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

## RESOLUTION

URGING THE NATIONAL PRIVACY COMMISSION TO ENSURE A MORE RESPONSIBLE PERSONAL DATA COLLECTION AND HANDLING PROCEDURE IN PUBLIC ESTABLISHMENTS WITH THE END IN VIEW OF PROTECTING PRIVATE INFORMATION WHILE STILL BEING USEFUL IN THE COUNTRY'S CONTACT TRACING EFFORTS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

WHEREAS, Article III Section 3 (1) of the 1987 Constitution provides that "(t)he privacy of communication and correspondence shall be inviolable except upon lawful order of the court, or when public safety or order requires otherwise as prescribed by law";

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10173 or the Data Privacy Act reiterates the State's obligation to protect the right to privacy of individuals by safeguarding individual personal information in the private sector<sup>1</sup>;

WHEREAS, with the easing of quarantine protocols in the Philippines, some commercial establishments and public spaces are allowed to accommodate clients at reduced capacity while following additional minimum health standards and protocols;

WHEREAS, in a series of Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) memorandum circulars<sup>2</sup>, it is required upon owners of public establishments to distribute health declaration checklist, among others, to all its clients before entry;

WHEREAS, the National Privacy Commission (NPC) also issued several Bulletins to guide establishments on the proper handling and protection of personal data collected from their customers and visitors through the health declaration checklist<sup>3</sup>;

WHEREAS, according to the NPC, establishments should only collect information required by government issuances and may adopt the sample health declaration checklist forms issued by government agencies;

WHEREAS, establishments have the responsibility to inform customers and visitors beforehand that personal data is collected for the sole purpose of contact tracing, whether collection is done manually or electronically;

WHEREAS, establishments are obligated to implement safeguards to protect personal data collected against 'any accidental or unlawful processing, alteration, disclosure, and destruction'. Such information shall only be retained only for the period allowed by government issuances;

WHEREAS, despite the issuance of the guideline, several reports cite incidents where handling of contract tracing/ health declaration forms exposed their personal information to other people;

WHEREAS, contract tracing forms in public transit and other public and commercial spaces are stored in an open carton boxes, revealing sensitive information to other passengers;

WHEREAS, there are already complaints of harassment incidents brought about by the exposure of private information through the data collection procedure in certain establishments, which involves writing down information in a log book sheet exposing the tally of all customer information;

WHEREAS, at present, there are no hard rules on the handling of health declaration forms or contact tracing forms. Establishments are also given a wide latitude as to the content and means by which the form will be presented to the public;

WHEREAS, due to fear of privacy invasion, some people are putting falsified information which may negatively affect the conduct of contact tracing, if needed;

WHEREAS, there should be stricter and more specific guidelines on the collection and handling of sensitive information as this is not simply private data, but also vital public health information;

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved, to urge the National Privacy Commission to ensure a more responsible personal data collection and handling procedure in public establishments with the end in view of protecting private information while still being useful in the country's contact tracing efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic.
