AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS REPUBLIC ACT NUMBER SEVEN THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND FIVE (R.A. 7305) OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MAGNA CARTA OF PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Section 18 Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State affirms labor as a primary social economic force. It shall protect the rights of workers and promote their welfare.

The passage of Republic Act No 7305, otherwise known as the Magna Carta of Public Health Workers, which primarily aims to promote and improve the social and economic well-being, the working and living conditions and the terms of employment, among others, of our public health workers, was already a great accomplishment.

However, with our recent experience with the COVID-19 pandemic and with the challenges we face with the worsening inflation, said legislation has to be amended with the primary intention of further increasing the salary, allowances and benefits received by the country's public health workers.

This bill seeks to provide for an Expanded Magna Carta for Public Health Workers by expanding the coverage of what a public health worker is. It also provides

for a competitive salary by increasing the entry level salary for all government physicians and nurses and by establishing a new salary scale in accordance with the Salary Standardization Law. This bill also intends to provide expanded benefits for our public health workers by providing them with Special Risk Allowance, Rice Subsidy Allowance, Clothing Allowance and an increase in their current Subsistence Allowance and Monthly Hazard Pay.

Moreover, this bill also provides for a Loss of Earnings Benefit as a protection to our public health workers who suffer injury, illness or quarantine as a consequence of the performance of their duty. More importantly, this bill also provides that the funding necessary to carry out these provisions be taken from the income derived from the implementation of the Sin Tax Law.

Furthermore, the fine in the penal provision has been increased and any act of violation, circumvention or evasion in the provision of benefits to the public health worker will be met with administrative and civil sanctions, among others, as what other penalties in other appropriate laws may provide.

This legislative measure is a consolidation of related proposals filed in the 18th Congress in the House of Representatives which seek to amend RA 7305 with the end in view of promoting the welfare of our public health workers.

In order for the state to protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health-consciousness among them, and to adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development, we must take very good care of our public physicians, nurses, health workers and health care providers. These public health workers have saved our peoples' lives during the onslaught of the CoVid19 pandemic and they will continue saving Filipino lives, with or without health crisis or emergencies. They deserve to be well compensated and remunerated for the heroic role they fulfill every day.

Hence, passage of this important measure is earnestly sought.

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AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS REPUBLIC ACT NUMBER SEVEN THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND FIVE (R.A. 7305) OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MAGNA CARTA OF PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

| 1 | Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Expanded Magna Carta |

| 10 | Sec. 3. Section 3 of Republic Act Number Seven Thousand Three Hundred and |
| 11 | Five (RA 7305) otherwise known as the "Magna Carta of Public Health Workers" is |

| 13 | "Section. 3. [Definition] COVERAGE. [For purposes of |
| 14 | this Act, "health workers' shall mean all persons who are |
| 15 | engaged in health and health-related work, and all persons- |

employed in all hospitals, sanitaria, health infirmaries, health 1 centers, rural-health-units, barangay health stations, clinics-2 and other health-related establishments owned and operated 3 by the Government or its political subdivisions with original 4 chargers and shall include medical, allied health professional, 5 administrative support personnel employed regardless of their 6 employment status." THIS ACT SHALL BE FOR THE 7 BENEFIT OF ALL PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS. FOR 8 PURPOSES OF THIS ACT, "HEALTH WORKERS" SHALL 9 REFER TO PERSONS WHO ARE ENGAGED IN HEALTH 10 AND HEALTH-RELATED WORK IN ALL HEALTH 11 FACILITY OR OTHER RELATED ESTABLISHMENT 12 13 **OWNED AND OPERATED BY THE GOVERNMENT OR ITS** POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS, INCLUDING MEDICAL 14 AND ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS, ANCILLARY 15 AND ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL OF SUCH HEALTH 16 FACILITY OR RELATED ESTRABLISHMENT, 17 **REGARDLESS OF THEIR EMPLOYMENT STATUS."** 18

19 Sec. 4. Section 19 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 19. Salaries, - In the determination of the 20 salary scale of public health workers, the provisions of 21 Republic Act No. 6758 shall govern, except that the 22 benchmark for Rural Health Physicians shall be upgraded to 23 grade [24]. " THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH) IN 24 CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET 25 AND MANAGEMENT, IS HEREBY MANDATED TO 26 ESTABLISH A NEW SALARY SCALE FOR PUBLIC 27 HEALTH WORKERS FOLLOWING THE SALARY GRADES 28 **UNDER REPUBLIC ACT 1466, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS** 29 THE 'SALARY STANDARDIZATION LAW OF 2019.' 30 PROVIDED THAT THE ENTRY LEVEL SALARY FOR ALL 31 **GOVERNMENT MEDICAL DOCTORS SHALL BE SALARY** 32

GRADE 26 WHILE THE ENTRY LEVEL SALARY FOR ALL 1 **GOVERNMENT NURSES SHALL BE SALARY GRADE** 2 3 18. "x x x." 4 Sec. 5. Section 20 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows: 5 "Section 20. Additional Compensation. 6 Notwithstanding Section 12 of Republic Act 6758 and the 7 8 provisions of Republic Act 11466, public health workers shall receive the following ADDITIONAL allowances, SPECIAL 9 allowance, RICE ALLOWANCE, subsistence RISK 10 SUBSIDY ALLOWANCE, longevity pay, laundry and 11 12 **CLOTHING** allowance, and remote assistance allowance. "×××." 13 Sec. 6. Section 21 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows: 14 "Section 21. Hazard Allowance. - [Public health workers 15 in hospitals, sanitaria, rural health units, main health centers, 16 health infirmaries, barangay health stations, clinics and other 17 health-related establishments located in difficult areas, strife-18 torn or embattled areas, distressed or isolated stations, prison 19 camps, mental hospitals, radiation exposed clinics, 20 laboratories or disease infested areas or in areas declared 21 22 under state of calamity or emergency for the duration thereof which-expose them to great danger, contagion, radiation, 23 volcanic activity/eruption, occupational risk or perils to life as 24 determined by the Secretary of Health, shall be compensated 25 hazard allowances equivalent to at least twenty-five (25%) of 26 27 the monthly basic salary of health workers receiving salary grade 19 and below, and five percent (5%) for health workers 28 with salary grade 20 and above.]. ALL PUBLIC HEALTH 29 WORKERS PERFORMING HEALTH AND HEALTH-30 RELATED WORK REGARDLESS OF WORK LOCATION, 31 SHALL BE ENTITLED TO A MONTHLY HAZARD 32

ALLOWANCE AMOUNTING TO FIVE THOUSAND PESOS 1 (PHP5,000.00): PROVIDED, THAT THIS RATE SHALL 2 BE EXEMPTED FORM INCOME TAX: PROVIDED 3 FURTHER, THAT THE RATES SHALL BE REVIEWED 4 PERIODICALLY AND INCREASED ACCORDINGLY BY 5 THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH, IN CONSULTATION 6 WITH THE APPROPRIATE GOVERNMENT AGENCIES 7 AND HEALTH WORKERS ASSOCIATIONS, 8 **ORGANIZATIONS OR UNIONS."** 9

Sec. 7. Section 21-A shall be inserted after Section 21 of the same Act to read
as follows:

"SECTION 21-A. SPECIAL RISK ALLOWANCE. -12 13 IN CIRCUMSTANCES, SITUATIONS, AND LOCATIONS OF WORK WHEREIN THE PERFORMANCE OF THIER 14 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES EXPOSE PUBLIC 15 HEALTH WORKERS TO GREAT DANGER, 16 OCCUPATIONAL RISKS, AND THREATS OF LIFE, AS 17 DETERMINED BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH, 18 CONCERNED PUBLIC HEALTH WORKER SHALL BE 19 ENTITLED TO SPECIAL RISK ALLOWANCE OF AT LEAST 20 TWENTY-FIVE PERCENT (25%) OF THE MONTHLY 21 BASIC SALARY." 22

Sec. 8. Section 22 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows: 23 "Section 22. Public health workers who are required to 24 render service within OR IN THE VICINITY OF the premises 25 of [hospitals, sanitaria, health infirmaries, main health 26 27 centers, rural-health-units and barangay health stations, or clinics-and other health-related establishments] HEALTH 28 FACILITIES AND OTHER RELATED ESTABLISHMENTS 29 in order to make their services available at any and all times, 30 shall be entitled to a full subsistence allowance of three (3) 31 meals which may be computed in accordance with the 32

prevailing circumstances as determined by the Secretary of 1 Health in consultation with the Management-Health Workers' 2 Consultative Councils as established under Section 33 of this 3 Act: **PROVIDED**, THAT SUBSISTENCE ALLOWANCE 4 SHALL BE COMPUTED NOT LOWER THAN SEVENTY-5 FIVE PESOS (PHP75.00) PER MEAL; Provided, 6 FURTHER, that the representation and travel allowance shall 7 be given to rural health physicians as enjoyed by municipal 8 agriculturists, municipal planning and development officers 9 and budget officers." 10 Sec. 9. A new Section 21-A shall be inserted after Section 21 of the same Act 11 to read as follows: 12 "SECTION 22-A. RICE SUBSIDY ALLOWANCE. --13 ALL PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS SHALL BE ENTITLED 14 TO A RICE SUBSIDY ALLOWANCE IN THE FORM OF 15 CASH AMOUNTING TO ONE THOUSAND TWO 16 HUNDRED FIFTY PESOS (PHP1,200.00)." 17 Sec. 10. A Section 24 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as 18 19 follows: "Section 24. Laundry AND CLOTHING Allowance. -20 all public health workers required to regularly wear uniforms 21 shall be entitled to laundry AND CLOTHING allowance 22 equivalent to [One hundred twenty-five pesos (P125.99)] 23 FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (PHP500.00) per month: 24 Provided, that this rate shall be reviewed periodically and 25 increased accordingly by the Secretary of Health in 26 consultation with the appropriate government agencies AND 27 ASSOCIATIONS, HEALTH WORKERS 28 **ORGANIZATIONS OR UNIONS** concerned, taking into 29 account, existing laws, rules and regulations." 30 Sec. 11. A Section 28 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as 31 follows: 32

"Section 28.-[Compensation for Injuries.-] LOSS OF 1 EARNINGS BENEFIT. - Public health workers shall be 2 protected against the consequences of employment injuries, 3 **ILLNESS OR OUARANTINE**, in accordance with existing 4 law, or regulations. Injuries OR ILLNESS incurred while 5 doing overtime work shall be presumed work-connected. 6 PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS AND THEIR FAMILY, AS 7 MAY BE APPLICABLE, ARE ALSO ENTITLED TO LOSS 8 OF EARNING BENEFIT (LOEB), EQUAL TO SEVENTY-9 FIVE PERCENT (75%) OF SUCH PUBLIC HEALTH 10 WORKER'S MONTHLY SALARY, IN CASE OF DEATH, 11 PERMANENT TOTAL DISABILITY, DISMEMBERMENT, 12 PERMANENT LOSS OF SIGHT, HEARING OR SPEECH 13 DEFECT, IF THE INJURY OR ILLNESS HAS OCCURRED 14 WHILE THE PUBLIC HEALTH WORKER IS IN THE 15 PERFORMANCE OF DUTY. 16

17"THE PUBLIC HEALTH WORKER CONCERNED,18OR HIS/HER FAMILY, IS ENTITLED TO THE MONTHLY19LOEB UNTIL THE WORKER SHALL HAVE REACHED20THE AGE OF SIXTY-FIVE (65).

21"THE ENTITLEMENT TO LOEB IS SEPARATE AND22DISTINCT FROM WHATEVER THE WORKER OR23HIS/HER FAMILY SHALL RECEIVE AS DEATH24BENEFIT, OR LOSS OF INCOME BENEFITS FROM THE25GOVERNMENT SERVICE INSURANCE SYSTEM (GSIS)26BY VIRTUE OF THE DEATH, SICKNESS OR INJURY".

27 Sec. 12. Section 38 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as 28 follows:

29 "Section 38. [*Budget Estimates.*- The Secretary of
30 Health shall submit annually the necessary budget estimates
31 to implement the provisions of thie=s Act in staggered basis
32 of implementation of the proposed benefits until the total of

nine hundred forty six million six hundred sixty-four thousand 1 pesos (P946,664,000.00) is attained within five (5) years. 2 APPROPRIATIONS. - SUCH AMOUNTS AS MAY BE 3 DEEMED NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS ACT FOR 4 THE CURRENT YEAR SHALL BE CHARGED AGAINST 5 THE SAVINGS OF THE DOH. THEREAFTER, THE SUM 6 NECESSARY FOR THE FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF 7 THIS ACT SHALL BE SOURCED FORM THE PROCEEDS 8 **OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10351 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS** 9 THE SIN TAX LAW OF 2012, IN ACCORDANCE WITH 10 THE PERTINENT LAWS AND REGULATIONS." 11

Sec. 13. A new Section 38-A is hereby inserted to read as follows: 12 "SECTION 38-A. BUDGETARY ESTIMATES. -13 BUDGETARY ESTIMATES FOR THE SUCCEEDING 14 YEARS SHOULD BE REVIEWED AND INCREASED 15 ACCORDINGLY BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH IN 16 CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET 17 AND MANAGEMENT (DBM) AND THE CONGRESSIONAL 18 COMMISSION ON HEALTH (HEALTHCOM)." 19

20 Sec. 14. Section 39 of the same Act is hereby amended with an additional 21 paragraph to read as follows:

"Section 39. Penal Provision. - Any person who shall 22 willfully interfere with, restrain or coerce any public health 23 worker in the exercise of his/her rights or shall in any manner 24 commit any act of violation of any of the provisions of this Act, 25 upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than 26 [twenty thousand pesos (P20,000.00) but not more than Forty 27 Thousand Pesos (P40,000.00)] FORTY-THOUSAND PESOS 28 (P40,000.00) BUT NOT MORE THANT EIGHTY 29 THOUSAND PESOS (P80,000.00) or imprisonment of not 30 more than one (1) year or both at the discretion of the court. 31

"If the offender is a public official, the court, in addition to the penalties provided in the preceding paragraph, may impose the additional penalty of disqualification from office.

"ALL SANITARIA, 4 HOSPITALS, HEALTH INFIRMARIES, HEALTH CENTERS, RURAL HEALTH 5 UNITS, BARANGAY HEALTH STATIONS, CLINICS AND 6 OTHER HEALTH-RELATED ESTABLISHMENTS OWNED 7 AND OPERATED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF ITS 8 ORIGINAL POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS WITH 9 CHAPTERS THAT WILLFULLY CIRCUMVENT OR 10 VIOLATE THE LAW TO EVADE PROVISION OF 11 BENEFITS TO PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS WILL BE 12 HELD LIABLE. THE PERSON DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE 13 AS WELL AS THE HEAD OF AGENCY OR THE LOCAL 14 CHIEF EXECUTIVE WILL BE SANCTIONED UNDER 15 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW, CIVIL SERVICE LAW AND 16 OTHER APPROPRIATE LAWS. 17

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"LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WHO 18 WILLFULLY CIRCUMVENT OR VIOLATE THE GIVING 19 OF SALARY, COMPENSATION, PAY AND ALLOWANCE 20 OF PUBLIC RURAL HEALTH PHYSICIANS AND OTHER 21 PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS AS PROVIDED IN THIS 22 ACT SHALL BE A GROUND FOR DISCIPLINARY 23 ACTION." 24

Sec. 15. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The Secretary of Health after consultation with the appropriate agencies of the Government, such as, but not limited to, the DBM, the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), as well as professional and health workers' organizations or unions, shall formulate and prepare the revised implementing rules and regulations in accordance with this Act.

30 Sec. 16. *Separability Clause.* - If any provision or provision of this Act is declared 31 unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected 32 thereby shall remain in force and effect.

Sec. 17. *Repealing Clause.*- Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

Sec. 18. *Effectivity Clause.*- This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from the
date of its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
