AN ACT

ALLOWING FOR VOTER REGISTRATION AND VOTING BY MAIL OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS, AND VOTING BY OVERSEAS FILIPINO WORKERS AND SEAFARERS, FURTHER AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9189, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "OVERSEAS ABSENTEE VOTING ACT OF 2003," AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10590, OR THE "OVERSEAS VOTING ACT OF 2013," APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Explanatory Note

The right of suffrage is every Filipino's birthright. It is a constitutionally protected right accorded to citizens of a State. Article V, Section 2 of the 1987 Constitution enjoins the Congress to provide a system for absentee voting by qualified Filipinos abroad.

For many years since the ratification of the 1987 Constitution, however, Filipinos situated overseas were disenfranchised. There was no mechanism allowing them to register and cast their votes. It was only in 2003 that the Philippine Congress was able to enact a legislation that allowed millions of overseas Filipinos to vote.

The 12th Congress enacted Republic Act No. 9189, otherwise known as the "Overseas Absentee Voting Act of 2003," ("R.A. No. 9189"). This was amended by

R.A. No. 10590, or "The Overseas Voting Act of 2013," which was enacted during the 15th Congress in 2013. Section 3(k) of R.A. 9189, as amended, defines "overseas voting" as the process by which qualified citizens of the Philippines abroad exercise their right to vote.

Our overseas voting law recognize and promote the right of suffrage of Filipinos overseas. However, despite existing law and millions of budgetary appropriations granted for this purpose, data shows a historically low voter turnout for overseas voters in prior elections.

Based on the data provided by the Office of Overseas Voting (the "OFOV"), the following factors contribute to low voter turnout: (a) accessibility by in-person voters to embassy, consulate, or polling centers; (b) in the case of postal voting, inaccuracy in the postal address of overseas voters resulting in ballots being returned to posts; (c) strict work conditions imposed on overseas Filipinos, limiting their time and movement to either mail their ballots or go to polling centers; and (d) failure of overseas voters to send the absentee ballot to ensure timely receipt by the election officials within the one-month voting period.

Clearly, existing laws and regulations present gaps in the voting process that hinder overseas Filipinos from fully participating in elections. These gaps should be addressed for overseas Filipinos, especially seafarers, to be accorded the full blessing of Filipino citizenship – to choose their leaders. To prevent voting disenfranchisement and further encourage exercise of their right of suffrage, this bill expands existing voting methods available for overseas Filipinos.

In view of the foregoing, the urgent approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 1 of the Republic Act No. 9189, as amended by Republic 10 Act No. 10590, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "SECTION 1. *Short Title.* This Act shall be known as "The Overseas Voting Act of **2022** [2013]."
- SEC. 2. New Sections 3(s), 3(t), and 3(u) of the same Act, as amended, are hereby inserted to read as follows:
- 15 "SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. For purposes of this Act:

OTHER PURPOSES

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"(S) POSTAL VOTING REFERS TO A MODE OF VOTING WHERE MAILING PACKETS CONTAINING OFFICIAL BALLOTS AND OTHER ELECTION PARAPHERNALIA ARE SENT DIRECTLY TO THE VOTERS OR DIRECTLY TO THE POST FROM THE COMMISSION AND SENT BACK TO ELECTION OFFICERS BY MAIL.

- "(T) ELECTRONIC VOTING REFERS TO A MODE OF VOTING THAT USES ELECTRONIC MEANS, INCUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ELECTRONIC MAIL, WEB-BASED PORTALS, AND OTHER INTERNET-BASED TECHNOLOGY, TO RECEIVE ABSENTEE BALLOTS AND CAST VOTES THEREON.
- "(U) SEAFARER VOTING REFERS TO A MODE OF VOTING BY WHICH SHIP OFFICERS AND RATINGS MANNING SHIPS, INCLUDING OFFSHORE WORKERS, SERVICE PROVIDERS, AND FISHERMEN, WHO ARE REGISTERED OVERSEAS VOTERS, MAY CAST THEIR BALLOTS DURING THE VOTING PERIOD THROUGH POSTAL OR ELECTRONIC MEANS."
- **SEC. 3.** Section 6 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
 - "SEC. 6. [Personal] Overseas Registration and/or Certification. Registration and/or certification as an overseas voter shall be done EITHER in person at any post abroad or at designated registration centers outside the post or in the Philippines approved by the Commission OR BY MAIL OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION, AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE METHOD OF TRANSMISSION DESIGNATED BY THE OVERSEAS VOTER DURING REGISTRATION.

"Field and mobile registration centers shall be set up by the posts concerned to ensure accessibility by the overseas voters. **HOWEVER, IN TIMES OF NATIONAL OR PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS, THE COMMISSION**

IS AUTHORIZED TO SUSPEND REGISTRATION IN PERSON TO PRIORITIZE SAFE ALTERNATIVE METHODS THEREFOR.

"[All applicants shall submit themselves for live capture of their biometrics.] THE COMMISSION, THROUGH THE OFOV, SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DEPARTMENT OF MIGRANT WORKERS, DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT, AND OTHER RELEVANT GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TO OBTAIN BIOMETRICS OF OVERSEAS VOTERS, PROVIDED THAT THE BIOMETRICS DATA WILL ONLY BE USED FOR REGISTRATION PURPOSES; PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT OVERSEAS VOTERS' DATA PRIVACY RIGHTS SHALL REMAIN PROTECTED.

"The Commission shall issue an overseas voter identification card to those whose applications to vote have been approved EITHER IN PERSON, BY MAIL, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION."

SEC. 4. Section 10 of the same Act, as amended is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 10. Transfer of Registration Record. - In the event of change of voting venue, an application for transfer of registration record must be filed IN PERSON, BY MAIL, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION by the overseas voter with the OFOV, through its Chairperson, at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the start of the overseas voting period: Provided, That those who would eventually vote in the Philippines should register within the time frame provided for local registration in the municipality, city or district where they intend to vote: Provided, further, That those who have registered in the municipality, city or district where they resided prior to their departure abroad need not register anew; Provided, finally, That transferees shall notify the OFOV, through its Chairperson, of their transfer back to the Philippines at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the next national elections for

3	SEC. 5. Section 12 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended

SEC. 9. A new Section 25-A of the same Act, as amended, is hereby inserted to read as follows:

"SEC. 25-A. *VOTING BY SEAFARERS.* – SEAFARERS SITUATED OVERSEAS AT THE TIME OF THE ELECTIONS MAY VOTE BY PERSON, POSTAL VOTING, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION.

"THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT GUIDELINES ON VOTING PROCEDURES FOR SEAFARERS AND OTHER SEA-BASED OVERSEAS FILIPINO WORKERS AND SECURE THEIR RIGHT TO VOTE, WITHOUT REQUIRING THEM TO GO TO THE DESIGNATED VOTING CENTER FROM THE NEAREST PORT."

SEC. 10. Section 32 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 32. *Information Campaign.* - The Commission, in coordination with agencies concerned, shall undertake an information campaign to educate the public on the manner of overseas voting for qualified overseas voters. It may require the support and assistance of the DFA, through the posts, the DOLE, the [Department of Transportation and Communications (DOTC),] THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY (DICT), THE NATIONAL PRIVACY COMMISSION (NPC), the Philippine Postal Corporation (PPC), [the POEA,] the OWWA and the Commission on Filipinos Overseas.

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SEC. 11. Section 34 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 34. Assistance from Government Agencies. - All government officers, particularly from the DFA, the DOLE, the [DOTC,] THE DMW, THE DICT, THE NPC, the PPC, [the POEA,] the OWWA, the Commission on Filipinos Overseas and other government offices concerned with the welfare of the Filipinos overseas shall, to the extent compatible with their primary responsibilities, assist the Commission in carrying out the provisions of this Act. All such agencies or officers thereof shall take reasonable measures to expedite all election activities, which the Commission shall require of them. When necessary, the Commission may send supervisory teams headed by career officers to assist the posts.

SEC. 12. Section 36 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 36. *Prohibited Acts.* – In addition to the prohibited acts provided by law, it shall be unlawful:

- 3 SEC. 17. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
- 4 after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of
- 5 general circulation.
