RESOLUTION

EXTOLLING HIDILYN F. DIAZ FOR MAKING HISTORY AS THE FIRST (1^{5T}) FILIPINA TO WIN A GOLD MEDAL IN THE OLYMPICS, ESTABLISHING A NEW WORLD RECORD, AND AS AN EXAMPLE TO ALL FILIPINOS

WHEREAS, on 26 July 2021, Hidilyn F. Diaz triumphed as the gold medalist in the women's fifty-five kilogram (55 kg) category of the weightlifting competition at the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo, Japan, and thereby secured the first (1st) gold medal won by an Olympics athlete from the Republic of the Philippines¹ — an unprecedented feat in the Philippines' ninety-seven (97) year history as a competitor of the international Olympic Games;


WHEREAS, Hidilyn F. Diaz established a new world record in her weightlifting category lifting a total of two hundred twenty-four kilograms (224 kg)², consistent with Hidilyn's history as a Philippine prodigy for having competed in the 2008 Summer Olympics as one of its youngest competitors and as the Filipino epitome of indomitable will, hard work, and dogged determination;

WHEREAS, Hidilyn F. Diaz is of great pride to her people, her country, her family, and herself, showing the Filipina never-say-die attitude, and proving everything is possible over any shortcomings, against all odds, and even with humble beginnings;

NOW, THEREFORE, RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Senate to extol the fantabulous deeds of Hidilyn F. Diaz — now the Philippines' greatest Olympian — for making history as the first Filipina to win a gold medal in the Olympics in the 2020 Summer Olympics held in Tokyo, Japan from July to August 2021, establishing world records, and as an example to all Filipinos.
