity or any bond recognized by law, local custom and tradition, or acts in the performance of a social, moral or legal duty.

"(c) Any person who shall induce, deliver or offer a minor to any one prohibited by this Act to keep or have in his company a minor as provided in the preceding paragraph shall suffer the penalty [of prison mayor in its medium standard] FROM TEN (10) YEARS AND ONE (1) DAY TO TWELVE (12) YEARS and a fine of not less than [Forty thousand pesos (P40,000)] FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P400,000.00): Provided, however, That should the perpetrator be an ascendant, stepparent or quardian of the minor, the penalty to be imposed shall be [prison mayor in its maximum period] FROM FOURTEEN (14) YEARS, EIGHT (8) MONTHS AND ONE (1) DAY TO SEVENTEEN (17) YEARS AND FOUR (4) MONTHS, a fine of not less than [Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000)] FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P500,000.00), and the loss of parental authority over the minor.

11	and a fine of not less than [Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000)] FIVE
12	HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P500,000.00), and the loss of the
13	license to operate such a place or establishment.
14	"(e) Any person who shall use, coerce, force or intimidate a
15	streetchild or any other child to:
16	"(1) Beg or use begging AS a means of living;
17	"(2) Act as conduit or middlemen in drug trafficking or
18	pushing; or
19	"(3) Conduct any illegal activities, shall suffer the penalty [or
20	prison correctional in its medium period to reclusion perpetua
21	FROM TWELVE (12) YEARS AND ONE (1) DAY TO
22	THIRTY (30) YEARS.

24	Sec. 3. Section 16 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended to
25	read as follows:
26	"Sec. 16. Penal Provisions. —
27	"a) Any employer who violates Section 12, 12-A, and Section of this
28	Act, as amended, shall be penalized by imprisonment of [six months]
29	ONE (1) YEAR and one (1) day to six (6) years or a fine of not less
30	than [Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000.00)] ONE HUNDRED
31	THOUSAND PESOS (P100,000.00) but not more than [Three
32	hundred thousand pesos (P300,000.00)] FOUR HUNDRED

2	He/she shall likewise order the immediate closure of such firm or

5	the death, insanity or serious physical injury of a child employed in

8	prostitution or in obscene or lewd shows.

12	Sec. 4. Section 20 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:
13	"Sec. 20. Discrimination. – Children of indigenous cultural communities shall
14	not be subjected to any and all forms of discrimination.
15	"Any person who discriminates against children of indigenous cultural
16	communities shall suffer a penalty [of arresto mayor in its maximum period]
17	FROM TWO (2) YEARS, FOUR (4) MONTHS AND ONE (1) DAY TO
18	FOUR (4) YEARS AND TWO (2) MONTHS and a fine of not less than
19	[Five thousand pesos (P5,000)] FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS
20	(P50,000.00) nor more than [Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00)] ONE
21	HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P100,000.00).
22	"THE OFFENDER SHALL LIKEWISE UNDERGO A
23	REEDUCATION AND REORIENTATION PROGRAM ON THE
24	INDIGENOUS PEOPLES CULTURE OF THE PHILIPPINES, TO BE
25	CONDUCTED BY THE NATIONAL COMMISSION N INDIGENOUS

28	Sec. 5. Within one hundred eighty (180) days from the effectivity of this Act, the
29	Secretary of Labor and Employment in coordination with the Secretary of Social Welfare
30	and Development, concerned agencies in the public sector and other stakeholders in the
31	private sector, shall issue the necessary rules and regulations to effectively implement the
32	provisions of this Act.
33	Sec. 6. If any provision of this Act held invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions
34	not affected thereby shall remain to be in full force and effect.
35	Sec. 7. All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations, inconsistent with any of the
36	provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
37	Sec. 8. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official
38	Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
	Approved,
