- AN ACT STRENGTHENING AND MODERNIZING THE BUREAU OF FIRE PROTECTION AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	TITLE I
2	TITLE AND DECLARATION OF POLICY
3	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "BFP
4	Modernization Act".
5	SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is the policy of the
6	State to ensure public safety through the prevention and

1	suppression of all kinds of destructive fires, with the active
2	support of the community.
3	Toward this end, the State shall formulate and
4	implement plans and programs to enhance and modernize
5	the Bureau of Fire Protection, expand its mandate and
6	capability, and ensure its responsiveness to the changing
7	needs of the community.
8	TITLE II
9	POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE BFP
10	SEC. 3. Strengthening of the Bureau of Fire Protection. –
11	The Bureau Of Fire Protection (BFP), created under
12	Republic Act No. 6975, otherwise known as the
13	"Department of the Interior and Local Government Act of
14	1990", as amended, shall exercise the following powers and
15	functions:
16	(a) Prevent and suppress all destructive fires on
17	buildings, houses and other structures, including those
18	that occur in economic zones, agro-industrial economic
19	zones, free ports, and special economic zones, IT
20	parks/centers, tourism economic zones, and other similar

1 entities. forests: land transportation vehicles and 2 equipment; ships or vessels docked at piers or wharves or 3 anchored in major seaports, petroleum industry installations; and airports; and in the event of plane 4 5 crashes and other similar incidents: Provided. That the BFP shall collaborate with various local government units 6 7 (LGUs) on fire protection services, such as fire prevention 8 and preparedness, response planning, and information 9 sharing, as well as on handling fire management and 10 operational issues;

(b) Respond to natural or man-made disasters and 11 other emergencies, including the conduct of rescue 12 operations, medical emergency, and containment of 13 Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT), Chemical, Biological, 14 Radiological Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) materials: 15 Provided, That the BFP shall actively coordinate and 16 cooperate with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and 17 18 Management Council and the LGUs on disaster response, 19 risk reduction and management, in line with Republic Act 20 No. 7160 or The Local Government Code of 1991 and

Republic Act No. 10121 or The Philippine Disaster Risk
 Reduction and Management Act of 2010;

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3 (c) Issue implementing rules and regulations, and 4 prescribe standards, schedule of fees, fire service charges 5 and administrative penalties in connection with the 6 enforcement of Republic Act No. 9514 otherwise known as 7 The Fire Code of the Philippines and other related laws;

(d) Require building owners to submit plans and 8 9 specifications of their respective building and other pertinent documents as listed in the Bureau's Citizen's 10 11 Charter pursuant to Republic Act No. 11032 or the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery 12 Act of 2018 and evaluate the same to ensure compliance 13 with Republic Act No. 9514 and other applicable codes and 14 standards. For this purpose, a fire safety evaluation 15 16 clearance shall be issued as a prerequisite for the issuance 17 of the building permit in accordance with Republic Act No. 18 11032;

(e) Investigate all causes of fires, and if necessary, file
 the proper complaints with the city or provincial
 prosecutor who has jurisdiction over the case;

4 (f) Maintain regional offices which shall formulate
5 and implement policies, plans and programs of the BFP,
6 with prior consultation from the LGUs and monitor,
7 evaluate and coordinate the operations and activities of the
8 fire service units at the regional levels in coordination with
9 the Central Office;

(g) Establish and maintain fire laboratory and
research and testing facilities with complete equipment
one for Luzon, one for the Visayas and one for Mindanao;

(h) Conduct training of its personnel and officers 13 14 including fire volunteers, fire safety practitioners and fire volunteer organizations, pertaining to fire prevention and 15 suppression, fire inspection and clearance, investigation, 16 17 disaster preparedness, rescue, emergency medical, 18 HAZMAT, CBRNE, and other operations: Provided, That 19 the conduct of such training must be in coordination with 20 the LGUs:

(i) Conduct monthly fire prevention campaigns and
 information drive in partnership with the LGUs, the
 Department of The Interior and Local Government (DILG),
 the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and economic
 zones;

(j) Develop, promote, and implement a comprehensive 6 fire safety and protection program that aims to strengthen 7 the capacity of the National Government and LGUs, to 8 9 build the fire resilience of communities, and to 10 institutionalize measures for reducing disaster risk, and enhancing disaster and emergency preparedness and 11 response capabilities. That BFP shall also empower 12 existing community-based fire volunteer brigades and 13 encourage the creation of the same in all local government 14 15 units.

16 (k) Enter into contracts, agreements or similar
17 undertaking for the acquisition, ownership, possession,
18 use, administration, lease, disposition, or acceptance of
19 real or personal property in its name;

1	(l) Request assistance from the Philippine National
2	Police (PNP), Armed Forces of the Philippines, or any
3	government agency or instrumentality, including
4	government-owned and/or controlled corporations and
5	LGUs, in exercising its powers and functions, including the
6	use of the agency's personnel and facilities upon approval
7	of the head of the agency concerned;
8	(m) Perform such other functions as the President or
9	the Secretary of DILG may assign.
10	TITLE III
11	BFP MODERNIZATION PROGRAM
12	SEC. 4. BFP Modernization Program The BFP, in
13	coordination with the DILG, shall establish and implement
14	the BFP Modernization Program geared towards the
15	capability enhancement of its personnel and acquisition of
16	state-of-the-art fire prevention, fire suppression, fire
17	investigation, emergency medical and rescue services
18	facilities and equipment, which shall consist of the
19	following components:

(a) Fire Protection Service – The Modernization
 Program shall include the establishment of Fire Protection
 Service including the establishment of rescue hotlines in
 all LGUs: *Provided*, That priority shall be given to
 municipality with no existing fire protection services;

6 (b) Force Restructuring and Organizational 7 Development – The modernization program shall develop the BFP into a compact, efficient, responsive and modern 8 firefighting force with the capability to implement Republic 9 10 Act No. 9514. Within ninety (90) days from the promulgation of the implementing rules and regulations 11 (IRR) of this Act, the BFP shall recommend and submit to 12 the Secretaries of the DILG and the Department of Budget 13 and Management (DBM), the revised organizational 14 structure and staffing pattern for officers and personnel of 15 16 the BFP. The BFP shall design and establish qualifications upgrading program for the BFP officers and personnel in 17 accordance with the Civil Service Commission's rules and 18 19 regulations;

(c) Capability, Material, and Technology Development -1 2 Upon the effectivity of this Act, the existing fire protection 3 equipment and services of the BFP shall be upgraded through the acquisition of new and modern equipment 4 5 including, but not limited to, vehicles, and personal protective equipment: Provided, That the acquisition of 6 new equipment shall be synchronized with the phase-out of 7 uneconomical and obsolete major equipment and systems 8 9 in the BFP inventory;

10 Services Development The (d) Specialized Modernization Program shall establish specialized fire 11 protection services such as, but not limited to, high-rise 12 building fires, forest fires, aircraft and airport fires, 13 14 chemical fires, disaster rescue services, emergency medical services. It shall also include establishment of a Search 15 16 and Rescue Force and HAZMAT units and fire and arson investigation unit in every region and city, as well as 17 18 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) in every municipality 19 and city: Provided, That each EMS unit to be established shall be comprised of ambulance with adequate medical 20

equipment, and qualified and trained personnel such as,
 but not limted to, ambulance crew and drivers;

3 (e) Human Resource Development The _ modernization program shall include the development of a 4 5 comprehensive training program for BFP personnel and BFP volunteers, including mandatory training for new 6 7 entrants and newly-appointed personnel of the BFP, and 8 BFP volunteers, and establishment of training facilities.

9 The BFP shall encourage and promote volunteerism 10 and shall develop guidelines for the enlistment and 11 training of the BFP volunteers. Internationally accredited 12 training consultants and advisers may be hired after the 13 determination of the non-availability of a Filipino who is 14 competent, able, and willing to provide the same expertise, 15 in order to accelerate the Personnel Development Program.

16 The BFP, in coordination with the Department of and Technical Education and 17 Health (DOH) Skills 18 Development Authority (TESDA), shall provide necessary trainings for its EMS, which include, but limited to, 19 20 infection control and exposure, emergency vehicle response, incident rehabilitation, critical incident stress
 management, response to HAZMAT, response to Mass
 Casualty Incidents (MCI), response to vehicle accidents,
 among others.

5 SEC. 5. Submission to Congress. - Within one hundred eighty (180) days from the effectivity of this Act, 6 the BFP, in consultation with the Secretaries of the DILG, 7 the Department of Budget and Management, and the 8 9 Department of Finance. shall submit the BFP 10 Modernization Program to Congress. It shall contain the following: 11

(a) Personnel strength and inventory of facilities andequipment of the BFP;

(b) Modernization projects and activities under the
program to be undertaken and the particular component
and corresponding objective to which such projects relate to;
(c) Priorities, schedules and phases of implementation
of modernization projects and activities; and

19 (d) Estimated average cost of each modernization20 project or activity to be undertaken.

SEC. 6. Multi-Year Contract and Other Contractual 1 2 Arrangement. - (a) The BFP, pursuant to the BFP Modernization Program, projects and appropriations 3 approved by Congress, may, subject to the approval of the 4 President, provisions of existing laws and regulations 5 including those of the Commission on Audit and under 6 7 such terms and conditions most favorable to the government, enter into a multi-year contracts or other 8 9 contractual agreements with local or foreign suppliers and 10 contractors in the implementation of this Act;

(b) For multi-year contracts, Congress shall, upon 11 12 issuance of a multi-year obligational authority or contractual authority by the Department of Budget and 13 14 Management (DBM), make the corresponding appropriation for the ensuing fiscal years: Provided, That 15 the BFP and the DBM shall issue the implementing 16 17 guidelines to ensure consistency with the BFP 18 Modernization Program and existing guidelines in the 19 contracting of multi-year projects;

1 (c) The Chief of BFP shall submit to Congress, 2 through the Chairpersons of the Senate Committees 3 on Public Order and Dangerous Drugs and Finance and 4 the Chairpersons of the House Committees on Public Order 5 and Safety and Appropriations, copies of these multi-year 6 contracts and other agreements/arrangements to enable 7 Congress to appropriate funds.

8 SEC. 7. BFP Modernization Trust Fund. - The trust 9 fund created pursuant to Section 13 of Republic Act No. 9514, otherwise known as the "Revised Fire Code of the 10 11 Philippines of 2008", shall be transferred to a new trust fund to be known as the BFP Modernization Trust Fund. It 12 shall be administered by the Chief of the BFP in 13 14 accordance with existing government budgeting, accounting and auditing rules and regulations. 15

16 The BFP Modernization Trust Fund shall be used 17 exclusively for the implementation of the BFP Modernization Program as provided for in this Act, 18 19 including all expenses necessary for the procurement of 20 facilities, machineries, equipment and services: Provided,

1	That expenses chargeable against the trust fund shall
2	exclude salaries and allowances for BFP personnel.
3	The BFP Modernization Trust Fund shall be sourced
4	from the following:
5	(a) Appropriations for the revised BFP Modernization
6	Program as provided in Section 10 of this Act;
7	(b) Eighty percent (80%) share of the BFP from all
8	taxes, fees, and fines collected pursuant to Republic Act
9	No. 9514, otherwise known as the "Revised Fire Code of
10	the Philippines of 2008";
11	(c) Proceeds from the disposal of excess and/or
12	uneconomically repairable equipment and other movable
13	assets of the BFP;
14	(d) Funds from budgetary surplus, if any, as may be
15	authorized by Congress;
16	(e) Loans, grants, bequests, or donations coming from
17	local and foreign sources, specifically earmarked to be used
18	for the BFP Modernization Program; and
19	(f) All interest income that accrues to the trust fund.

1	The amount allocated shall be released to the BFP
2	based on the objectives of the BFP Modernization Program
3	as provided for in this Act: Provided, That fund releases
4	charged against the trust fund shall not be subject to any
5	ceiling by the DBM.
6	SEC. 8. Local Equity in the BFP Modernization
7	Program City and municipal governments shall be
8	authorized to use their respective share from all taxes,
9	fees, and fines collected pursuant to Republic Act No. 9514,
10	otherwise known as the "Revised Fire Code of the

4 (f) Other relevant programs, projects and activities as
5 may be identified by the BFP in accordance with Section 4
6 subsections (a), (c) and (d) of this Act.

7 LGUs shall be authorized to implement development programs and projects complementary and supplementary 8 9 to the BFP Modernization Program, to be charged against 10 the allocation for local development projects as provided in Section 287 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as 11 the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended: 12 That development programs and projects 13 Provided. 14 implemented by LGUs in accordance with this Act shall be included in their respective local development plans and 15 annual investment programs. 16

SEC. 9. Period of Implementation. – The BFP
Modernization Program shall be implemented over a
period of ten (10) years effective upon the date of the
approval of this Act: *Provided*, That payment for

1 amortization of outstanding multi-year contract, 2 obligations incurred under the modernization program 3 may extend beyond this period. SEC. 10. Appropriations. - The amount necessary to 4 5 implement the provisions of this Act shall be sourced from the BFP Modernization Trust Fund as provided in Section 8. 6 7 In addition, the annual appropriations for the BFP 8 Modernization Program shall include amount necessary to 9 support the funding requirements for all modernization 10 projects submitted to Congress. The funds to be appropriated to implement the provisions of this Act shall 11 be included in the General Appropriations Act under the 12 13 BFP.

SEC. 11. Strict Application of Ease of Doing Business
and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018. –
Section 10 of Republic Act No. 11032 and its implementing
rules and regulations shall be strictly enforced in the
processing of any application or renewal of fire safety
permits, clearances and certificates.

1	Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, fire safety
2	inspection certificate shall not be required to process and
3	approve local business permits for professionals,
4	freelancers, self-employed persons, individual contractors,
5	and one person corporations who are engaged in service
6	activities and who registered their respective residences as
7	their principal place of business.
8	TITLE III
9	FINAL PROVISIONS
10	SEC. 12. Implementing Rules and Regulations. –
11	Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the
12	DILG and BFP shall, in consultation with government
13	agencies concerned, and public and private stakeholders,
14	formulate the necessary rules and regulations for the
15	effective implementation of this Act.
16	SEC. 13. Separability Clause If any part, section or
17	provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional,
18	the sections or provisions which are not affected shall

19 remain valid and subsisting.

1	SEC. 14. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees,
2	ordinances, rules, regulations, other issuances or parts
3	thereof which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby
4	repealed or modified accordingly.
5	SEC. 15. <i>Effectivity</i> . – This Act shall take effect fifteen
6	(15) days after its complete publication in the Official
7	<i>Gazette</i> or in a newspaper of general circulation.
