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

## **RESOLUTION**

URGING THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT TO ALLOW THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR THE PROCUREMENT OF COVID-19 VACCINES FOR USE OF THEIR CONSTITUENTS AND EMPLOYEES INCLUDING THEIR DEPENDENTS UPON ISSUANCE OF EMERGENCY USE AUTHORIZATION BY THE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION, WITH THE END IN VIEW OF PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF THE DISEASE AND FURTHER OPENING UP THE ECONOMY

WHEREAS, Article XIII, Section 11 of the 1987 Constitution mandates the State to adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all people at an affordable cost;

WHEREAS, the global pandemic due to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) has caused various challenges for all Filipinos, within and outside the country;

WHEREAS, since the first recorded COVID-19 case in the Philippines last February 2020, positive cases as reported by the Department of Health (DOH) now total to more than half a million, while the death toll is currently at 9,909;

WHEREAS, while the positivity rate is slowly declining due to the imposition of different quarantine restrictions as well as the strict compliance to minimum health standards and safety protocols, new positive cases are still added every day;

WHEREAS, as much as the quarantine restrictions have helped in flattening the curve, they also affected the economy with the closure of many business enterprises and the displacement of many jobs;

WHEREAS, the schools were also closed for face to face classes; thus, affecting many teaching jobs specifically in the private sector;

WHEREAS, the government is continuously opening up the economy but Filipinos still lack the confidence to go out of the comfort of their homes due to the risks of getting infected by the virus realizing that COVID-19 treatment is both expensive and difficult due to its novel nature;

WHEREAS, vaccines are the breakthrough needed to prevent the spread of COVID-19, attain herd immunity among the population, and eventually regain the people's confidence to go out and live in the new normal set-up;

WHEREAS, at present, there are at least seven vaccine brands, that have been approved for emergency use in other countries, that the Philippine Government plans to acquire for inoculation of fifty to seventy million Filipinos as the main deliverable of its COVID-19 vaccination program;

WHEREAS, funds to support the said COVID-19 vaccination program amounting to Eighty-Two Billion Five Hundred Million Pesos (P82.5 Billion) were appropriated under the FY 2021 General Appropriations Act and Republic Act No. 11494 or the "Bayanihan to Recover as One Act";

WHEREAS, vaccines to be procured must have an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA), an authorization issued by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for the use of unregistered drugs and vaccines in a public health emergency to ensure their safety and efficacy;

WHEREAS, in the recent Senate Committee of the Whole hearings on the COVID-19 vaccination program, the DOH and FDA stated that vaccines with EUA cannot be sold for commercial use; thus, only the national government can procure the same from its manufacturers;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Units (LGUs) and the private sector have both expressed their desire and commitment to fund and procure vaccines for their constituents, and employees and dependents;

WHEREAS, this intent of the LGUs and the private sector is with the end-inview of expediting the vaccine procurement process as well as easing the burden of the national government so that the latter can focus its vaccination program on those that belong to the priority, vulnerable and disadvantaged sectors of the population; WHEREAS, allowing the LGUs and the private sector to procure their own vaccines is a regulatory matter which may be temporarily allowed during a pandemic or a state of national health emergency;

WHEREAS, allowing the LGUs and the private sector to procure their own vaccines will prevent the spread of the disease and hasten the efforts to further open up the economy which in effect will restore and create more jobs for the people;

WHEREAS, if allowed, the LGUs and the private sector shall only procure vaccines that have EUA issued by the FDA and are still mandated to comply with the documentary, procedural and reportorial requirements of DOH, FDA and other national government agencies;

WHEREAS, if allowed, the administration of vaccines by the LGUs and the private sector to its targeted recipients shall still abide by the rules, regulations and procedures set forth by the DOH: Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved, to urge the national government to allow the LGUs and the private sector to procure COVID-19 vaccines for use of their constituents and employees including their dependents upon issuance of Emergency Use Authorization by the Food and Drug Administration and subject to other documentary, procedural and reportorial requirements of the national government, with the end in view of preventing the spread of the disease and further opening up the economy.
