

The Committees on Basic Education, Arts and Culture; Higher, Technical and Vocational Education; and Finance to which were referred **Senate Bill No. 1887**, introduced by Senators Win Gatchalian and Joel Villanueva, entitled:



AN ACT

ENHANCING THE QUALITY OF BASIC EDUCATION IN THE PHILIPPINES BY IMPROVING THE QUALITY OF TEACHERS AND SCHOOL LEADERS, STRENGTHENING THE TEACHER EDUCATION COUNCIL UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7784 ENTITLED "AN ACT TO STRENGTHEN TEACHER EDUCATION IN THE PHILIPPINES BY ESTABLISHING CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE, CREATING A TEACHER EDUCATION COUNCIL FOR THE PURPOSE, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES", INSTITUTIONALIZING THE NATIONAL EDUCATORS ACADEMY OF THE PHILIPPINES, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Teacher Education 2 Excellence Act".

Sec. 2. *Coverage*. – This Act shall apply to teachers and school leaders in all public and private basic education institutions, and to all public and private teacher education institutions (TEIs).

Sec. 3. Section 1 of Republic Act No. 7784, entitled "An Act to Strengthen Teacher Education in the Philippines by Establishing Centers of Excellence, Creating a Teacher

Education Council for the Purpose, Appropriating Funds Therefor, and for Other Purposes", is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. — It is the declared policy of the State to protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and [shall] TO take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all. It is likewise universally recognized that the teacher is the key to [the effectiveness—of the] EFFECTIVE teaching-learning processES by drawing out and nurturing the best in the learner as a human being and a worthy member of society. THE SCHOOL LEADER SUPPORTS THE TEACHER BY FOSTERING AN EFFECTIVE TEACHING CULTURE THAT PROMOTES ENTHUSIASTIC AND INDEPENDENT LEARNERS WHO ARE COMMITTED TO LIFELONG LEARNING.

[Thus, this Act aims to provide and] TOWARDS THIS END, THE STATE SHALL ensure quality education by [strengthening the education and training of teachers nationwide through a national system of excellence for teacher education.] PROVIDING A DYNAMIC, MODERN, AND EQUITABLE EDUCATION SYSTEM THROUGH THE NATIONAL LEADERSHIP OF THE TEACHER EDUCATION COUNCIL WHICH IS MANDATED TO CARRY OUT THIS VISION THROUGH THE DEVELOPMENT OF TEACHERS AND SCHOOL LEADERS WHO ARE

[Our vision is a teacher education system whose mission is to educate and train-teachers] of unquestionable integrity and competence, and who are committed to their continuing professional growth and obligation to help [their students] LEARNERS grow as responsible individuals and citizens of the Philippines and of the world."

Sec. 4. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 7784 is hereby amended to read as follows: "SEC. 2. *Definition of Terms.* – As used in this Act:

[(d)] (A) ["] TEACHER EDUCATION [G] Center of [e] Excellence [" shall be]

REFERS TO a public or private college, institute, school or agency,

WHICH MAY EXIST BY ITSELF OR WITHIN A UNIVERSITY OR

COLLEGE, engaged in [the] pre-service and continuing education.

The centers of excellence may exist by themselves or within a university or college].

- [(c)] (B) [*] Excellence [" pertains] REFERS to the efficient, effective, and innovative delivery of relevant, functional, and quality programs in teacher education PARTICULARLY IN THE AREAS OF CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT AND INSTRUCTION, training, research, and [community service] EXTENSION SERVICES.
 - (C) FORMAL EDUCATION REFERS TO THE SYSTEMATIC AND DELIBERATE PROCESS OF HIERARCHICALLY STRUCTURED AND SEQUENTIAL ACADEMIC LEARNING FROM KINDERGARTEN TO DOCTORAL STUDIES.
 - (D) NON-FORMAL EDUCATION REFERS TO ANY ORGANIZED AND SYSTEMATIC EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY UNDERTAKEN OUTSIDE THE FRAMEWORK OF THE FORMAL EDUCATION SYSTEM TO PROVIDE SELECTED TYPES OF LEARNING TO A SEGMENT OF THE POPULATION.
 - (E) PRE-SERVICE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS INCLUDE UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES OF TEACHING COVERING MANDATORY CURRICULUM AND PRACTICUM SPECIFICATIONS.

2 WHO PERFORM TEACHING-RELATED FUNCTIONS SUCH AS
3 GUIDANCE COUNSELORS AND LIBRARIANS, AND OTHER

(G) PROFESSIONAL **STANDARDS** REFER TO **PUBLIC DOCUMENTS THAT** SET OUT **EXPECTATIONS OF** PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE FOR TEACHERS AND SCHOOL LEADERS ACROSS THEIR RESPECTIVE CAREER STAGES. THE COUNCIL SHALL ADOPT THE PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (DEPED), AND ENSURE THEIR INTEGRITY THROUGH RIGOROUS REVIEWS AFTER EVERY FIVE (5) YEARS, OR WHEN THE COUNCIL DEEMS IT NECESSARY.

(H) SCHOOL LEADERS REFER TO HEAD TEACHERS, PRINCIPALS, AND SUPERVISORS IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM AND THEIR EQUIVALENT POSITIONS IN THE PRIVATE SCHOOL SYSTEM, WHO ARE QUALIFIED TO PRACTICE THE TEACHING PROFESSION AND MANAGE AND LEAD TEACHERS.

17	Sec. 18. A new section designated as Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7784 is
18	hereby inserted to read as follows:
19	"SEC. 16. REPORT TO CONGRESS.— THE COUNCIL SHALL SUBMIT
20	TO CONGRESS, ON OR BEFORE THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF JUNE OF
21	EVERY YEAR, ITS REPORT ON THE STATUS AND PROGRESS OF
22	TEACHER EDUCATION AND TEACHER QUALITY IN THE COUNTRY,
23	AS WELL AS ITS RECOMMENDATIONS IN PROMOTING QUALITY
24	EDUCATION THROUGH TEACHER EDUCATION.
25	THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING TOPICS AND
26	OTHER AREAS OF CONCERN TO BE STIPULATED UNDER THE
27	IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THIS ACT:
28	A) ROADMAP FOR TEACHER EDUCATION AND THE REGULAR
29	PROGRESS THEREON;
30	B) ISSUES AND PROBLEMS ON TEACHER EDUCATION AND THE
31	SOLUTIONS PROVIDED BY THE COUNCIL; AND
32	C) PROFESSIONALIZATION OF THE PRACTICE OF TEACHING

1	AND THE COUNCIL'S INITIATIVES TO IMPROVE THE SAME.
2	THE SUBMISSION OF THE ANNUAL REPORT REQUIRED UNDER
3	THIS SECTION SHALL COMMENCE THREE (3) YEARS FROM THE
4	CONSTITUTION OF THE COUNCIL."

6	Sec. 19. A new section designated as Section 17 of Republic Act No. 7784 is
7	hereby inserted to read as follows:
8	"SEC. 17. JOINT CONGRESSIONAL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
9	(JCOC) ON TEACHER EDUCATION THERE IS HEREBY CREATED A
10	JCOC TO OVERSEE, MONITOR, AND EVALUATE THE
11	IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ACT. THE JCOC SHALL BE COMPOSED
12	OF FIVE (5) MEMBERS EACH FROM THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
13	REPRESENTATIVES WITH THE CHAIRS OF THE COMMITTEES ON
14	BASIC EDUCATION OF BOTH HOUSES AS CO-CHAIRS. THE CHAIRS
15	OF THE COMMITTEES ON HIGHER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION OF
16	BOTH HOUSES SHALL LIKEWISE BE DESIGNATED AS MEMBERS OF
17	THE JCOC. THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND
18	THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE SHALL DESIGNATE THE OTHER

21	ON BASIC EDUCATION, ONE (1) MEMBER OF WHICH SHALL BE
22	FROM THE MINORITY."

24	Sec. 20. The subsequent sections of Republic Act No. 7784 are hereby renumbered
25	accordingly.

27	Sec. 21. Appropriations The Secretary of Education shall immediately include in
28	the DepEd's budget the amount necessary for the effective implementation of this Act.
29	Thereafter, the amount for its continuous implementation shall be included in the Annual
30	General Appropriations Act of the DEPED, CHED, TESDA, and PRC.

1	Sec. 22. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). – Within sixty (60) days from
2	the effectivity of this Act, the Council created under Section 7 herein shall issue the
3	necessary rules and regulations for its effective implementation. The IRR issued pursuant
4	to this section shall take effect thirty (30) days after its publication in a newspaper of
5	general circulation.
6	Copies of the IRR as published shall be transmitted to the Chairs of the Committees
7	on Basic Education not later than six (6) months after the effectivity of this Act.
8	
9	Sec. 23. Separability Clause. – If any provision or part of this Act is declared invalid
10	or unconstitutional, the remaining parts not affected shall remain in full force and effect.
11	
12	Sec. 24 Repealing Clause All other laws, executive orders, presidential decrees,
13	administrative orders, rules and regulations, issuances, or parts thereof inconsistent with
14	or contrary to the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified

accordingly.

Sec. 25. *Effectivity*. – Notwithstanding the non-issuance of the IRR, this Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
