AN ACT

PENALIZING WILFUL AND INDISCRIMINATE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE ACT NO. 3815, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE REVISED PENAL CODE

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Article 155 of Act No. 3815 as amended, is hereby amended to read as

- 2 follows:
- 3 "ART. 155. Alarms and Scandals. The penalty of arresto menor or a fine not
- 4 exceeding Forty thousand pesos (P 40,000) shall be imposed upon:
- 5 1. Any person who within any town or public place, shall discharge any
- 6 [firearm,] rocket, firecracker, or other explosives calculated to cause
- 7 alarm or danger;
- 8 xxx"
- 9 SEC. 2. Article 254 of the same Act is also hereby amended to read as follows:
- 10 "ART. 254. Discharge of Firearms. –

Any person who shall shoot at another with any firearm shall suffer the
 penalty of *prision correccional* in its minimum and medium periods, unless
 the facts of the case are such that the act can be held to constitute frustrated
 or attempted parricide, murder, homicide, or any other crime for which a
 higher penalty is prescribed by any of the articles of this Code.

B) ANY PERSON WHO SHALL WILFULLY AND INDISCRIMINATELY
DISCHARGE ANY FIREARM OR OTHER DEVICE THAT MAY NOT HAVE
BEEN DESIGNED AS FIREARM BUT CAN BE FUNCTIONALLY USED AS
A FIREARM, SHALL SUFFER THE PENALTY OF ARRESTO MAYOR IN
ITS MAXIMUM PERIOD, UNLESS THE FACTS OF THE CASE CAN BE
HELD TO CONSTITUTE ANY OTHER OFFENSE OF WHICH A HIGHER
PENALTY IS PRESCRIBED.

IF THE PERSON WHO COMMITS THE OFFENSE PROVIDED IN 13 **C**) THIS ARTICLE IS A MEMBER OF THE MILITARY AND MILITARY 14 15 AUXILLARY AGENCIES, OR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, AUTHORIZED TO BEAR FIREARMS AND SUCH DISCHARGE IS NOT 16 IN THE PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL DUTIES, THE PENALTY ONE 17 DEGREE HIGHER THAN THAT PRESCRIBED ABOVE SHALL BE 18 IMPOSED AND THE OFFENDER MAY BE HELD ADMINISTRATIVELY 19 LIABLE. 20

21 IN ADDITION, TO THE PENALTIES IMPOSED HEREIN, ANY 22 FIREARM LICENSE OR PERMIT ISSUED IN FAVOR OF THE 23 OFFENDER SHALL BE SUMMARILY CANCELLED, AND THE OFFENDER 24 SHALL BE PERPETUALLY DISQUALIFIED FROM BEING GRANTED 25 ANY FIREARM LICENSE OR PERMIT."

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SEC. 3. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part of this Act is held invalid or
 unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid and subsisting.
 SEC. 4. Repealing Clause. - All laws, orders, proclamations, rules and regulations, or
 part thereof, which are inconsistent with any provision of this Act are hereby repealed or
 modified accordingly.
 SEC. 5. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in
 the Official Gazette or a newspaper of general circulation.
