RESOLUTION

URGING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE TO CONDUCT AN **BUDGETARY** LEGISLATION, ON THE OF INQUIRY, IN AID APPROPRIATIONS, AND THE EXPENDITURE AND IMPLEMENTATION INDUSTRIALIZATION GOVERNMENT'S THEREOF, OF THE EMPLOYMENT-GENERATION INITIATIVES, WITH THE END-VIEW OF DETERMINING THE FUNDING REQUIREMENTS FOR A MULTI-YEAR EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR BOLSTERING FILIPINO OR "TATAK PINOY" PRODUCTIVE SECTORS AND ENCOURAGING INCLUSIVE GROWTH ACROSS THE COUNTRY

WHEREAS, Article XII, Sec. 1 of the 1987 Constitution underscored that the broad goals of the national economy are to ensure the equitable distribution of opportunities, income, and wealth; achieve a sustained increase in the goods and services produced by the country; and expand productivity as the key mechanism for achieving prosperity and lifting the underprivileged from poverty;

WHEREAS, the same article and section also mandates the State to "promote industrialization and full employment based on sound agricultural development and agrarian reform, through industries that make full and efficient use of human and natural resources, and which are competitive in both domestic and foreign markets";

WHEREAS, effective governance entails curbing the underutilization of programmed funds and ensuring the optimization of assets through strategic planning, transparent stakeholder consultation and the efficient apportionment of scarce yet critical resources;

WHEREAS, the government's employment-generation and productivity-boosting initiatives include but are not limited to the following:

the Department of Trade and Industry's shared service facilities (SSF) initiative; support for the Foreign Trade Service Corps (FTSC) and the presence of Filipino micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in global markets; ongoing establishment of Negosyo Centers; continued implementation and improvement of such programs as the "One Town, One Product (OTOP)" and Go Lokal!; the launching of new programs such as "Digital Philippines" for training entrepreneurs about e-commerce and "Industry 4.0" which aims to prepare Philippine industries for future modes of production through the build-up and promotion of regional inclusive innovation centers (RIICs); and the implementation of Republic Act 11337, also known as the Innovative Startup Act, and Republic Act 11293, also known as the Philippine Innovation Act:

- the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority's implementation of the Special Training for Employment Program (STEP), the Training for Work Scholarship Program (TWSP), and Republic Act 11230 or the Tulong Trabaho Act, which provides for free post-secondary technical-vocational education across the country;
- the Commission on Higher Education's (CHED) implementation of the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act (RA 109321), which provides for free college tuition in all state universities and colleges (SUCs), and select local universities and colleges (LUCs);
- the Department of Labor and Employment's (DOLE) Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Disadvantaged or Displaced Workers (TUPAD) program, Government Internship Program (GIP), DOLE Integrated Livelihood Program (DLIP), and JobStart initiative, as well as its continuous engagement with and monitoring of the Public Employment Service Offices (PESOs) across all local government units (LGUs);
- the Department of Agriculture's (DA) banner programs for high value crops, livestock, fisheries and aquaculture, rice and other staples; its

- agribusiness incubation program; agripreneurship program; and the Young Farmers Program, among others;
- the Department of Information and Communications Technology's (DICT) initiatives in promoting ICT Literacy, and supporting ICT industry and countryside development, as well as ensuring nationwide connectivity through its programs on Free Internet Wi-Fi Connectivity in Public Places and implementation of the National Broadband Plan; and,
- the research and development (R&D) and technology transfer work of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), its attached research and development institutes (RDIs), the Philippine Space Agency (PSA) and the major sectoral planning councils—the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development (PCAARRD), the Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (PCHRD), and the Philippine Council for Industry, Energy and Emerging Technology Research and Development (PCIEERD);

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need to inventory the investments government plans to make in the next five to ten years for such intiatives, covering information technology and business process outsourcing (IT-BPO), tourism, creative industries, trade, manufacturing, agriculture and fisheries, logistics, shipping, research and development (R&D), and other productive sectors, and assess whether such investments are in line with the Constitutional mandate to promote industrialization and full employment; expand productivity; and sustain the increase in the goods and services produced by Filipino workers, craftsmen, artisans, creatives, entrepreneurs, professionals, scientists and researchers;

WHEREAS, such inventory and assessment may provide valuable inputs for the crafting of the 2023 General Appropriations Act and of future national budgets;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Senate of the Philippines, to urge the Senate Committee on Finance to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the budgetary appropriations, and the expenditure

- and implementation thereof, of the government's industrialization and employment-
- 2 generation initiatives, with the end-view of determining the funding requirements for
- 3 a multi-year expenditure plan for bolstering Filipino or "Tatak Pinoy" productive
- 4 sectors and encouraging inclusive growth across the country.
