AN ACT EXPANDING AND CREATING THE REGULAR CAMPUSES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ANTIQUE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9746, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Republic Act No. 9746, which converted the then Polytechnic State College of Antique into the University of Antique, was signed into law on November 10, 2009. Currently, the main campus of the University of Antique is located in the municipality of Sibalom, with campuses in Tibiao and Hamtic and extension campuses in Libertad and Caluya. Since the enactment of R.A. No. 9746, a confluence of factors has significantly changed the educational landscape in the province.

For one, the Department of Education has since created an integrated agricultural high school in San Remigio, Antique. The creation of a regular campus in the municipality will allow students to further hone their skills through tertiary education, contributing as a rich resource to the development of the agricultural landscape of the province. Moreover, the indigenous peoples in Tobias Fornier, Antique often face many challenges and struggle to finish their education, including lack of funds to pay for transportation costs. The creation of a regular campus in Tobias Fornier could help ease this financial burden and give them a chance to finish their education.

With the growing demand for educational opportunities in Caluya and Libertad, there is also a need to convert the University's temporary extension campuses in these municipalities into regular external campuses. By appropriating funds for the construction of classrooms and laboratories, the University can open more relevant programs for these campuses.

Lastly, Antique is the only province in Region VI without a law school. By increasing the breadth of programs the University may offer, students in Antique may be given the opportunity to pursue law. This could help address the scarcity of practicing lawyers in the province and speed up the administration of justice.

Therefore, this bill seeks to expand the University's programs and create additional regular campuses in order to ensure the continued quality and relevance of education and learning in the province of Antique.

Hence, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.




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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Republic of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section. 1. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 9746 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 2. General Mandate. - The University shall primarily provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction and training in the fields of education, agriculture, forestry, fishery, maritime education, ecology, engineering, philosophy, information and communications technology, letters, arts and sciences, nursing, LAW,

medicine and other relevant fields of study. It shall also undertake research and extension services in support of the socioeconomic

development of Antique, and provide progressive leadership in its areas

of specialization."

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Sec. 2. Section 3 of R.A. No. 9746 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 3. Curricular Offerings. – The University shall offer undergraduate and graduate courses in the fields of education, agriculture, forestry, fishery, maritime education, ecology, engineering, philosophy, information and communications technology, letters, arts and

sciences, nursing, LAW, medicine and other degree courses within its areas of specialization and according to its capabilities, as the Board of Regents may deem necessary to carry out its objectives, in order to meet the needs of the Province of Antique and Region VI: *Provided*, That no degree program shall be offered without the approval of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) before the same shall be approved by its Board.

The existing high school/s shall be transferred to the jurisdiction and supervision of the Department of Education (DepED): *Provided*, That the high schools shall be allowed to remain and operate within the campus of the University until its students, who are currently enrolled, shall have completed their high school education: *Provided*, *further*, That the University may operate a reasonably-sized laboratory school, if it has a College of Education."

- Sec. 3. Section 7 of R.A. No. 9746 is hereby amended to as read as follows:
- "SEC. 7. Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents. The Board shall have the following specific powers and duties, in addition to its general powers of administration and the exercise of all the powers granted to the board of directors of a corporation under existing laws:
 - (a) To promulgate rules and regulations not contrary to law as may be necessary to carry out the purposes and functions of the University;
 - (b) To receive and appropriate all sums as may be provided, for the support of the University in the manner it may determine, in its discretion, in order to carry out the purposes and functions of the University;
 - (c) To import duty-free economic, technical and cultural books and/or publications, upon certification by the CHED that such imported books and/or publications are for economic, technical, vocational, scientific, philosophical, historical or cultural purposes, in accordance with the provisions of the Tariff and Customs Code of the Philippines, as amended;

(d) To receive in trust, legacies, gifts and donations of real and personal properties of all kinds and to administer and dispose, of the same when necessary for the benefit of the University, and subject to the limitations, directions and instructions of the donor, if any.

Such donations shall be exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deductions from the gross income in the computation of the income tax of the donor, in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC) of 1997, as amended: Provided, that such donations shall not be disposed of, transferred or sold;

(e) To fix the tuition fees and other necessary school charges, such as, but not limited to, matriculation fees, graduation fees and laboratory fees, as the Board may deem proper to impose, after due consultations with the involved sectors.

Such fees and charges, including government subsidies and other income generated by the University, shall constitute special trust funds and shall be deposited in any authorized government depository bank, and all interests that shall accrue there from shall form part of the same funds for the use of the University.

Any provision of existing laws, rules and regulations to the contrary notwithstanding, any income generated by the University from tuition fees and other charges, as well as from the operation of auxiliary services and land grants shall be retained by the University, and may be disbursed by the Board for instruction, research, extension or other programs/projects of the University: Provided, That all fiduciary fees shall be disbursed for the specific purposes for which these are collected.

If, for reason beyond its control, the University shall not be able to pursue any project for which funds have been appropriated and allocated under its approved program of expenditures, the Board may authorize the use of said funds for any reasonable

purpose which, in its discretion, may be necessary and urgent for 1 2 the attainment of the objectives and goals of the University; (f) To adopt and implement a socialized scheme of tuition and school 3 fees for greater access to poor but deserving students; 4 5 (g) To authorize the construction or repair of its buildings, machinery, 6 equipment and other facilities and the purchase and acquisition of real and personal properties, including necessary supplies and 7 8 materials and equipment; 9 (h) To appoint, upon recommendation of the President of the 10 University, Vice Presidents, deans, directors, heads of departments, faculty members and other officials and employees of the 11 University; 12 (i) To fix and adjust salaries of faculty members and administrative 13 14 officials and employees, subject to the provisions of the Revised Compensation and Position Classification System and other 15 pertinent budget and compensation laws governing hours of 16 service and such other duties and conditions as it may deem proper; 17 to grant them, at its discretion, leaves of absence under such 18 regulations as it may promulgate, any provision of existing laws to 19 the contrary notwithstanding; and to remove them for cause in 20 accordance with the requirements of due process of law; 21 (i) To approve the curricula, instructional programs and rules of 22 23 discipline drawn by the Administrative and Academic Councils as 24 herein provided; (k) To set policies on admission and graduation of students; 25 (l) To award honorary degrees upon persons in recognition of their 26 outstanding contribution in the fields of agriculture, public service, 27 arts, science and technology, education or in any field of 28 specialization within the academic competence of the University; 29

- (m)To establish and absorb nonchartered tertiary institutions within the Province of Antique as branches and extension centers in coordination with the CBED and in consultation with the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), and to offer therein programs or courses to promote and carry out equal and greater access to educational opportunities as mandated by the Constitution: (n) To establish research and extension centers of the University where such will promote the development of the latter; (o) To establish professorial chairs in the University and to provide fellowships for qualified faculty members and scholarships to deserving students; (p) To delegate any of its powers and duties provided for hereinabove to the President or Officer-in-Charge and/or other officials of the
 - University as it may deem appropriate, so as to expedite the administration of the affairs of the University;

 (q) To authorize an external management audit of the University, to be

- (q) To authorize an external management audit of the University, to be financed by the CHED, subject to the rules and regulations of the Commission on Audit (COA); and to institute reforms, including academic and structural changes, on the basis of audit results and recommendations;
- (r) To collaborate with other governing boards of state universities and colleges within the Province of Antique or Region VI, under the supervision of the CHED and in consultation with the DBM, and work towards the restructuring of the University to become more efficient, relevant, productive and competitive;
- (s) To enter into joint ventures with business and industry for the profitable development and management of the economic assets of the University, the proceeds from which shall be used for the development and strengthening of the same;
- (t) To develop consortia and other economic forms of linkages with local government units (LGUs), institutions and agencies, both

3	(u) To develop academic arrangements for institutional capability

15	Sec. 5. Appropriations The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of
16	this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
17	Sec. 6. Separability Clause If, for any reason, any part, section, or provision of
18	this Act is declared as unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions
19	hereof shall not be affected thereby.
20	Sec. 7. Repealing Clause The provisions of Republic Act No. 9746, and all other
21	laws, decrees, executive orders, proclamations and other executive issuances, which
2 2 .	are not consistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed.

Sec. 8. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall have a retroactive effect on 10

November 2009 or the date when Republic Act No. 9746 took effect after its

publication in two (2) newspapers of general circulation or in the Official Gazette.
