

AN ACT RENAMING CLARK INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT LOCATED IN ANGELES CITY, PAMPANGA AS DIOSDADO MACAPAGAL INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

EXPLANATORY NOTE

President Diosdado Macapagal was the ninth President of the Republic of the Philippines. Born in Lubao, Pampanga, he was the first Kapampangan president. Prior to becoming the highest public official of the land, he served as Member of the House of Representatives representing Pampanga's 1st District and then as Vice President during the administration of President Carlos P. Garcia. Among the highlights of his presidency are the suppression of graft and corruption, land-reform legislation, abolition of land tenancy, labor law reforms such as the minimum wage law, campaign against income tax evasion, and the strengthening of free enterprise. After his term, he was elected as President of the Constitutional Convention that drafted what became the 1973 Constitution.

To honor the achievements and legacy of President Macapagal, it is only fitting that the Clark International Airport located in Clark Freeport Zone, Angeles City, Pampanga be renamed as the Diosdado Macapagal International Airport.


In view of the foregoing, early passage of this bill is earnestly requested.

AN ACT RENAMING CLARK INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT LOCATED IN ANGELES CITY, PAMPANGA AS DIOSDADO MACAPAGAL INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. The Clark International Airport located in Angeles City, Pampanga is hereby renamed Diosdado Macapagal International Airport. 2 3 Sec. 2. The Department of Transportation shall place appropriate markers in the airport and its facilities and shall issue the necessary orders and circulars to 5 implement the provisions of this Act. 6 7 Sec. 3. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the 9 Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation. 10 Approved, 11
