

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES TO INQUIRE INTO AND REVIEW, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, THE TEMPORARY BAN ON OVERSEAS DEPLOYMENT OF HEALTH WORKERS

WHEREAS, Section 18, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that the State affirms labor as a primary social economic force. It shall protect the rights of workers and promote their welfare;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 12, Article XIII of the 1987 Philippine Constitution, the State shall undertake appropriate health manpower development responsive to the country's health needs and problems;

WHEREAS, a news article from CNN Philippines entitled "PH temporarily bans deployment of health workers abroad amid COVID-19 outbreak", dated April 10, 2020, reported that Labor Secretary Silvestre Bello III, who is also the chairperson of the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration (POEA), signed an order on April 2, 2020, that temporarily restricts health workers from leaving to work abroad as the country deals with the COVID-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, according to POEA Governing Board Resolution No. 09, Series of 2020 issued on April 2, 2020, it is of paramount national interest to ensure that the country shall continue to have, sustain the supply, and prepare sufficient health personnel to meet any further contingencies, especially to replace, substitute or reinforce existing workforce currently employed, deployed or utilized locally;

WHEREAS, the POEA has defined Mission Critical Skills (MCS) as those skills that reflect the primary function of the organization without which mission critical work cannot be completed and which skills are internally developed and require extensive training, thus, not easily replaceable;

WHEREAS, the following occupations are included in the roster of existing MCS:

- a. Medical Doctor/Physician
- b. Nurse

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- 8 c. Microbiologist
- 9 d. Molecular biologist
- e. Medical technologist
- f. Clinical analyst
- g. Respiratory therapist
- 13 h. Pharmacist
- i. Laboratory technician
- j. X-ray / Radiologic technician
- k. Nursing assistant / nursing aid
- 17 I. Operator of medical equipment
- m. Supervisor of health services and personal care
- n. Repairman of medical-hospital equipment;

WHEREAS, on August 17, 2020, the Interagency Task Force (IATF) on the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases issued Resolution No. 64, Series of 2020 which temporarily suspended the overseas deployment of medical and allied health workers pursuant to POEA Governing Board Resolution No. 09, Series of 2020;

WHEREAS, pursuant to IATF Resolution No. 64, Series of 2020, the Department of Health and all hospitals and healthcare facilities of local government units and entities are enjoined to hire medical and allied health workers to supplement their current workforce;

WHEREAS, a news article from Manila Bulletin entitled "DOLE recommends lifting deployment ban for 600 nurses", published on August 25, 2020, reported that the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) has requested the IATF to allow

some 600 nurses to leave the country amid the government's temporary deployment ban on Filipino health care workers;

WHEREAS, according to POEA chief Bernard Olalia, the request was made following the DOLE and POEA's consultation with the health care industry, when the Philippine Nurses Association (PNA) appealed to allow 600 nurses whose departures where affected by the travel ban;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to review the temporary ban on deployment of health workers pursuant to IATF Resolution No. 64, Series of 2020 and POEA Governing Board Resolution No. 09, Series of 2020 taking into consideration the PNA's appeal to lift the ban and allow 600 nurses to work abroad;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, directing the proper Senate Committees to inquire into and review, in aid of legislation, the temporary ban on overseas deployment of health workers.
