
EIGHTEENTH CONGRESS OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES Second Regular Session

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SERVICES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (DOTR) DEPARTMENT ORDER NO. 2018-019 AND LAND TRANSPORTATION OFFICE (LTO) MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2018-2158, AND ALL RELATED ISSUANCES, WITH THE END IN VIEW OF ADDRESSING THE CONCERNS OF MOTORISTS REGARDING THE OPERATIONS OF PRIVATE MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTION CENTERS (PMVICs) AND, ULTIMATELY, IMPROVING THE MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTION SYSTEM (MVIS) IN THE COUNTRY

1 WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 4136, otherwise known as the "Land 2 Transportation and Traffic Code" mandates the Land Transportation Office (LTO) to

3 inspect and register motor vehicles;¹

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WHEREAS, subsequently, Section 13, Paragraph E of Executive Order No. 125,

s. 1987, as amended, empowers the LTO Office to "...establish and prescribe the

6 corresponding rules and regulation for the enforcement of laws governing land

7 transportation, including the penalties for violation thereof, and for the deputation of

appropriate law enforcement agencies in pursuance thereof";2

WHEREAS, on August 2018, the Department of Transportation (DOTR) issued Department Order No. 2018-19, authorizing the LTO to issue the guidelines for the authorization of Private Motor Vehicle Inspection Centers (PMVICS);³

WHEREAS, on November 2018, pursuant to its mandate, the LTO issued Memorandum Circular 2018-2518 or the "Guidelines for the Authorization of Private Motor Vehicle Inspection Centers (PMVICs)";⁴

WHEREAS, buried within M.C. 2018-2158 is a provision authorizing PMVICs to collect a fee of Php 1,800.00 from motor vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating of 4,500 kilograms. If a motor vehicle fails its first inspection, the PMVIC is authorized to further collect Php 900.00 for another inspection;⁵

WHEREAS, PMVICs are also authorized to collect a Php 600.00 inspection fee from motorcycles and tricycles, and a Php 300.00 re-inspection fee if needed;⁶

WHEREAS, PMVICs are further authorized to collect a separate "inspection fee" for the following miscellaneous transactions: 1) motor vehicle modification (change body design/configuration); 2) miscellaneous transactions such as change engine/chassis, change color, revision of Gross Vehicle Weight, re-stamping of engine; and 3) recovered carnapped vehicle.⁷

WHEREAS, as early as 2018, motorists have complained that the new fees would "double the registration fees that most motor vehicle owners already have to pay";

WHEREAS, after a two-year delay, the LTO revived the implementation of DO 2018-019 and MC 2018-2158 on October 2020 with the issuance of Memorandum Circular No. 2020-2217 or the "Start of Operations of PMVICs Granted with Authorization", and named four (4) PMVICs in Regions 3 and 5;8

WHEREAS, of the target 138 PMVICs, DOTR has already issued thirty-one (31)
Notice to Operate and seven (7) Provisional Authority to PMVICs as of December 2020;9

WHEREAS, the start of operation of PMVICS was met by multitude of complaints not just from motorists but also from clean air advocacy groups and anti-corruption advocates;

WHEREAS, aside from the complaints regarding the increase in fees from the previous emission testing fee of P 500 to P1,800¹⁰, stakeholders also pointed out that the LTO did not conduct thorough consultations before the privatization of the Motor Vehicle Inspection System (MVIS);¹¹

WHEREAS, related to the lack of consultation is the seeming lack of transparency in the process of selecting PMVICs which, according to concerned groups, might provide an avenue for corruption;¹²

WHEREAS, recent experiences of vehicle owners with PMVICs also suggest that some of the test results were unreliable. Such is the case of the Toyota Land Cruiser, a high-end vehicle, which initially failed an alleged erroneous noise test at a PMVIC in Nueva Ecija;¹³

WHEREAS, the unreliability of test results entails additional cost to vehicle owners as PMVICs charge additional fees for reinspection. It is also expected to encourage the payment of "facilitation fees" to "fixers" in order for vehicle owners to get their roadworthiness certification faster;¹⁴

WHEREAS, glitches in the PMVIC test results also led some to believe that LTO's real intention might be to phase out older vehicles in favor of test standards that are designed for First World transportation and economies, and not the prevalent *halo-*

WHEREAS, the IT system used by the first PMVICs authorized to operate are also not compatible with the Land Transportation Management System (LTMS) of LTO. This means that vehicle owners have to pay for another testing in another testing center;¹⁶

WHEREAS, for this reason, and due to the imposition of exorbitant fees, poor handling of complaints, and for failing to be inspected by the local government prior to starting operations, a PMVIC in San Fernando, La Union was suspended by the Sanguniang Panglungsod;¹⁷

WHEREAS, the above complaints and issues raised by stakeholders should be enough for the DOTR and LTO to suspend the implementation of DO 2019-019 and MC 2018-2158 and look into improving their system;

WHEREAS, due to the failure of said agencies to act on the matter, and the seeming haste in the manner this policy was implemented, it is imperative that this chamber look into the addressing the concerns of millions of motor vehicle owners so as not to add to their everyday burdens especially during a pandemic;

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate of the Philippines, to direct the Senate Committee on Public Services to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the implementation of Department of Transportation (DOTR) Department Order No. 2018-019 and Land Transportation Office (LTO) Memorandum Circular No. 2018-2158, and all related issuances, with the end in view of addressing the concerns of motorists regarding the operations of Private Motor Vehicle Inspection Centers (PMVICs) and, ultimately, amending said issuances to improve the Motor Vehicle Inspection System (MVIS) in the country.
