

## RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE CONTROVERSIAL P389 MILLION MANILA BAY BEACH "NOURISHMENT" PROJECT

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Article II of the Constitution mandates that "[t]he State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature";

WHEREAS, in MMDA v. Concerned Citizens of Manila Bay (G.R. No. 171947-48, 18 December 2008), the Supreme Court issued a writ of continuing mandamus to compel government agencies to clean up, rehabilitate, and preserve Manila Bay, and restore and maintain its waters;

WHEREAS, eleven years later, President Rodrigo Duterte issued Administrative Order No. 16 s. 2019 which created a Manila Bay Task Force chaired by the Secretary of Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR). One of its main functions is to fast-track compliance with the Writ of Continuing Mandamus issued by the Court in MMDA v. Concerned Citizens of Manila Bay;

WHEREAS, last January, Chief Justice Diosdado Peralta reconstituted the Manila Bay Advisory Committee (MBAC) to ensure compliance of government agencies with the 2008 Court ruling<sup>1</sup>;

1 WHEREAS, most recently, DENR was under fire as it proceeded with a project 2 to fill a 500-meter stretch of Manila Bay with crushed dolomite from Cebu as part of 3 the bay's rehabilitation<sup>2</sup>;

WHEREAS, DENR admitted that the beach "nourishment" project was not in the 22-year Master Plan of the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) and that it was only undertaken by DENR and expedited when the President issued A.O. No. 16 s. 2019;

WHEREAS, the Cebu Provincial Board's Environment Committee immediately made a statement that no permits were secured from them for the extraction or transport of the dolomite used<sup>3</sup>;

WHEREAS, it was later reported that it was the Mines and Geosciences Bureau-Central Visayas under DENR that issued the permits to the mining firms;

WHEREAS, when asked about the source of funding of the project in this pandemic, Presidential Spokesperson Harry Roque and DENR defended the project stating that the P389 Million funding was sourced from the 2019 contingency fund of President Durterte<sup>4</sup>, and not under the current year's budget;

WHEREAS, policy think tank Infrawatch PH pointed out that the project is costly, roughly priced at around P795,000 per meter of the Manila Bay stretch<sup>5</sup>. In fact, of the P389 Million total budget, around P28 Million was spent to mine and ship the crushed dolomite alone<sup>6</sup>;

WHEREAS, fisherfolk group PAMALAKAYA criticized the project for being "too much on aesthetic rehabilitation and [that it] did little to contribute to the rehabilitation and restoration of the area";

WHEREAS, Department of Health (DOH) Undersecretary Maria Vergeire herself attested to dolomite's health risks – that when ingested, it can cause pain in the stomach and result to diarrhea? But DOH later softened its stance to qualify that the process of crushing dolomite rocks – not the rocks themselves – was hazardous;<sup>8</sup>

WHEREAS, according to a 2012 safety report by Texas distributor and builder Lehigh Hanson Inc, dolomite has levels of crystalline silica, which can cause damage to the lungs, cause irritation to the skin and eyes, or even cancer when it is breathed in<sup>9</sup>;

WHEREAS, environmental group Oceana Philippines warned that dolomite could actually destroy both the natural ecosystem and coastal integrity of Manila Bay as the dolomite material is not the natural substrate of that portion of the bay; 10

WHEREAS, according to marine scientist Diovanie de Jesus, sediments of dolomite in the water can make it turbid or opaque, and it can also make it "stressful" for bodies of sardines, mackerel, anchovies, and other fish. Already, fishermen in the area had expressed fear about the environmental impact of the artificial white sand to the waters, concerned that "this would lead to more fish kill incidents in the area and further limit [their] catch." 12

WHEREAS, aside from affecting the ecosystem of the bay, the dolomite sand can also damage the other features of the bay like the mangroves, beaches, and mudflats where shellfish, crabs, and fish nurseries thrive;<sup>13</sup>

WHEREAS, it became apparent that there was also no continuing monitoring of the mining companies' compliance with environmental laws and safeguards in Alcoy, Cebu where the dolomite was sourced. DENR Secretary Roy Cimatu himself suspended the operations of Dolomite Mining Corp. (DMC) and Philippine Mining

Service Corp. (PMSC) which both provided the crushed dolomite dumped on Manila Bay, after they allegedly destroyed corals in the waters near the mine site<sup>14</sup>;

WHEREAS, Cebu Governor Gwendolyn Garcia also feared that the quarrying might have affected Alcoy, a critical area, as it is the natural habitat of the endangered and endemic "siloy" birds, or the Cebu's black shama<sup>15</sup>;

WHEREAS, Akbayan Partylist filed a petition before the Supreme Court to cite DENR for contempt for violating the 2008 writ of *Continuing Mandamus* to clean up and rehabilitate Manila Bay, saying that the dumping of crushed dolomite boulders on the foreshore areas of Manila Bay contravenes the Court order<sup>16</sup>;

WHEREAS, contrary to Presidential Spokesperson Roque claims that "white sand" makeover will give immeasurable benefit to Filipinos' mental health<sup>17</sup>, this P389 Million band-aid project has indeed brought more harm than good;

WHEREAS, the DENR must be reminded of its primary responsibility to conserve, manage, develop, and properly use the country's environment and natural resources for the welfare of the present and future generations of Filipinos;

WHEREAS, officials of DENR must be held accountable for non-compliance with several laws like the Local Government Code, the Philippine Fisheries Code, the Wildlife Conservation Act, and PD 1586 or the Environmental Impact Assessment System, among others, in implementing this project;

WHEREAS, there is also an immediate need for Congress, in exercise of its oversight functions, to investigate this multi-million project that could have been spent to feed 5.2 Million hungry families because of the pandemic, for healthcare or for COVID-19 government response;

WHEREAS, the makeover of Manila Bay shows that this administration's priorities lean towards cosmetic beautification rather than health, economic aid, or

education. Now is the opportune time to conduct this investigation as we are nearing fiscal year 2021 deliberations in Congress;

WHEREAS, government programs must be geared towards reviving the economy or helping our marginalized Filipinos, and not pouring money on unnecessary, costly, insensitive and hazardous projects like this;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, into the controversial P389 Million Manila Bay beach "nourishment" project.
