AN ACT ADJUSTING THE MONTHLY PENSION AND DISABILITY BENEFITS OF RETIREES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Our Philippine diplomats have always been at the frontlines, to the extent that many have even risked their lives in the countries where they have been assigned. They are primarily responsible for assisting our *kababayan* abroad, even responding to their needs during critical times and crises. They are also tasked to advance Philippine diplomatic relations through the three pillars of diplomacy, namely: (1) the preservation and enhancement of national security; (2) the promotion and attainment of economic security; and (3) the protection of rights and the promotion of the interest of all Filipinos overseas.

Cognizant of the complex responsibilities faced by our foreign service personnel, it is but fitting to provide them with decent benefits, most especially upon retirement, thus compensating them for their patriotism and the hard work they have rendered throughout their career.

This bill thus seeks to adjust the monthly pension and disability benefits of retirees of the Department of Foreign Affairs in order to provide them with adequate

support to afford a decent living, to be at par with the current pay scale enjoyed by those who are currently in active service.

In view of the foregoing, immediate approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Republic of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section. 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Foreign Affairs 2 Retirement and Disability Benefits Act of 2022". 3 Sec. 2. Coverage. - This Act shall apply to all retired officers and employees of 4 the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) who: 5 (a) served in the Department for at least 15 years; and (b) are eligible to receive a monthly pension from the Government Service 6 7 Insurance System (GSIS). 8 All other officers and employees of the DFA who have also retired after serving 9 in the Department but who have not complied with all the above mentioned 10 requirements shall be covered by applicable benefits under Republic Act No. 8291, 11 otherwise known as the "Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) Act of 1997", as 12 amended. Sec. 3. Adjustment of Monthly Pension. - The monthly pension benefits of all 13 14 retirees of the DFA, as provided under Republic Act No. 7157, otherwise known as 15 the "Philippine Foreign Service Act of 1991", shall be automatically adjusted at the same 16 rate as any future or subsequent increase in the salary grade of the same rank they 17 retired from.

Sec. 4. *Additional Entitlements.* – All officers and employees covered by Section 2 of this Act shall be eligible for disability and death benefits in the same manner provided under the GSIS Act, as amended, and other relevant laws.

Sec. 5. Retroactive Effect. – The benefits under this Act shall also be granted to all retirees of the DFA who retired prior to the effectivity of this Act in the same manner provided in Section 2 hereof.

Sec. 6. Survivorship Benefits. – In case of death of a DFA retiree or personnel who has met the requirements provided in Section 2, the following shall be entitled to receive the adjusted retirement benefits that the deceased was receiving or entitled to receive: (a) their surviving dependent spouse, during their lifetime, or until they remarry; and (b) dependent children. Said benefits shall be distributed or apportioned in accordance with the GSIS Act, as amended.

Sec. 7. Appropriation and Funding Source. – The differential funding requirements for the initial implementation of this Act shall be sourced from any available savings of the DFA.

Thereafter, the annual differential amount necessary for GSIS to pay the adjusted monthly pension and other benefits to implement the provisions of this Act shall be included in the General Appropriations Act annually, to be sourced possibly from the DFA's annual consular income as a percentage thereof.

Sec. 8. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – Within ninety (90) days after the effectivity of this Act, the DFA shall issue the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act, in coordination with relevant government agencies.

Sec. 9. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions or parts thereof not otherwise affected shall remain in full force and effect.

Sec. 10. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, executive orders, or rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

Sec. 11. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication either in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
