AN ACT CREATING A SECOND CONGRESSIONAL COMMISSION ON EDUCATION TO ASSESS AND EVALUATE STATE THE OF PHILIPPINE EDUCATION AND RECOMMEND INNOVATIVE TARGETED REFORMS EDUCATION. AND IN PROVIDING **FUNDS** THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 Section 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as
- 2 the "Second Congressional Commission on Education Act
- 3 (EDCOM II)".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared 1 2 the policy of the State to make education as a critical 3 component of human capital development, socio-economic equality, inclusive growth, sustainable development, and 4 5 fulfillment of human rights. Pursuant to Article XIV of the 6 Constitution which mandates the State to protect and 7 promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, take appropriate steps to make such education 8 9 accessible to all, and establish, maintain, and support a 10 complete, adequate, and integrated system of education relevant to the needs of the people and society, and in 11 consonance with the Sustainable Development Goals, the 12 State hereby adopts the following policies: 13

(a) The State shall place education at the center of its development policies, guided by a national vision on education, to be strategically fulfilled through a set of specific, targeted, measurable and time-bound solutions that is a product of a comprehensive assessment and evaluation, effective planning, and strategic investments in education;

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- 1 (b) The State shall develop a more harmonized and 2 coordinated education ecosystem that will lead to the 3 achievement of the goal of developing the country's human capital as an essential factor to national development, 4 5 through a review of the mandates of the three sub-sectors 6 of education, namely the Department of Education (DepEd), the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), 7 and the Technical Education and Skills Development 8 9 Authority (TESDA); and
- 10 (c) The State recognizes the role of digital
 11 transformation in education, and shall give priority to the
 12 use of science, technology and innovation for the sector to
 13 evolve into an effective, efficient and disruptive force in
 14 society.

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SEC. 3. *Objectives*. – It is the objective of this Act to create an EDCOM II to undertake a comprehensive national assessment and evaluation of the performance of the Philippine education sector for the purpose of recommending transformative, concrete and targeted

- 1 reforms in the sector with the end in view of making the
- 2 Philippines an intellectual power of Asia.
- 3 The national assessment and evaluation shall include
- 4 the following:
- 5 (1) review of the observance of the mandates of the
- 6 laws that created the three education sub-sectors, namely
- 7 the DepEd, the CHED and the TESDA;
- 8 (2) determination of factors that have contributed to
- 9 the continuing failure in learner performance on identified
- 10 subject areas to meet the desired international and local
- 11 standards;
- 12 (3) recommendations comprising of specific, targeted
- 13 and time-bound solutions to enable the education
- 14 sub-sectors to improve performance vis-à-vis measurable
- 15 indicators and deliver accessible, inclusive and quality
- 16 education that is at par with world standards;
- 17 (4) identification of best practices of various national
- 18 and international educational institutions that can be
- 19 adopted across the entire education system;

1	(5) proposal for a monitoring and evaluation plan to								
2	ensure the timely achievement of set targets;								
3	(6) determination of the role of local government								
4	units in the delivery of basic education services; and								
5	(7) additional legislation to further the objectives of								
6	this Act.								
7	To address the current learning crisis, the EDCOM II								
8	shall immediately draw a roadmap which shall be								
9	strategic, inclusive and adaptable to global trends and								
10	future challenges and proposing solutions to the issues								
11	which are systemic in nature.								
12	Sec. 4. Powers and Functions of EDCOM II								
13	EDCOM II shall have the following powers and functions:								
14	(1) assess and evaluate the formal, non-formal,								

- informal and alternative learning systems, including continuing systems of education at all levels;
- 17 (2) produce a report of its findings;
- 18 (3) formulate short-term and long-term policy and 19 program recommendations that consist of specific, 20 targeted, measurable and time-bound solutions;

1	(4)	approve	the	budget	for	the	programs	of	the

- 2 Commission and all disbursements therefrom, including
- 3 compensation of all personnel;
- 4 (5) hold hearings and receive testimonies, reports and 5 expert advice on the status of Philippine education;
- 6 (6) conduct multi-stakeholder consultations on the 7 ground, including but not limited to the teachers, parents,
- 8 local government units, and the learners themselves;
- 9 (7) consult with councils which are mandated to
 10 protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality
 11 education;
- 12 (8) pass upon the recommendations of the Technical
 13 Secretariat which it shall organize, to be headed by an
 14 executive director;
- 15 (9) report to Congress its accomplishments on a 16 periodic basis;
- 17 (10) secure assistance from any office of the 18 government;
- 19 (11) hire and appoint employees and personnel 20 whether temporary, contractual, or on consultancy;

- 1 (12) summon by *subpoena* any public official or
 2 private citizen to testify before it, or require by *subpoena*3 *duces tecum* the production of necessary documents; and
- 4 (13) formulate the necessary rules and guidelines for 5 the effective implementation of the objectives of this Act.
- 6 SEC. 5. Duration of EDCOM II. The Commission
 7 shall accomplish its mandate within two (2) years from its
 8 organization.
- A Technical Secretariat shall co-exist with the
 Commission during the said two-year period to provide
 technical and administrative support to the Commission in
 the exercise of its powers and performance of its functions
 under Section 4 of this Act.

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For purposes of administrative oversight on the implementation of the short-term and long-term policy and program recommendations of the Commission, the Technical Secretariat shall exist for another two-year period which shall immediately commence after the duration of EDCOM II.

1	SEC. 6. Composition The Commission shall be
2	composed of ten (10) members, with five (5) members from
3	the Senate and five (5) members from the House of
4	Representatives.
5	The members from the Senate shall be composed of
6	the Chairpersons of the following committees:
7	(1) Committee on Basic Education, Arts and Culture;
8	(2) Committee on Higher, Technical and Vocational
9	Education;
10	(3) Committee on Finance;
11	(4) Committee on Science and Technology; and
12	(5) Committee on Labor, Employment and Human
13	Resources Development.
14	The members from the House of Representatives
15	shall be composed of the Chairpersons of the following
16	committees:
17	(1) Committee on Basic Education and Culture;
18	(2) Committee on Higher and Technical Education;
19	(3) Committee on Appropriations;

(4) Committee on Science and Technology; and

- 1 (5) Committee on Labor and Employment.
- 2 The Chairpersons of the Senate Committees on Basic
- 3 Education, Arts and Culture, and on Higher, Technical and
- 4 Vocational Education, and the Chairpersons of the House
- 5 Committees on Basic Education and Culture, and on
- 6 Higher and Technical Education shall serve as
- 7 Co-Chairpersons of the Commission.
- 8 The members of the Commission may establish
- 9 standing committees from among its members and use
- 10 resource persons from the public and private sectors as
- 11 may be needed.
- The members of the Commission shall receive no
- 13 compensation, but travelling, communications, and other
- 14 necessary expenses shall be allowed.
- The Philippine Institute for Development Studies
- 16 (PIDS) shall serve as the research arm of the Commission.
- 17 During the course of the Commission's existence, it shall
- 18 produce data-based research and provide analysis to
- 19 contribute to the formulation of education policy
- 20 recommendations. Payment for the goods and

- 1 compensation for services to be entailed by the PIDS for
- 2 the necessary fulfillment of this function shall be included
- 3 in the amount to be appropriated for the Commission
- 4 under this Act.
- 5 SEC. 7. Education, Legislation and Policy Advisory
- 6 Council. An Education, Legislation and Policy Advisory
- 7 Council is hereby created to provide the Commission with
- 8 expert assistance and advice. The Advisory Council shall
- 9 always be present in all meetings of the Commission. The
- 10 Senate President and the Speaker of the House of
- 11 Representatives shall choose recognized experts from the
- 12 following sectors to form part of the Advisory Council: Two
- 13 (2) members from the academe, two (2) members from the
- 14 business sector, two (2) members from the government
- 15 education agencies, two (2) members who are heads of local
- 16 government units, and two (2) members from civil society
- 17 organizations and development partners engaged in
- 18 education.
- 19 Sec. 8. Joint Congressional Oversight Committee
- 20 (JCOC) on EDCOM II. Immediately after the two-year

1	duration	of	EDCOM	II,	there	is	hereby	created	a	JCO	\mathbb{C}	to
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- 2 oversee, monitor, and evaluate the implementation of the
- 3 recommendations of the Commission. The JCOC shall be
- 4 composed of five (5) members each from the Senate and the
- 5 House of Representatives, with two (2) Co-Chairpersons
- 6 and two (2) Co-Vice Chairpersons. Each chamber shall
- 7 elect a Chairperson and a Vice Chairperson to be voted
- 8 upon by the members of the JCOC who chair the following
- 9 committees:
- 10 (1) Committee on Basic Education, Arts and Culture
- 11 of the Senate:
- 12 (2) Committee on Higher, Technical and Vocational
- 13 Education of the Senate:
- 14 (3) Committee on Basic Education and Culture of the
- 15 House of Representatives; and
- 16 (4) Committee on Higher and Technical Education of
- 17 the House of Representatives.
- 18 The Senate President and the Speaker of the House
- 19 of Representatives shall designate the other three (3)
- 20 members of the JCOC of the Senate and the House of

- 1 Representatives, respectively, from among the members of
- 2 the aforementioned committees, one (1) member of each
- 3 chamber shall be from the minority.
- 4 SEC. 9. Appropriations. The amount necessary for
- 5 the implementation of this Act shall be sourced from the
- 6 appropriations of the Senate and the House of
- 7 Representatives under the General Appropriations Act.
- 8 Twenty million pesos (P20,000,000.00) shall be
- 9 charged annually against the budget of the Senate, and
- 10 another Twenty million pesos (P20,000,000.00) shall be
- 11 charged annually against the budget of the House of
- Representatives, both for a period of two (2) years, to
- 13 commence on the Fiscal Year 2022, and subject to
- 14 authorized increases that may be made by Congress.
- 15 SEC. 10. Separability Clause. If any provision or
- 16 part of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the
- 17 remaining parts not affected shall remain in full force and
- 18 effect.
- 19 SEC. 11. Repealing Clause. All other laws, executive
- 20 orders, presidential decrees, administrative orders, rules

- 1 and regulations, issuances, or parts thereof inconsistent
- 2 with or contrary to the provisions of this Act are hereby
- 3 repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.
- 4 SEC. 12. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen
- 5 (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a
- 6 newspaper of general circulation.
