

## **RESOLUTION**

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON TOURISM TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE STATUS OF ECOTOURISM SITES ACROSS THE COUNTRY

WHEREAS, under Executive Order No. 111, s. 1999, Establishing the Guidelines for Ecotourism Development in the Philippines, it is the policy of the state to ensure the sustainable use, development, management, protection and conservation of the country's environment and natural resources and cultural heritage for the enjoyment of the present and future generations;

WHEREAS, the National Ecotourism Policy is embodied in Republic Act No. 9593 or The Tourism Act of 2009 (RA 9593). Under Section 33 of RA 9593, the Department of Tourism, in coordination with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), shall identify areas covered by the National Integrated Protected Areas System with ecotourism potentials and cultural heritage value, and prepare policies, plans and programs for their development, preservation, operation or conversion into Tourism Enterprise Zones;

WHEREAS, the National Ecotourism Strategy and Action Plan 2013–2022 (NES) was adopted in 2014. The goal of the NES is: "Environmentally and socially responsible ecotourism development that safeguards the integrity and diversity of its natural resources, provides education and enjoyment to visitors and delivers larger and more widely distributed income and employment opportunities to the local communities and their constituents, especially the women, youth, indigenous peoples, and other vulnerable groups";

WHEREAS, according to the NES, with over 7,000 islands, the natural resource base of the country for ecotourism consists of a diverse array of wetland, mountains, volcanoes, rugged cliffs, seascapes, coasts, beaches, lakes, forests, caves, fields, and a rich variety of plants and animals. As a "megadiversity" country, the Philippines offers one of the best destinations for ecotourism in Asia and the ASEAN region;

WHEREAS, a National Geographic travel article, titled: "Sustaining happiness: eco-friendly fun in the Philippines", identified Boracay, Manila Bay and Sagada as ecotourism spots to visit in the country;

 WHEREAS, TTG Asia, in an article posted on June 8, 2020, titled: "*Ecotourism to flourish in the Philippines under new normal*", reported that ecotourism, an alternative to mass tourism, is poised to reign supreme in the Philippines' travel industry's transition to the new normal post-Covid-19 according to experts at the Ecotourism Philippines webinar;

WHEREAS, in a recent study, the Department of Science and Technology-National Research Council of the Philippines identifies best practices and offers policy recommendations for Philippine ecotourism sites. The study considered 16 ecotourism sites in the country: 7 sites in Luzon (including Masungi Georeserve Park in Rizal), 3 sites in Visayas and 6 sites in Mindanao. According to the study, ecotourism will be an effective tool for sustainable development if this is aligned with the Philippine economic development and conservation strategies;

 WHEREAS, ABS-CBN News, in a news article posted on October 26, 2020, titled: "Fence illegally put up in Masungi Georeserve removed, but threat remains", reported that Masungi Georeserve and the area around it has been facing various threats in the past several months. In March, a quarry company installed barbed wires, claiming parts of the protected area. While the DENR was able to immediately remove the barbed wire, the geopark also saw increased incidents of illegal logging and forest burning during the COVID-19 lockdown;

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Senate to conduct an inquiry on the matter to determine the status of ecotourism sites and identify the potentials and challenges of ecotourism development in the country;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Senate to direct the Senate Committee on Tourism to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the status of ecotourism sites across the country.
