AN ACT

RENEWING FOR ANOTHER TWENTY-FIVE (25) YEARS THE FRANCHISE GRANTED TO THE UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES SYSTEM UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8160 TO CONSTRUCT, ESTABLISH, MAINTAIN, AND OPERATE FOR EDUCATIONAL AND OTHER RELATED PURPOSES RADIO AND TELEVISION BROADCASTING STATIONS WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES AND IN OTHER AREAS WITHIN THE SCOPE OF ITS OPERATIONS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Nature and Scope of Franchise. - Subject to the provisions of the 1 Constitution and applicable laws, rules and regulations, the franchise granted to the 2 University of the Philippines System, hereunder referred to as the grantee, its successor 3 4 or assignees under Republic Act No. 8160, to construct, establish, maintain, and operate for educational and other related purposes and in the public interest, radio and 5 television broadcasting stations within the campuses of the University of the Philippines 6 and in other places within the scope of its operations, where frequencies and/or 7 channels are still available for radio and television broadcasting, including digital 8 television system, through microwave, satellite or whatever means, as well as the use of 9 any new technology in television and radio systems, with the corresponding 10 technological auxiliaries and facilities, special broadcast and other program and 11 distribution services and relay stations, is hereby renewed for another twenty-five (25) 12 vears. 13 14

SEC. 2. Manner of Operation of Stations or Facilities. – The stations or facilities of the grantee shall be constructed and operated in a manner as will, at most, result only in the minimum interference on the wavelengths or frequencies of existing stations or other stations which may be established by law, without in any way diminishing its own privilege to use its assigned wavelengths or frequencies and the 1 quality of transmission or reception thereon as should maximize rendition of the 2 grantee's services and availability thereof.

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SEC. 3. Prior Approval of the National Telecommunications Commission. – The grantee shall secure from the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC) the appropriate permits and licenses for the construction and operation of its stations or facilities and shall not use any frequency in the radio and television spectrums without authorization from the NTC. The NTC, however, shall not unreasonably withhold or delay the grant of any such authority.

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In case of any violation of the provisions of this franchise, the NTC shall have the authority to revoke or suspend, after due process, the permits or licenses it issued pursuant to the franchise. The NTC may recommend to Congress of the Philippines the revocation of this franchise for any violation of its provisions.

SEC. 4. Responsibility to the Public. - The grantee shall strictly comply with 16 the provisions of the Constitution, statutes, rules and regulations, including labor laws 17 and standards. The grantee shall reach the pertinent populations or portions thereof on 18 important public issues and relay important public announcements and warnings 19 concerning public emergencies and calamities, as necessity, urgency or law may 20 require; provide, at all times sound and balanced programming; promote public 21 participation; assist in the functions of public information and education; conform to the 22 ethics of honest enterprise; promote audience sensibility and empowerment including 23 closed captioning; and not use its stations or facilities for the broadcasting of obscene 24 or indecent language, speech, act or scene, the dissemination of deliberately false 25 information or willful misrepresentation, to the detriment of public interest, or to incite, 26 encourage, or assist in subversive or treasonable acts. 27

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Pursuant to Republic Act No. 8370, otherwise known as the "Children's Television Act of 1997", the grantee shall allot a minimum of fifteen percent (15%) of the daily total air time of each broadcasting network to child-friendly shows within its regular programming.

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SEC. 5. *Right of the Government.* – The radio spectrum is a finite resource that is part of the national patrimony, and the use thereof is a privilege conferred upon the grantee by the State that may be withdrawn any time after due process.

A special right is hereby reserved to the President of the Philippines, in times of war, rebellion, public peril, calamity, emergency, disaster, or disturbance of peace and order, to temporarily take over and operate the stations or facilities of the grantee; to temporarily suspend the operation of any station or facility in the interest of public safety, security and public welfare; or to authorize the temporary use and operation thereof by any agency of the government, upon due compensation to the grantee, for the use of said stations or facilities during the period when these shall be so operated.

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SEC. 6. *Term of Franchise.* – This franchise shall be in effect for a period of twenty-five (25) years from the effectivity of this Act, unless sooner revoked or cancelled. This franchise shall be deemed *ipso facto* revoked in the event the grantee fails to operate continuously for two (2) years.

6 SEC. 7. *Tax Provision.* – Being part of the government, the grantee shall be 7 exempt from paying all taxes and fees as provided in Section 25 of Republic Act No. 8 9500 or "The University of the Philippines Charter of 2008".

SEC. 8. Self-regulation by and Undertaking of Grantee. - The grantee shall 10 not require any previous censorship of any speech, play, act or scene, or other matter to 11 be broadcast from its stations, but if any such speech, play, act or scene, or other 12 matter should constitute a violation of the law or infringement of a private right, the 13 grantee shall be free from any liability, civil or criminal, for such speech, play, act or 14 scene, or other matter: Provided. That the grantee, during any broadcast, shall cut off 15 the airing of speech, play, act or scene, or other matter being broadcast if the tendency 16 thereof is to propose and/or incite treason, rebellion or sedition; or the language used 17 therein or the theme thereof is indecent or immoral: Provided, further, That willful failure 18 to do so shall constitute a valid cause for the cancellation of this franchise. 19

SEC. 9. Warranty in Favor of the National and Local Governments. – The grantee shall hold the national, provincial, city, and municipal governments of the Philippines free from all claims, liabilities, demands, or actions arising out of accidents causing injury to persons or damage to properties, during the construction or operation of the stations of the grantee.

28 SEC. 10. Sale, Lease, Transfer, Grant of Usufruct, or Assignment of 29 Franchise. – The grantee shall not sell, lease, transfer, grant the usufruct of, nor 30 assign this franchise or the rights and privileges acquired thereunder to any person, 31 firm, company, corporation or other commercial or legal entity.

33 SEC. 11. *Reportorial Requirement.* – The grantee shall submit an annual report 34 on its compliance with the terms and conditions of the franchise and on its operations to 35 the Congress, through the Committee on Legislative Franchises of the House of 36 Representatives and the Committee on Public Services of the Senate, on or before April 37 30 of every year during the term of its franchise.

The annual report shall include an update on the roll-out, development, operation and/or expansion of business; audited financial statements; and certification of the NTC on the status of its permits and operations.

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The reportorial compliance certificate issued by Congress shall be required before any application for permit or certificate is accepted by the NTC.

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SEC. 12. Fine. - The failure of the grantee to submit the requisite annual report 1 to Congress shall be penalized by a fine of Five hundred pesos (P500.00) per working 2 day of noncompliance. The fine shall be collected by the NTC from the delinquent 3 franchise grantee separate from the reportorial penalties imposed by the NTC and the 4 same shall be remitted to the Bureau of the Treasury. 5

SEC. 13. Equality Clause. - Any advantage, favor, privilege, exemption, or 7 immunity granted under existing franchises, or which may hereafter be granted for radio 8 and/or television broadcasting, upon prior review and approval of Congress, shall 9 become part of this franchise and shall be accorded immediately and unconditionally to 10 the herein grantee: Provided, That the foregoing shall neither apply to nor affect the 11 provisions of broadcasting franchises concerning territorial coverage, the term, or the 12 type of service authorized by the franchise. 13 14

SEC. 14. Repealability and Nonexclusivity Clause. - This franchise shall be 15 subject to amendment, alteration, or repeal by Congress when the public interest so 16 requires and shall not be interpreted as an exclusive grant of the privileges herein 17 provided for. 18

SEC. 15. Separability Clause. - If any of the sections or provisions of this Act is 20 held invalid, all other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid. 21

SEC. 16. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, orders, resolutions, instructions, 22 rules and regulations, and other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with 23 the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly. 24 25

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SEC. 17. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 26 publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation. 27
