"AN ACT

DECLARING TWO PARCELS OF LAND SITUATED WITHIN CARLES. IN ISLAND, MUNICIPALITY OF \mathbf{THE} SICOGON AREA WITH THE PROVINCE OF ILOILO,A PROTECTED CATEGORY OF WILDLIFE SANCTUARY UNDER THE NATIONAL INTEGRATED PROTECTED AREAS SYSTEM (NIPAS), TO BE SICOGON ISLAND WILDLIFE REFERRED TO ASTHE MANAGEMENT, AND PROVIDING FOR ITS SANCTUARY, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

ARTICLE I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. *Title*. –This Act shall be known as the "Sicogon Island Wildlife Sanctuary Act".

5 SEC. 2.Declaration of Policy. -Cognizant of the profound impact of 6 human activities on all components of the natural environment, it is hereby 7 declared the policy of the State to secure for the Filipino people of present and 8 future generations, the perpetual existence of all native plants and animals 9 through the declaration of protected areas under the National Integrated 10 Protected Areas System (NIPAS) within the classification of national park as 11 provided for in the Constitution.

In recognition of the richness of the biological resources, both flora and fauna, that are native and distinct to Sicogon Island, as well as their aesthetic and

ecological importance, two parcels of land situated in Sicogon Island, Municipality 1 2 of Carles, in the Province of Iloilo, is hereby declared a protected area with the category of wildlife sanctuary, and shall hereinafter be referred to as the Sicogon 3 Island Wildlife Sanctuary (SIWS). As such, the State shall ensure the 4 conservation, protection, management and rehabilitation of the area. It is likewise 5 6 recognized that effective administration of this area is possible only through cooperation among national government, local government units (LGUs), 7 concerned nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), private entities and local 8 9 communities. The use and enjoyment of this area must be consistent with the 10 principles of biological diversity and sustainable development.

Towards this end, the State shall ensure the full implementation of this Act, the mobilization of resources for the institutional mechanisms herein established, and the full scientific and technical support needed for the conservation of biodiversity and the integrity of the ecosystems, culture and indigenous practices.

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SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. – As used in this Act:

- a. *Bufferzones*refer to identified areas outside the boundaries of and immediately adjacent to designated protected areasthat need special development control in order to avoid or minimize harm to the protected area;
- b. Conservation refers to any act or acts of preservation and sustainable
 utilization of wildlife or maintenance, restoration and enhancement of
 habitats;
- c. Indigenous cultural communities (ICCs)/Indigenous peoples (IPs) refer to
 groups of people sharing common bonds of language, customs, traditions,
 and other distinctive cultural traits, and who have, since time immemorial
 occupied, possessed and utilized a territory;
- d. National park refers to land of the public domain classified as such in the
 Constitution which includes all areas under the NIPAS, primarily
 designated for the conservation of native plants and animals, their
 associated habitats and cultural diversity;
- e. Protected area refers to an identified portion of land and water set aside by reason of its unique physical and biological significance, managed to

enhance biological diversity and protected against destructive human exploitation;

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f. Tenured migrants refer to protected area occupants who have been actually, continuously and presently occupying aportion of the protected area for five (5) years before the proclamation or law establishing the same as a protected area, and are solely dependent therein for subsistence; and 6

g. Wildlife Sanctuary refers to an area which assures the natural conditions 7 necessary to protect nationally significant species, groups of species, biotic 8 communities or physical features of the environment which may require 9 specific human manipulations for their perpetuation. 10

SEC. 4. Classification as a National Park. - The SIWS is comprised of 11 two (2) parcels of land of the public domain situated within Sicogon Island, 12 Municipality of Carles, Province of Iloilo.All lands of the public domain within the 13 coverage and scope of the SIWS shall fall under the classification of national park 14 as provided for in Article XII, Section 3 of the Constitution. 15

SEC. 5. Scope and Coverage. - The boundaries of the SIWS are more 16 particularly described as follows: 17

4	SEC. 6. Establishment of Buffer ZonesThe DENR Secretary, upon th			
5	recommendation of the Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) created under			
. 6	Section 7 of this Act, may designate areas surrounding the SIWS as buffer zones			
7	for the purpose of providing an extra layer of protection where restrictions may be			
8	applied: Provided, That, in cases where the designated buffer zone would cover			
9	private lands, the owners thereof shall be required to design their development			
10	with due consideration to the protected area management plan.			
11	ARTICLE II			
12	MANAGEMENT MECHANISMS			
13	SEC. 7. Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) - Within ninet			
14	(90)days from the effectivity of this Act, a Protected Area Management Board			
15	(PAMB) shall be created to oversee the management of the SIWS. The PAMB shall			
16	be composed of the following:			
17	a. DENR Regional Director for Region VI, as Chairperson;			
18	b. Governor of the Province of Iloilo or a duly authorized representative;			
19	c. Senators of the Republic of the Philippines who are duly registered			
20	residents of Iloilo, or their duly designated representatives, unless th			
21	Senators decline the membership in the PAMB;			
22	d. District Representatives of the Congressional Districts where the SIW			
23	is located, or their duly designated representatives, unless the District			
24	Representatives decline the membership in the PAMB;			
25	e. Mayor of the Municipality of Carles, in the Province of Iloilo or a dul			
26	authorized representative;			
27	f. Chairpersons of the all the barangays with territorial jurisdiction ove			
28	the SIWS;			
29	g. Regional Directors of the following government agencies, namely: th			
30	Department of Agriculture (DA), the National Economic an			
21	Development Authority (NEDA), the Department of Science an			
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Department of National Defense (DND);

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h. Three (3) representatives from NGOs or people's organizations (POs) based in the Province of Iloilo, duly accredited both by the DENR and the provincial government. The NGOs or POs represented should have been in existence for at least five (5) years and must have a record of accomplishments in the field of protected area management;

 At least one (1) but not more than three (3) representatives from all the ICCs/IPs present in the area and recognized by the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP);

- j. One (1) representative from an academic institution, preferably from a university or college in the Province of Iloilo, with a record of accomplishments in or related to protected area management; and
 - k. One (1) representative from the private sector, preferably a resident of the Province of Iloilo, who is distinguished in a profession or field of interest relevant to the protected area management.

The terms of office of members of the PAMB, as well as the grounds for their removal shall be in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 7586, otherwise known as the "National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 1992", as amended by Republic Act No. 11038, otherwise known as the "Expanded National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 2018".

SEC. 8. Functions of the PAMB. – The PAMB shall have the following powers and functions:

a. Oversee the management of the protected area;

- b. Approve policies, plans and programs, proposals, agreements, and other
 related documents for the management of the protected areas;
- c. Approve the management plan of the protected area and ensure its
 harmonization with and integration into the Ancestral Domain Sustainable
 Development and Protection Plan, land use plan and other development
 plans, public or private, and their implementation;
- d. Adopt a manual of operations to include rules of procedures in the conduct
 of business, and the creation of committees and their respective terms of
 reference;

e. Recommend the deputation of appropriate agencies and individuals for the enforcement of the laws, rules and regulations governing the management of the protected area;

f. Allocate financial resources for the implementation of the management plan and manage the Protected Area Retention Income Account and other funds 5 in accordance with government accounting, budgeting and auditing rules 6 and regulations; 7

g. Set fees and charges in accordance with existing guidelines;

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h. Issue rules and regulations for the resolution of conflicts through appropriate and effective means;

i. Recommend appropriate policy changes to the DENR and other government 11 authorities with respect to the management of the SIWS; 12

j. Monitor and assess the performance of the Protected Area Superintendent 13 (PASu) and other protected area personnel and compliance of partners with 14 the terms and conditions of any undertaking, contract or agreement relative 15 to any project or activity within the SIWS; 16

k. Recommend from among a shortlist of qualified candidates, the designation 17 or appointment of the PASu; and 18

1. Assess the effectiveness of the management of the protected area: Provided, 19 That the members of the PAMB representing the LGUs and national 20 agencies shall inform their respective constituents, offices or sectors, of 21 PAMB-approved or other relevant policies, rules, regulations, programs, 22 and projects and shall ensure that the provisions of this Act and the rules 23 and regulations issued to implement are complied with and used as 24 reference and framework in their respective plans, policies, programs, and 25 Failure to comply with the foregoing shall be the basis for 26 projects. disciplinary action against such member according to administrative rules 27 and regulations and such penalties as the PAMB may provide: Provided, 28 further, That the DENR, through the Regional Director, shall ensure that 29 the PAMB acts within the scope of its powers and functions. In case of 30 conflict between the resolutions issued by the PAMB and the existing 31 administrative orders of national application, the latter shall prevail. 32

SEC. 9. The Protected Area Management Office (PAMO). - There is 1 hereby established a Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) to be headed by 2 a Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) who shall supervise the day to day 3 management, protection, and administration of the SIWS. The PASu shall hold a 4 permanent plantilla position and shall be appointed by the DENR Secretary. A 5 sufficient number of support staff with permanent plantilla positions shall 6 likewise be appointed by the DENR Secretary to assist the PASu in the 7 8 management of the protected area.

9 The PASu shall be primarily accountable to the PAMB and the DENR for 10 the management and operations of the SIWS. Pursuant thereto, the PASu shall 11 have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. Prepare the management plan, in consultation with the stakeholders, including the annual work and financial plan and ensure its implementation;
- b. Ensure the integration of the protected area management plans, programs,
 projects, and policies with relevant national and LGUs' plans and programs;
- c. Provide secretariat services to the PAMB and its committees and ensure the
 availability of relevant and timely information for decision-making;
- d. Formulate and recommend to the PAMB proposed policies, rules,
 regulations, and programs;
- e. Establish, operate, and maintain a database management system which
 shall be an important basis for decision-making;
- f. Enforce the laws, rules and regulations relevant to the protected area,
 commence and institute administrative and legal actions in collaboration
 with other government agencies or organizations, and assist in the
 prosecution of offenses committed in violation of the provisions of this Act;
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g. Monitor, evaluate, and report the implementation of management activities of the protected area;

h. Request for and receive any technical assistance, support or advice from any
 agency or instrumentality of the government as well as academic
 institutions, NGOs, and the private sector, as may be necessary for the
 effective management, protection and administration of the protected area;

1	i.	Issue permits and clearances for activities that implement the management
2		plan and other permitted activities in accordance with terms, conditions,
3		and criteria established by the PAMB: Provided, That all permits for
4		extraction of natural resources, including collection of wildlife, and its by-
·5		products or derivatives for research purposes, shall continue to be issued by
6		relevant authorities, subject to prior clearance from the PAMB, through the
7		PASu, in accordance with the specific acts to be covered;
8	. j.	Collect and receive pertinent fees, charges, donations, and other income for
9		the protected area: Provided, That such fees, charges, donations, and other
10		income collected and received shall be reported regularly to the PAMB and
11		the DENR in accordance with existing guidelines;
12	k.	Prepare and recommend to the PAMB, approval of the annual work and
13		financial plans of the protected area based on the management plan; and
14	1.	Perform such other functions as the PAMB and the DENR may assign.
15		The PAMO may be augmented by the deputized local environment and
16	natura	al resources officers upon the recommendation of the PAMB and approval of
17	the DI	ENR.
18		ARTICLE III
19		PROCEEDS AND FEES
20		SEC. 10. The Sicogon Island Wildlife Sanctuary Fund There is
21	hereby	y established a trust fund to be known as the Sicogon Island Wildlife
22	Sanct	uary Fund for purposes of financing projects of the SIWS and the NIPAS. All
23	incom	e generated from the operation and management of wild flora and fauna in
24	the SI	IWS shall accrue to the fund. The income shall be derived from fees from
25	permi	tted sale and export of flora and fauna and other resources from the SIWS,
26	procee	eds from lease of multiple-use areas, contributions from industries and
27	facilit	ies directly benefiting from the SIWS, and such other fees and income
28	derive	d from the operation of the SIWS.
29		The PAMB shall retain seventy-five percent (75%) of all revenues raised
30	throug	gh the above means, which shall be deposited in the Protected Area-Retained
31	Incom	e Account (PA-RIA) in any authorized government depository bank within

for the protection, maintenance, administration, and management of the protected area and implementation of duly approved projects of the PAMB.The remaining twenty-five percent (25%) of revenues shall be deposited as a special account in the general fund in the National Treasury for purposes of financing the programs and projects of the NIPAS.

6 The fund may be augmented by grants, donations, endowment from various 7 sources, domestic or foreign: *Provided*, That the fund shall be deposited in full as a 8 special account in the National Treasury and disbursements therefrom shall be 9 made solely for the protection, maintenance, administration, and management of 10 the NIPAS and duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with 11 existing accounting, budgeting, and auditing rules and regulations: *Provided*, 12 *further*, That the fund shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

The LGUs shall continue to impose and collect all other fees not enumerated herein which they have traditionally collected, such as business permits, property tax and rentals of LGUs' facilities.

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ARTICLE IV

TRANSITORY AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

18 SEC. 11. Appropriations. - The Secretary of the DENR shall immediately 19 include in the Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding 20 of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 12. Suppletory Application of the NIPAS Law. - The provisions of Republic Act No. 7586, as amended by Republic Act No. 11038, shall have suppletory application to this Act.

SEC. 13. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Secretary of the DENR shall, in consultation with the local government of the Municipality of Carles, the provincial government of Iloilo, and concerned national government agencies, issue the corresponding rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

30 SEC. 14.Separability Clause. – If any section or provision of this Act is 31 held unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining sections or provisions with the 32 provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SEC. 15. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, letters of instruction,
 executive orders, rules and regulations and other issuances or parts thereof
 inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 16. *Effectivity*. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation
