## RESOLUTION

COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE PHILIPPINE CONTINGENT TO THE 2020 TOKYO OLYMPICS COMPOSED OF NINETEEN FILIPINO OLYMPIANS, ALONG WITH THEIR RESPECTIVE COACHES, TRAINERS AND SUPPORT TEAMS, FOR ABLY REPRESENTING THE NATION, SHOWCASING FILIPINO SPORTSMANSHIP, AND BRINGING HONOR AND PRIDE TO THE COUNTRY

Whereas, the Olympic Games, which is considered as the world's biggest and foremost multi-sport meet that is participated by 205 ccuntries across 339 sporting events, was celebrated in Tokyo, Japan from July 23 to August 8, 2021;

Whereas, the Philippines sent its biggest delegation in two decades since the 2000 Sydney Games that is composed of nineteen athletes to represent the country in eleven sports in the quadrennial tournament. They are:

10	country's largest medal haul in the Olympics, with a total of four medals (one
11	gold, two silver and one bronze), and achieved its strongest finish yet since its
12	initial participation in the Olympics in 1924;
13	Whereas, the Philippines ranked 50th overall in the 2020 Olympics,
14	emerging as the most successful campaign in Southeast Asian region and the
15	10 <sup>th</sup> best performing country in Asia;
16	Whereas, Diaz won the first ever Olympic gold medal for the country in the
17	women's 55-kg category in weightlifting;
18	Whereas, Petecio became the first Filipina boxer to claim an Olympic
19	medal after copping silver in the women's featherweight division. She was also
20	praised for displaying sportsmanship and being gracious to her opponent after
21	the final bout¹;
22	Whereas, Marcial succeeded in the men's middleweight division in boxing
23	and captured a bronze medal;

Whereas, Obiena, who ranked sixth in the world and the Philippine record holder in pole vault at 5.87 meters, emerged as the only Asian to enter the final round in the athletics men's pole vault and finished eleventh overall;

Whereas, Yulo, who was the second Filipino to qualify to the 2020 Summer Games and ended the fifty-two year absence of the country in Olympic gymnastics, secured a finals slot in the vault event of artistic gymnastics and finished at fourth place;

Whereas, Ando, in her maiden Olympic stint, placed seventh in the 64-kg category of women's weightlifting and set her career-best records after successfully clearing 100-kg in snatch and 122-kg in clean and jerk for a total lift of 222-kg;

Whereas, Gebbie set a new national record of 49.64 seconds in men's 100-meter freestyle in one of the Olympic swimming heats;

Whereas, Saso climbed steadily in women's individual stroke play in golf to tie in ninth place overall after initially starting at rank 47<sup>th</sup>;

Whereas, Nievarez qualified for the quarterfinals of the men's single sculls by placing third in his heat, and giving the best performance by a Filipino rower;

Whereas, the Filipino athletes represented the country well in their respective events and proudly demonstrated their athletic prowess, indomitable spirit, and admirable sportsmanship as flag bearers of the country;

Whereas, they have shown dedication and commitment to sports in preparing for and competing on the world stage despite risks to their personal health and safety amid the novel Coronavirus pandemic;

Whereas, the coaches and trainers who instilled discipline, developed the technique and honed the character of our athletes also merit to be recognized for their bringing out the best in our delegates and turning them into world-class champions;
