



"AN ACT

GRANTING THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES THE POWER TO DEFER THE INCREASES IN CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM FOR A LIMITED PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS WHICH MAY BE EXTENDED TO ANOTHER SIX MONTHS IN TIMES OF A DECLARED NATIONAL EMERGENCY OR STATE OF CALAMITY, AMENDING SECTION 4(a)(9) OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11199, ALSO KNOWN AS THE "SOCIAL SECURITY ACT OF 2018," AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Sec. 4(a)(9) of Republic Act No. 11199 also known as the Social 1 Security Act of 2018 is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 "Sec. 4. Powers and Duties of the Commission and SSS. -3 "(a) The Commission. – For the attainment of its main objectives 4 as set forth in Section 2 hereof, the Commission shall have the 5 following powers and duties: 6 "xxx xxx; 7 "(9) To implement the rate of contributions as well as the 8 minimum and maximum monthly salary credits in accordance with the 9 following schedule effective January of the year of implementation as 10 follows: 11

"Provided, That the domestic workers or "kasambahays" as defined under Republic Act No. 10361 or the Batas Kasambahay who are receiving a monthly income lower than minimum monthly salary credit prescribed under this Act shall pay contributions based on their actual monthly salary: Provided, further, That members, who are subject to compulsory coverage and receiving a monthly income lower than the minimum monthly salary credit or more than the maximum monthly salary credit, and their employers, shall pay the SSS contributions based on the current minimum monthly salary credit or the maximum monthly salary credit, respectively, as provided in this Act.

"THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES, SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO SUSPEND OR DEFER THE IMPLEMENTATION OF INCREASES IN CONTRIBUTION RATES OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM MANDATED IN THIS SECTION BY VIRTUE OF AN ORDER ISSUED SOLELY IN TIMES OF A DULY DECLARED STATE OF NATIONAL EMERGENCY OR STATE OF CALAMITY FOR A PERIOD NOT EXCEEDING SIX MONTHS WHICH MAY BE EXTENDED TO ANOTHER SIX MONTHS UPON DETERMINATION BY THE PRESIDENT THAT FURTHER EXTENSION OF THE SUSPENSION OF IMPLEMENTATION OF INCREASES IS NECESSARY TO PROTECT PUBLIC INTEREST AND WELFARE: PROVIDED, THAT THIS POWER SHALL BE SUBJECT TO CONSULTATION WITH THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM AND AFFECTED MEMBERS AND KEY STAKEHOLDERS.

- "The rate of penalty on unpaid loan amortizations shall be determined and fixed by the Commission from time to time through rules and regulations on the basis of applicable actuarial studies, rate of benefits, inflation, and other relevant socioeconomic data."
- SEC. 2. Separability Clause. If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.
 - **SEC. 3.** Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees or issuances, executive orders, letters of instruction, administrative orders, rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.
- SEC. 4. *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
