

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORTED ILLEGAL ONLINE ADOPTION FACILITATED THROUGH FAKE FACEBOOK ACCOUNTS

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State that all matters relating to the care, custody and adoption of a child, his/her interest shall be the paramount consideration;

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the State to provide alternative protection and assistance through foster care or adoption for every child who is neglected, orphaned, or abandoned;

WHEREAS, an article from the Philippine Star, dated February 8, 2021, reported that the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) is working with the National Bureau of Investigation and law enforcement agencies to track down groups behind 48 fake Facebook accounts that claim to facilitate illegal online adoption;

WHEREAS, in an online forum on legal adoption organized by the DSWD as part of the Adoption Consciousness Week, Wilma Naviamos of the DSWD's Program Management Bureau said that they have already monitored and tracked down the fake Facebook accounts and added that they do not encourage online adoption because it is illegal;

WHEREAS, according to lawyer Bernadette Abejo, executive director of the Inter-Country Adoption Board (ICAB), they have complained of these social media accounts that claim to process online adoption which has been hard to track because it is illegal. She stated that it will only come out when somebody files a case or a complaint;

WHEREAS, the DSWD is pushing for prospective parents, who want to provide abandoned, neglected and surrendered children in need of permanent families a home, to go through the legal process. According to Glenda Relova, DSWD assistant secretary for statutory programs and the Philippines' alternate representative to the ICAB, said that in 2020, despite the lockdowns and restrictions on movements, they

continued to work on the processing of domestic and inter-country adoptions of abandoned, neglected and surrendered children in need of permanent families;

WHEREAS, despite the limitations in movement during the lockdown in 2020, a total of 487 certifications declaring a child legally available for adoption was issued, 278 children were placed out for domestic adoption and 208 were issued with intercountry adoption clearance;

WHEREAS, DSWD handled 312 cases of domestic adoption cases in 2019 and 278 in 2020. In addition, from 2009 to 2020, DSWD has cleared children numbering 4,396 and for children who were matched for inter-country adoption, an equivalent of 3,819;

WHEREAS, a Senate inquiry on the matter is necessary in order to address the problem of illegal online adoption in the country;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the proper Senate Committees to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the reported illegal online adoption facilitated through fake Facebook accounts.
