

## RESOLUTION

## CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING THE OUTSTANDING YOUNG MEN (TOYM) 2021 AWARDEES

WHEREAS, The Outstanding Young Men (TOYM) Awards seeks to recognize the outstanding achievement of young Filipinos between the ages of 18 to 40 years old, who achieved professional excellence and have resulted to positive changes in the nation;

WHEREAS, the TOYM Awards is an annual search of the Junior Chamber International (JCI) Philippines and supported by the PLDT Home, Smart Communications, Metro Pacific Investments Corporation, KPMG, Gerry Roxas Foundation, Inc., and TOYM Foundation, Inc.;

WHEREAS, since 1959, the TOYM developed a reputation for its selectiveness of outstanding young active citizens – totalling 520 by now – upon whom the award is conferred;

WHEREAS, with the theme "Everyday Leaders Enabling Extraordinary Impact", the TOYM 2021 Awards recognizes the best ten (10) Honorees, who, despite the challenges they faced during the COVID-19 pandemic, have brought exemplary service to others, exuded excellence, shown outstanding leadership and made significant contributions to the country;

WHEREAS, Ariestelo A. Asilo, the TOYM Honoree for Social Entrepreneurship is a co-founder of Varacco and pioneer of the COFFEE (Coffee-based Farming and Entrepreneurship Engagement) program as inner core for Nutrition Entrepreneurship business model. He also helped organize a leading NGO in the country Stop Hunger Now Philippines (now Rise Against Hunger), founded the Peace Corps Scholars and Alumni Association, and helped secure the funding for the farm to market road of Lobo, Batangas under the Philippine Rural Development Program through his pioneering NGO— MindMap (now ThinkFarm);

WHEREAS, Iloisa Romaraog-Diga, the TOYM Honoree for Agricultural Entrepreneurship, is the founder of Session Groceries app which provides the

community access to fresh and home-grown produce from the convenience of their homes;

WHEREAS, Eleazar Abraham 'Abe' L. Orobia, the TOYM Honoree for Education and Culture, is a multi-awarded artist, educator, independent curator and cultural advocate. In 2018 he worked as the head facilitator of Art Workshops for Indigenous People (IP) Elementary teachers from different parts of the Philippines. He also created a Bas relief mural of Basi Revolt in the municipality of San Ildefonso, Ilocos Sur. In 2017, Orobia was one of the 5 artists who worked on mural re-interpretation of the famous Bahay Nakpil-Bautista. It was sold and all proceeds are donated for the reconstruction and preservation of the said historical site. In 2021 held a solo show at the National Commission for Culture and the Arts titled 'IMAGES OF OUR NATION' inspired by the situations in the height of pandemic. Orobia championed the following through ink drawing and poetry: plight of medical workers, food supply through agriculture and aquaculture, OFWs, maritime disputes, faith and resiliency in crises and the effects of community pantry. Orobia is also a contributor at Artplus magazine;

WHEREAS, Anna R. Oposa, the TOYM Honoree Environment, Marine Conservation, is the Executive Director and Chief Mermaid of Save Philippine Seas. Oposa has been at the forefront of projects and campaigns in shark conservation, waste management, and environmental education. Her work has contributed to raising the profile of marine conservation in mainstream and social media, national and local legislation, and empowering youth and communities to take action on environmental issues;

WHEREAS, Jayeel S. Cornelio, the TOYM Honoree for Phd Education and Sociology, is a leading sociologist religion in the Philippines widely known for his brave and extensive research on youth, politics, and religious life. Dr. Cornelio, Associate Professor of Development Studies and Associate Dean of Research and Creative Work at the Atened de Manila University, conducts innovative research on how religion is changing in Philippine society and how it affects different aspects of social life including people's political attitudes and young people's moral worldviews. He is best known for his wide-ranging scholarship which covers topics such as: Christianity and the war on drugs, fundamentalism and the struggle for gender equality, and young people in post-conflict Marawi;

WHEREAS, Maria Yzabell Angel V. Palma, the TOYM Honoree for Science and Technology, is an inventor and founder of AirDisc Cooling Technologies which has garnered awards from topnotch international inventors' competitions and was endorsed by the International Federation of Inventors' Associations as the 'timely response to global warming. Palma's main goal is to be an inventor for humanity, creating solutions that will do away with present and future challenges of our world;

WHEREAS, Jaime Alfonso M. Aherrera, the TOYM Honoreee for Medicine/Cardiology, is a multi-awarded, board-topnotcher, cardiologist-epidemiologist-academician, and health advocate who has been using his knowledge to educate the

community, specifically about the early recognition of cardiac diseases. His researches focusing on heart diseases paved the way for improvement in the earlier "heart attack pathways" of the UP-Philippine General Hospital (UP-PGH); and when the COVID-19 pandemic struck, collaborative groups were formed to provide useful data in dealing with this pandemic. His brainchild, the IM Platinum Textbook series for Internal Medicine, has now reached and helped thousands of medical students and young specialists nationwide;

 WHEREAS, Lou Sabrina S. Ongkiko, the TOYM Honoree for Education / Academe, is a muti-awarded public school teacher who has been working with different partner organizations to create programs and activities that help students, teachers, parents, and the community especially during the pandemic. These include the COVID-19 Comics for Children, two radio programs to reach students and teachers, and piloting Facebook Messenger classes with AHA! Learning Center. Teacher Sab is also an advocate for quality STEM Education and was instrumental in setting up the Center for Integration STEM (CISTEM) with Unilab Foundation and the University of the Philippines College of Education;

WHEREAS, Jaemark S. Tordecilla, the TOYM Honoree for Digital Journalism, is the current head of Digital Media at GMA News and Public Affairs who helped the department thrive in the digital 21st century. He spearheaded the development and launch of the Cover Stories platform for GMA News Online, which has published long form multimedia stories that have been recognized for numerous awards. He conceptualized and oversees the network's Digital Video Lab, which has launched a portfolio of online programs including the The Howie Severino Podcast, The Mangahas Interviews, Stand for Truth, and Need To Know, designed to keep viewers informed and engaged, wherever they may be around the world;

WHEREAS, Melvin J. Sanicas, the TOYM Honoree for Science/ Medicine, is a world-renowned Filipino physician-scientist who organized and launched in 2014 the Collaboration for Tuberculosis Vaccine Discovery (CTVD), an international network of over 80 institutions dedicated to fostering collaboration in TB vaccine discovery. With his expertise in vaccinology, mobile health, health information technology, and digital communications, Dr. Sanicas is the only Filipino digital health expert for the World Health Organization (2019), health data expert for Facebook (2020), and digital strategy advisor of the Infectious Disease Society of America (2021);

WHEREAS, the Senate, as an expression of its support to the youth and nation-building, joins the JCI Philippines in recognizing and honouring the TOYM Awardees for 2021;
