AN ACT REORGANIZING THE NATIONAL COUNCIL ON DISABILITY AFFAIRS INTO THE NATIONAL COMMISSION ON DISABILITY AFFAIRS, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Created in 1981, the National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA) is the lead government agency tasked with program development for persons with disabilities (PWDs), and the delivery of services to the sector. As defined under the Republic Act No. 7277, or the Magna Carta for Disabled Persons, PWDs are "those suffering from restriction of different abilities, as a result of a mental, physical or sensory impairment, to perform an activity in the manner or within the range considered normal for a human being."

Based on the 2010 Census of Population and Housing, 1.443 million Filipinos or 1.57% of the household population of 92.1 million have a disability. It goes on to show that for every five PWDs, one or 18.9% was aged 0 to 14 years, three or 59% were aged 15 to 64 years, and one or 22.1% was aged 65 years and over.

This bill seeks to reorganize the National Council on Disability Affairs into a National Commission on Disability Affairs and institutionalize the agency's mandate of addressing the needs and concerns of our PWDs. Under the bill, representatives from other national government agencies such as the Department of Health, Department of Social Welfare and Development, Department of Education, Technical Education and Skills Development Authority and Commission on Higher Education shall sit as members of the Commission, together with representatives from the private sector. The Commission shall also have Regional Director for every region who shall oversee and supervise activities of the Persons with Disability Affairs Office established by the LGUs. This is envisioned to better equip the Commission in data collection, needs identification and policy formulation for the benefit of the PWDs from all over the country. With the proper support and assistance, we believe that they can be integrated and empowered to be productive citizens of this nation.

In view of the foregoing, the approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "National Commission
 on Disability Affairs Act."

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SEC. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* - The State recognizes that persons with disabilities are part of Philippine society and are thus entitled to the same rights as other people. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to support, protect, and promote the rights of persons with disabilities. Towards this end, the State shall establish a National Commission on Disability Affairs to formulate policies and coordinate activities for persons with disabilities.

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SEC. 3. National Commission on Disability Affairs. - There is hereby created
 a National Commission on Disability Affairs, hereinafter referred to as the Commission. It
 shall be attached to the Office of the President.

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SEC. 4. *Mandate.* - The Commission shall be the national government agency to formulate policies and coordinate activities of all agencies, whether public or private, concerning disability issues and concerns. It shall be the lead agency tasked to steer the course of program development for persons with disabilities and the delivery of services to the sector. SEC. 5. *Powers and Functions*. - The Commission shall exercise the following
 powers and functions to carry out its mandate:

- (a) Prepare and adopt an integrated and comprehensive long-term National
 Rehabilitation Plan, which will ensure the formulation and implementation of
 programs and projects to promote the rehabilitation self-reliance, and
 development of persons with disabilities;
- (b) Conduct consultative meetings and prepare symposia with all stakeholders, and
 undertake program evaluation and monitoring to ensure that comprehensive,
 relevant and timely programs and services are adequate and accessible to persons
 with disabilities;
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- (c) Identify and immediately address gaps in the implementation of programs and
 laws benefitting persons with disabilities, especially the Magna Carta for Disabled
 Persons, as amended;
- (d) Formulate strategic interventions and provide an expeditious response to address
 the immediate concerns of persons with disabilities;
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- (e) Propose new policies and new legislation, or amendments to existing ones, that
 will ensure the attainment of its objectives;
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- (f) Act as overall coordinating body to rationalize the functions and activities of
 government agencies, private entities, and international organizations operating in
 the Philippines, and the enforcement of laws related to and affecting persons with
 disabilities;
- (g) Establish, develop, and maintain a data bank on disabilities in partnership with
 concerned government agencies and non-government organizations and
 strengthen the referral services to ensure availability of data to stakeholders and
 services to persons with disabilities including provision of assistive devices;

- (h) Act as a national consultative and advisory body to the President on matters within
 its competence;
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1	(i) Facilitate the conduct of fund-raising activities and formulate innovative schemes
2	to ensure funding support for major activities for the sector;
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4	(j) Educate and reorient the general public in its attitude and thinking with regards to
5	persons with disabilities;
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7	(k) Submit quarterly reports to the Congress.
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9	SEC. 6. Composition The Commission shall be composed of the following
10	members:
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12	(a) A Chairperson who shall be appointed by the President;
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14	(b) The Secretaries of the following Departments who shall sit in the Commission as
15	ex-officio members: Department of Health (DOH), Department of Social Welfare
16	and Development (DSWD), Department of Education (DepEd), Technical
17	Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and Commission on Higher
18	Education (CHED).
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20	The Secretaries mentioned are authorized to designate an Undersecretary to

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9	SEC. 7. Chairperson The Chairperson who shall be appointed by the President,

31	SEC. 8. Executive Director The Chairperson shall be assisted by an Executive
32	Director, who shall be appointed by the Chairperson. The Executive Director shall have
33	the following duties and responsibilities:
34	(a) Administer the affairs of the Commission;
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36	(b) Implement policies, plans, and programs approved by the Commission;

- (c) Exercise direct supervision and control over all the organizational units placed
 under his/her jurisdiction including recommending to the Chairperson the
 appointment of personnel of the Commission and disciplinary actions as may be
 necessary for the effective management of the Commission;
- (d) Represent the Commission in administrative and legislative bodies and in
 conferences and seminars that require the participation of the Commission;
- (e) Prepare and submit to the Commission the annual report on the operations of the
 Commission and such other reports as may be required by the Commission; and
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- (f) Perform such other functions as may be provided by law.
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15 **SEC. 9.** *Deputy Executive Directors.* - The Executive Director shall be assisted 16 by two Deputies: a Deputy Executive Director for Administration and a Deputy Executive 17 Director for Operations. The Deputy Executive Directors shall be appointed by the 18 Chairperson.

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SEC. 10. *Qualifications.* - No person shall be appointed Chairperson, Executive Director, or Deputy Executive Director of the Commission unless he or she is a citizen and resident of the Philippines, of good moral character, of proven integrity, and with at least seven (7) years of competence and expertise in delivering service to persons with disabilities.

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SEC. 11. *Regional Directors.* - The Commission shall have one Regional Director for every region who shall supervise the official activities of all provinces, cities, and municipalities under the jurisdiction of the concerned region. He/she shall be the primary coordinating and overseeing authority over the Persons with Disability Affairs Office (PDAO) established by local government units (LGUs). The Regional Director may be assisted by one (1) Assistant Regional Director. The Regional Director shall have, within their respective administrative regions, the following functions:

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(a) Implement laws, policies, plans, programs, projects, rules, and regulations of the
 Commission;

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1 2 (b) Provide efficient and effective service to the people;

- (c) Coordinate with regional offices of other departments, offices, and agencies;
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(d) Coordinate with the LGUs and their PDAOs; and

(e) Perform such other functions as may be provided by law or assigned by the Chairperson.

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SEC. 12. Sectoral and Industry Task Forces. - The Commission may create 10 sectoral and industry task forces, technical working groups, advisory bodies, or 11 committees for the furtherance of its objectives. Additional private sector representatives, 12 such as from the academe, civil society organizations, and federation of private industries 13 directly involved with persons with disabilities, as well as representatives of other LGUs 14 and government-owned and -controlled corporations (GOCCs) may be appointed to these 15 working groups. Government disability affairs professionals may also be tapped to partake 16 in the work of the Commission through these working groups. 17

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19 SEC. 13. *Structure and Staffing Pattern.* - Subject to the approval of the 20 Department of Budget and Management (DBM), the Commission shall determine its 21 organizational structure and create new divisions or units as it may deem necessary, and 22 shall appoint officers and employees of the Commission in accordance with the civil 23 service law, rules, and regulations.

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SEC. 14. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. - Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA), Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and other relevant government agencies, shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

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31 **SEC. 15.** *Appropriations.* - The funds needed to initially implement this Act shall 32 be included in the current fiscal year's appropriation of the National Council on Disability 33 Affairs. Thereafter, the amount needed for the operation and maintenance of the 34 Commission shall be included in the General Appropriations Act.

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SEC. 16. Separability Clause. - Should any provision herein be declared
 unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this Act.
 SEC. 17. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations or
 other issuances or parts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed
 or modified accordingly.

8 **SEC. 18.** *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 9 publication in the Official Gazette or in any two (2) newspapers of general circulation in 10 the Philippines.
