AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7305 OR THE MAGNA CARTA FOR PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The 1987 Philippine Constitution, Article XIII, Section 3 thereof, states that:

"The State shall afford full protection to labor, local and overseas, organized and unorganized, and promote full employment and equality of employment opportunities for all. xxx"

With the global havoc made by the COVID-19 virus, health systems around the world continue to be challenged. No country, even the most powerful and rich ones, was prepared for the impact of the virus. Clearly, the pandemic tested the structure and competence of the health care systems around the world. Global responses to the COVID-19 pandemic has denuded the fundamental frailty and vulnerability of every health care system.

In the Philippines, we saw the weak, struggling, understaffed, underfunded healthcare system, and the burned out, exhausted and underpaid health care workers. It has opened our eyes to the root cause of the problem - the insufficient support of our government to the health care system.

The pandemic also revealed the shortage of health care workers and professionals, most specially in government hospitals. This is one of the impacts of the continuing flight of Filipino health care workers, which greatly affects our country's COVID-19 response. Many of our health care workers have left their profession and institution to seek greener opportunities abroad.

It is therefore the duty of this Congress to recognize the invaluable contributions of our public health care workers by compensating their hardwork, sacrifices and heroism. The proposed measure seeks to introduce several amendments to the 30-year old, Magna Carta of Public Health Workers, with the end view of promoting the rights of our health workers to better pay and benefits. In particular, this measure will increase the entry level salary of Medical Officer, nurse, dentist, midwife, medical technologist, physical therapist, occupational therapist, respiratory therapist, speech therapist, optometrist, pharmacist, and radiologic technologist. Furthermore, additional compensation and benefits will be given to all public health workers such as supplemental Special Risk Allowance (SRA), across the board hazard pay, rice subsidy allowance, increase in longevity pay, laundry and clothing allowance, and compensation for injuries.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. *Title.* – This Act shall be known as the **"Health Workers Salary Upgrading Act of 2022".**Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* – It is the declared policy of the State to guarantee the entry and retention of qualified and competent health workers in the public health

care system by ensuring the commensurate remuneration for their work loads and the hazards of their respective professions. This policy is in furtherance of the Constitutional mandate to promote the most adequate health care for the people by addressing the need for essential health workers and professionals in all public health

care facilities. This Act intends to improve the socio-economic conditions of public

health workers and to bolster the public health sector in the government service.

Sec. 3. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows:

"Sec. 3. [Definition] **COVERAGE**. – [For purposes of this Act, "health workers" shall mean all persons who are engaged in health and health-related work, and all persons employed in all hospitals, sanitaria, health infirmaries, health centers, rural health units, barangay health stations, clinics and other health-related

establishments owned and operated by the Government or its political subdivisions with original charters and shall include medical, allied health professional, administrative and support personnel employed regardless of their employment status."\" THIS ACT SHALL BE FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS, FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ACT. "HEALTH WORKERS" REFER TO PERSONS WHO ARE ENGAGED IN HEALTH AND HEALTH-RELATED WORK IN A HEALTH FACILITY OR OTHER RELATED ESTABLISHMENT, OWNED AND OPERATED BY THE GOVERNMENT OR ITS POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS. IT SHALL INCLUDE MEDICAL, ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONAL, **SUPPORT ADMINISTRATIVE** AND PERSONNEL INCLUDING MAINTENANCE, JANITORIAL AND SECURITY PERSONNEL OF SUCH HEALTH FACILITY OR RELATED **ESTABLISHMENT, REGARDLESS OF THEIR EMPLOYMENT** STATUS."

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Sec. 4. Section 19 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows:

"Sec. 19. Salaries. – [In the determination of the salary scale of public health workers, the provisions of Republic Act No. 6758 shall govern, except that the benchmark for Rural Health Physicians shall be upgraded to Grade 24.] THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT, IS HEREBY MANDATED TO ESTABLISH A NEW SALARY SCALE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS: PROVIDED, THAT THE BENCHMARK FOR MEDICAL OFFICER 1 SHALL BE SALARY GRADE 17, NURSE 1 SHALL BE SALARY GRADE 16, MIDWIFE 1 SHALL BE SALARY GRADE 15, MEDICAL TECHNOLOGIST 1 SHALL BE SALARY GRADE 12, PHARMACIST 1 SHALL BE SALARY GRADE 12,

1 PHYSICAL THERAPIST 1 SHALL BE SALARY GRADE 12, RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGIST 1 SHALL BE SALARY 2 3 GRADE 12, OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST 1 SHALL BE 4 SALARY GRADE 12, RESPIRATORY THERAPIST 1 SHALL 5 BE SALARY GRADE 11, SPEECH THERAPIST 1 SHALL BE SALARY GRADE 11 AND OPTOMETRIST 1 SHALL BE 6 7 **SALARY GRADE 13.** 8 xxx." 9 Sec. 5. Section 20 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna 10 Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows: "Sec. 20. Additional Compensation. - Notwithstanding Section 12 11 12 of Republic Act No. 6758 AND THE PROVISIONS OF 13 REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11466, public HEALTH workers shall 14 receive the following ADDITIONAL allowances: hazard 15 allowance, SPECIAL RISK ALLOWANCE, subsistence allowance, RICE SUBSIDY ALLOWANCE, longevity pay, 16 17 laundry AND CLOTHING allowance, and remote assignment allowance" 18 Sec. 6. Section 21 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna 19 Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows: 20 21 "Sec. 21. Hazard Allowance. - [Public health workers in hospitals, sanitaria, rural health units, main health centers, health 22 23 infirmaries, barangay health stations, clinics and other health-24 related establishments located in difficult areas, strife-torn or 25 embattled areas, distressed or isolated stations, prison camps, 26 mental hospitals, radiation-exposed clinics, laboratories or 27 disease infested areas or in areas declared under state of calamity 28 or emergency for the duration thereof which expose them to 29 great danger, contagion, radiation, volcanic activity/eruption, 30 occupational risk or perils to life as determined by the Secretary 31 of Health, shall be compensated hazard allowances equivalent to 32 at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the monthly basic salary of

1 health workers receiving salary grade 19 and below, and five 2 percent (5%) for health workers with salary grade 20 and above. 3 ALL PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS PERFORMING HEALTH AND HEALTH-RELATED WORK REGARDLESS OF WORK 4 5 LOCATION SHALL BE ENTITLED TO HAZARD ALLOWANCE 6 AMOUNTING TO FIVE THOUSAND PESOS (P5,000.00) PER MONTH: PROVIDED, THAT THIS RATE SHALL BE 7 **REVIEWED PERIODICALLY** 8 AND **INCREASED** 9 ACCORDINGLY BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH IN 10 CONSULTATION WITH THE APPROPRIATE GOVERNMENT 11 **AGENCIES."** 12 Sec. 7. A new Section 21-A shall be inserted after Section 21 of Republic Act 13 No. 7305 which shall read as follows: "SEC. 21-A. SPECIAL RISK ALLOWANCE, - PUBLIC 14 15 HEALTH WORKERS, WHERE THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES AND LOCATION 16 17 WORK EXPOSE THEM TO **GREAT** DANGER, 18 OCCUPATIONAL RISKS, PERIL TO LIFE, AND PHYSICAL 19 HARDSHIPS, IN AREAS AND CIRCUMSTANCES AS 20 DETERMINED BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH, SHALL BE 21 ENTITLED TO SPECIAL RISK ALLOWANCE OF AT LEAST 22 FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) OF THE MONTHLY BASIC SALARY." 23 24 Sec. 8. Section 22 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna 25 Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows: "Sec. 22. Subsistence Allowance. - Public health workers who are 26 27 required to render service within OR NEAR the premises of 28 [hospitals, sanitaria, health infirmaries, main health centers, rural 29 health units and barangay health stations, or clinics, and other 30 health-related establishments | HEALTH FACILITIES AND 31 OTHER RELATED ESTABLISHMENTS in order to make their 32 services available at any and all times, shall be entitled to full

14	HEALTH WORKERS SHALL BE ENTITLED TO RICE
15	SUBSIDY ALLOWANCE IN THE FORM OF CASH
16	AMOUNTING TO ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY
17	PESOS (P1,250.00).
18	Sec. 10. Section 23 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna
19	Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows:
20	"Section 23. Longevity Pay A monthly longevity pay equivalent
21	to five percent (5%) of the monthly basic pay shall be paid to a
22	health worker for every five (5) years of continuous, efficient and
23	meritorious services rendered as certified by the chief of office
24	concerned, commencing with the service after the approval of
25	this Act.: PROVIDED, THAT FOR EVERY TEN (10) YEARS OF
26	SERVICE, THEY SHALL BE ENTITLED TO SPECIAL
27	LONGEVITY PAY AMOUNTING TO ONE (1) MONTH OF
28	BASIC SALARY."
29	Sec. 11. Section 24 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna
30	Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows:
31	"Section 24. Laundry AND CLOTHING Allowance All public
32	health workers who are required to wear uniforms regularly shall

be entitled to laundry **AND CLOTHING** allowance equivalent to [One hundred twenty-five pesos (P125.00)] **FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (P500.00)** per month: provided, that this rate shall be reviewed periodically and increased accordingly by the Secretary of Health in consultation with the appropriate government agencies concerned taking into account existing laws and prevailing practices."

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Sec. 12. Section 28 of Republic Act No. 7305, otherwise known as the "Magna Carta for Public Health Workers" is hereby amended as follows:

"Section 28. *Compensation for Injuries*. – Public health workers shall be protected against the consequences of employment injuries in accordance with existing law. Injuries incurred while doing overtime work shall be presumed work-connected.

NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LAW TO THE CONTRARY, PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS WHO MAY BE INJURED OR CONTRACT ANY DISEASE WHILE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES SHALL BE ENTITLED TO AN AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P100,000.00): PROVIDED, THAT THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION PESOS (P1,000,000.00) SHALL BE GIVEN TO PUBLIC HEALTH **WORKERS WHO MAY DIE WHILE IN THE PERFORMANCE** OF THEIR **DUTY:** PROVIDED, FURTHER, ENTITLEMENT TO **COMPENSATION** UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT PRECLUDE PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS TO CLAIM ANY OTHER BENEFITS FOR THE SAME INJURY PROVIDED FOR BY OTHER LAWS."

Sec. 13. Free Continuing Professional Development. – The Department of Health shall provide free Continuing Professional Development training for public health worker professionals who are required to undertake such program as a requirement for the renewal of their professional identification cards under the

1	regulation of Professional Regulatory Commission as mandated by Republic Act No
2	10912 or the "Continuing Professional Development Act of 2016".

Sec. 14. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The Secretary of Health after consultation with appropriate agencies of the Government as well as professional and health workers' organizations or unions, shall formulate and prepare the revised implementing rules and regulation of the Magna Carta for Public Health Workers in accordance with this Act.

Sec. 15. *Separability Clause.* – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby shall remain in force and effect.

Sec. 16. *Repealing Clause.* - All other laws, decrees, executive orders and rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Sec. 17. *Effectivity* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in one (1) newspaper of general circulation.
