RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING PROFOUND SYMPATHY AND SINCERE CONDOLENCES OF THE SENATE OF THE PHILIPPINES ON THE DEATH OF VETERAN ACTRESS GLORIA SEVILLA, CONSIDERED AS THE "QUEEN OF VISAYAN MOVIES," AND HONORING HER CONTRIBUTION IN PHILIPPINE CINEMA

WHEREAS, Gloria Sevilla is a multi-awarded and veteran film and television 1 actress whose career spanned seven decades and was recognized as the "Queen of 2 Visayan Movies"; 3 WHEREAS, Sevilla died peacefully in her sleep last April 16, 2022 in Oakland, 4 5 California at the age of 90; WHEREAS, Sevilla was fourteen years old when she was discovered after 6 winning at a high school oratorical contest at the University of the Visayas in Cebu 7 City. She starred as the titular Muslim royalty in the movie "Princesa Tirana" in 1951. 8 9 Following the box office success of her first film, she went to headline numerous movies including "Leonora" (1951), "Pailub Lang" (1951), "Utlanan" (1952), 10 "Handumanan" (1953), among many others; 11 WHEREAS, Sevilla is an acclaimed actress who earned her Best Supporting 12 Actress award from the Filipino Academy of Movie Arts and Sciences (FAMAS) for her 13 performance in "Madugong Paghihiganti" in 1962. She also received a FAMAS Best 14 Actress trophy for her portrayal in "Balis sa Kinabuhi," the first Visayan film to screen 15 at the Berlin and Moscow International film festivals in 1971; 16 WHEREAS, Sevilla won her second FAMAS Best Actress trophy in 1973 for the 17 18 movie "Gimigingaw Ako." It is with her excellent performances in these Visayan movies that she was able to represent and honor the diversity and richness of Philippine cinema;

WHEREAS, Sevilla is a tireless and dedicated artist who served the movie industry not only as a celebrated thespian, but also as a movie producer through her own film outfit S-R Productions which financed Visayan films in the 1950s to 1960s, and as an active member of the Movie and Television Review and Classification Board (MTRCB);

WHEREAS, her exemplary work in the enrichment of Philippine cinema was recognized by the Manunuri ng Pelikulang Pilipino when they bestowed her the Natatanging Gawad Urian Lifetime Achievement Award in 2019, and by the Film Development Council of the Philippines (FDCP) and the Society of Philippine Entertainment Editors (SPEEd) when they conferred upon her the Eddys Icon Award in 2021;

WHEREAS, her passion, impressive body of work and valuable contribution to the local movie landscape deserve recognition from the Philippine Senate;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate, to express profound sympathy and sincere condolences of the Senate of the Philippines on the death of veteran actress Gloria Sevilla, considered as the "Queen of Visayan movies," and honoring her contribution in Philippine cinema.
