A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY IN AID OF LEGISLATION ON THE RECURRENT BROWNOUTS EXPERIENCED BY OCCIDENTAL MINDORO ELECTRIC CONSUMERS

WHEREAS, under Presidential Decree No. (PD) 269 or the National Electrification Administration Decree, it is the policy of the State to pursue total electrification in the country. In pursuing this objective, the State "shall promote, encourage and assist all public service entities engaged in supplying electric service, particularly electric cooperatives", 1

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9136, otherwise known as the Electric Power Industry Reform Act of 2001 (EPIRA) states that it is the policy of the State "to ensure the quality, reliability, security and affordability of the supply of electric power". Hence, in pursuing total electrification in their respective franchise areas, electric cooperatives must also ensure that it delivers a reliable and dependable electricity to its consumers;

WHEREAS the 2016 Philippine Distribution Code mandates the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) to impose a uniform system of recording and reporting of Distribution Reliability performance.³ It provides that system average interruptions frequency index (SAIFI) which measures "how often the average Customer experiences a Sustained Interruption over a predefined period of time" and system

2	Interruption for the average Customer during a predefined period of time" shall be
3	imposed on all distribution utilities in the country; ⁵
4	WHEREAS, Occidental Mindoro Electric Cooperative Inc. (OMECO) is the electric
5	cooperative servicing the franchise area of Occidental Mindoro with total of 240,887
6	households connections;6
7	WHEREAS, as of December 31, 2021, ORMECO's unscheduled SAIFI of 18.33
8	interruptions per year is compliant with NEA's standards of 25 interruptions per year.
9	Moreover, ORMECO's SAIDI of 1,026.85 minutes per year is compliant with the NEA's
0	standards of 2,700 minutes per year. However, despite these EC's compliance with
1	the regulatory standards, there are clamors from Occidental Mindoro electric
12	consumers for alleged persistent brownouts they experience in the area;
13	WHEREAS, it is important to address the problem on power interruptions
14	experienced by Occidental Mindoro electric consumers to protect the consumers from
15	losses attributed to power outages;
16	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to direct the
17	appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry in aid of legislation on the
18	recurrent brownouts experienced by Occidental Mindoro electric consumers.
