AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE BAMBOO INDUSTRY IN THE PHILIPPINES, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

With the growing global awareness of climate change, the bamboo is gaining popularity in the domestic and international markets as a sustainable resource in the manufacture of industrial products or as a construction material. The bamboo has been hailed as a sustainable product since it can grow rapidly without the need for replanting, and without chemical pesticides and fertilizers.

On a global scale, the value of the world's bamboo market was estimated to be US\$68.8 billion for traditional and non-traditional bamboo products in 2018.1 It is estimated to reach US\$82.9 billion by 2028,2 80% of which will come from the Asia Pacific Region.

Recognizing the enormous potential of the bamboo industry, this bill seeks to institutionalize the goals of Executive Order No. 879 (series of 2010), which created the Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Council (PBIDC). This bill also seeks to strengthen the incentives, assistance and programs available to the Philippine bamboo industry to ensure its rapid development.

Among others, this bill mandates the formulation of a Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Roadmap, and the establishment of the Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Council and the Bamboo Industry Research and Development Center. The Roadmap shall include, but not be limited to, programs and projects for the scientific propagation, development and management, processing, utilization, business development, and commercialization of Philippine bamboo and bamboo products. On the other hand, the Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Council shall provide the overall policy and program direction and coordinate the activities of the various agencies and instrumentalities to ensure the implementation, accomplishment and periodic review and enhancement of the Roadmap.

Indeed, the humble bamboo represents an important resource with tremendous economic, ecological, and environmental benefits for improving rural livelihood, saving forests, and preventing environmental problems.³ In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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

AN ACT

STRENGTHENING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE BAMBOO INDUSTRY IN THE PHILIPPINES, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. *Title.* This Act shall be known as the "Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Act."
- SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote and support industries that create and generate employment, especially in the rural areas, reduce poverty, promote environmental sustainability, mitigate the impacts of climate change, and promote inclusive growth.
- SEC. 3. *Objectives.* This Act aims to make the Philippine bamboo industry competitive in the local and international markets while providing opportunities for local employment and establishing bamboo-based community enterprises by:
- 14 a) Promoting the integrated and holistic development of the bamboo 15 industry in various aspects of research, production, processing, 16 marketing, consumption, capacity building, and regulation;
- b) Ensuring that the bamboo industry has sufficient supply of quality raw materials through the establishment and management of bamboo nurseries and plantations;
- 22 c) Ensuring that relevant and accurate data on the bamboo industry are 23 collated and published by the Bamboo Industry Research and 24 Development Center created under Section 7 of this Act, in cooperation

with various government agencies, private entities and other relevant sources, to aid in business decisions related to the industry;

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- d) Promoting investments in the bamboo industry by providing substantial and attractive incentives to investors;
 - e) Providing skilled labor and manpower through continuous relevant capacity building;
- 10 f) Ensuring the provision of locally manufactured machines with improved capacity, efficiency, and quality at competitive costs;
- 13 g) Improving bamboo industry research and development to discover new products and technologies, and advance market access for Philippine bamboo and bamboo products locally and internationally;
- h) Providing access to markets of bamboo products locally and internationally through aggressive trade promotions; and
- i) Ensuring sustainable resources in the implementation of the bamboo industry development program.
 - **SEC.** 4. Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Roadmap (PBIDR). To be able to attain the objectives of this Act, there shall be formulated and established a Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Roadmap (Roadmap), which shall include, but not be limited to, programs and projects for the scientific propagation, development and management, processing, utilization, business development, and commercialization of Philippine bamboo and bamboo products. The Roadmap shall include the following objectives, among others:
 - a) Expand the number of bamboo nurseries with quality planting materials;
- b) Ensure the propagation, breeding, site species matching and plant nutrition of bamboos;
- Observe sustainable planting, management and harvesting, and soil and water conservation practices;
- 40 d) Encourage bamboo backyard farming;
- e) Ensure the sustainability and viability of the bamboo industry;
- 44 f) Promote investments in the bamboo industry development programs; 45
- 46 g) Advance market access for Philippine bamboo and bamboo products
 47 locally and internationally;
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- 49 h) Extend technical and financial assistance for the development, 50 processing, commercialization and marketing of various bamboo

3 4 5	i)	Require bamboo to be at least 20% of the annual planting materials needed in the national greening program or in reforestation of open, denuded and degraded forest lands;

- l) One (1) representative from Non-Governmental Organizations; and
- 9 m) One (1) representative from the private sector involved in a business belonging to the bamboo industry.

The Council shall provide the overall policy and program directions and coordinate the activities of the various agencies and instrumentalities to ensure the implementation, accomplishment, periodic review and enhancement of the Roadmap.

SEC. 6. *Powers and Functions of the Council.* – The Council shall have the following powers and functions:

- a) Formulate the Philippine Bamboo Industry Development Roadmap;
- b) Identify specific and priority programs and projects in support of, and in line with, the Roadmap;
- c) Identify sources of financing to expand bamboo industry development;
 - d) Submit annual reports, not later than June 30 of each year, to the Office of the President and to each House of Congress on the status of the implementation of the Roadmap and the bamboo industry development in the country; and
 - e) Promulgate such rules and regulations and exercise such other powers and functions as may be necessary to carry out the objectives of this Act.
 - SEC. 7. Bamboo Industry Research and Development Center (BIRDC). There is hereby established a Bamboo Industry Research and Development Center (Center) which shall serve as the secretariat of the Council.

The Center shall be headed by an Executive Director, and shall consist of divisions for the following purposes: (1) research and development; (2) trade promotion and education; (3) networking and linkages; (4) internal administration; (5) and such other purposes as necessary to achieve the purposes of this Act.

- The composition of the divisions shall be prepared by the Executive Director and approved by the Council.
- The organizational structure, staffing pattern and compensation schedule of the Center shall be in accordance with applicable Civil Service rules and

regulations.

SEC. 8. *Powers and Functions of the Center.* – The Center shall have the following powers and functions:

a) Promote and encourage the establishment and management of bamboo nurseries, plantations and processing facilities that would accelerate the production and commercialization of bamboo and various bamboo products;

b) Promote the commercialization and market access of appropriate, innovative and viable bamboo industry development technologies and products:

15 c) Monitor and evaluate the performance of bamboo industry development 16 programs and projects;

d) Coordinate and partner with other government agencies in the implementation of bamboo industry development programs and projects;

e) Coordinate and partner with the private sector, people's organizations and non-governmental organizations, and the academe in providing assistance on matters pertaining to bamboo industry development;

f) Accept grants, donations and contributions from local and international donors and such similar sources of funds for the implementation of this Act, subject to the usual budget, accounting and auditing rules and regulations;

30 g) Conduct, in cooperation or partnership with appropriate government agencies, a periodic review of the Roadmap;

h) Conduct capability-building initiatives for farmers, processors, designers and other stakeholders in the bamboo industry;

i) Conduct research and development in partnership with appropriate government agencies to advance sustainable bamboo industry development practices;

promote the establishment and creation of bamboo farm tourism camps in partnership with the Department of Tourism (DOT) and the private sector;

 k) Gather data and create an information system related to bamboo, including but not limited to, plantations, population, species, workers and beneficiaries, investors, product demands and supplies, and costs and benefits for market research;

I) Supervise the implementation of the plans and programs of the Council;

- m) Manage and administer the projects identified by the Council; and
- Submit periodic reports to the Council on the progress and n) accomplishment of programs and projects. 4

SEC. 9. The Executive Director of the Center. - The Executive Director 6 shall be appointed on a permanent capacity by the President of the Republic 7 Philippines from the list of nominees submitted by the DTI Secretary. He/she 8 shall be a citizen and resident of the Philippines and must possess executive 9 and management experience of at least three (3) years and with considerable 10 11 knowledge in bamboo industry development. The Executive Director, in addition to his/her duties in the Center, shall have the following powers and 12 13 functions:

Assist the Council in the performance of its tasks: 14 15

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- b) 16 Provide technical and administrative support to the Council; 17
- Oversee the day-to-day operations of the Center; and september 1 18 c) 19
- Perform such other functions, duties and responsibilities as may be d) 20 necessary to implement this Act. 21
 - SEC. 10. Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) on Bamboo for Commercialization. - In addition to its mandate under the Bamboo Plantation Development Program (BPDP), the DENR shall ensure the development and expansion of nurseries and plantations of bamboo for commercialization and industrial purposes, while taking into consideration the ecological balance in areas identified for plantation and propagation. It shall continue to conduct research and development activities for production or propagation of bamboo.
- 31 SEC. 11. Department of Science and Technology for Research and Development. - The Department of Science and Technology-Forest 32 Products Research and Development Institute (DOST-FPRDI) shall be the 33 main research and development arm of the Council for bamboo utilization. It 34 shall work closely in coordination with the Center and other government 35 agencies, such as the Department of Agriculture-Bureau of Agricultural 36 37 Research (DA-BAR) to innovate and advance sustainable bamboo industry development practices. 38
- SEC. 12. Role of the Local Government Units. Local Government Units 39 40 (LGUs) in cooperation with the DENR, DTI and the DOST-FPRDI, and in consultation with the DA and the National Commission on Indigenous People 41 (NCIP) when necessary, shall regularly conduct surveys of existing bamboo 42 stands, nurseries and plantations in their respective localities, and shall 43 strengthen the local bamboo industry by promoting bamboo enterprises in 44 their respective localities. 45
- SEC. 13. Establishment of Provincial, City and Municipal Bamboo 46 Industry Development Councils and Bamboo Industry Development 47

Programs. – LGUs shall, as far as practicable, establish their respective Bamboo Industry Development Councils.

LGUs shall regularly conduct a survey of existing bamboo stands, nurseries and plantation and bamboo enterprises in their respective localities.

Each local Bamboo Industry Development Council shall conduct a survey of existing bamboo clumps and bamboo processing enterprises that are operating in the locality.

SEC. 12. Provision of Incentives to Investors involved in Bamboo Development. — The following incentives shall be provided to investors in plantation development and bamboo processing factories:

a) The Board of Investments shall classify bamboo nurseries and plantations as pioneer and bamboo processing as preferred areas of investment under its Investment Priorities Plan (IPP) subject to pertinent rules and regulations;

b) Plantation owners, including nursery facilities, bamboo processing and other related businesses shall be exempt from the payment of import duties for imported machines and equipment subject to pertinent rules and regulations;

c) Plantation owners in public lands shall be exempt from the payment of forest charges that may be imposed by the national government and other fees or taxes imposed by LGUs;

d) Bamboo plantations shall not require a cutting permit for harvesting and a transport permit for transporting its produce: *Provided*, that such plantation is registered with the Community Environment and Natural Resources Office (CENRO) of the DENR;

e) Expenses incurred, including those incurred in the development and operation of the bamboo plantation prior to commercial harvest shall be allowed as deductible expenses from gross income;

f) Bamboo plantations shall be accepted as a collateral for loans in government financial institutions (GFIs);

g) The bamboo plantation developer and processors shall be given priority to access credit assistance and guarantee schemes being granted by GFIs; and

h) Bamboo plantations and plantation development equipment shall be covered by the Philippine Crop Insurance Corporation.

SEC. 12. Appropriations. – An amount of One Hundred Million Pesos (Php100,000,000.00) to be sourced from the contingency fund of the Office of the President and the existing budget for bamboo industry development under

the DTI is hereby appropriated for the initial budgetary requirements of this 1 2 Act. Additionally. an amount of One Hundred Million (Php100,000,000.00) shall be sourced from the revenues of the Philippine 3 Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR) for the effective 5 implementation of this Act.

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such amount as may be necessary for the implementation of this Act and for the continuous operation of the Center shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

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SEC. 13. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, DTI, in consultation with the members of the Council and other relevant stakeholders, shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

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16 SEC. 14. Separability Clause. - Should any provision herein be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this Act. 18

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SEC. 15. Repealing Clause. -20 All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or other issuances or parts inconsistent with the provisions of this 21 22 Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

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SEC. 16. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
