### AN ACT ESTABLISHING A BUSINESS PERMIT AND LICENSING OFFICE (BPLO) IN EVERY CITY OR MUNICIPALITY IN THE COUNTRY

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Republic Act 11032 otherwise known as the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018 was approved on May 28, 2018. This law amended Republic Act 9485, otherwise known as the "Anti-Red Red Tape Act of 2007. RA 11032 was enacted to provide improved and better government services and transactions, as well as to expedite business and nonbusiness transactions in the government.

As for the local government units, it is imperative that all municipalities and cities must have their respective Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO), which is the frontline service for all business – related transactions. This office is essential as per Sections 10 and 11 of RA 11032.

This measure intends to institutionalize the creation of a BPLO in every local government unit in the entire country. It is the intent of this bill to further provide better, faster and efficient services to all Filipinos. In this way the application for new and renewal of business permits as well as investment programs of the business sector with the local government units will be more systematic and proficient. As every local government unit achieves its full economic growth, they shall be financially ready to implement programs that are necessary for the people they serve. Furthermore, decent employment opportunities both the private sector, will be created by fostering a better business friendly locality.

In the end, the national government wins as in this way it empowers local government units to become better service providers to the its constituents.

It is fervently hoped for the immediate consideration and passage of this bill is highly sought.

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#### AN ACT

# ESTABLISHING A BUSINESS PERMIT AND LICENSING OFFICE (BPLO) IN EVERY CITY OR MUNICIPALITY IN THE COUNTRY

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines, in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. *Short Title.*- This Act shall be known as the **"Business** Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO) Act of 2022".

Sec 2. *Declaration of Policy.* - It is the policy of the State to constantly improve the delivery of front line services of government, promote and establish policies to ensure ease of doing business, as well as simplify systems, structures, and procedures in the issuance of business permits and licenses.

Sec 3. *Establishment of a Business Permit and Licensing Office –*There is hereby established a Business Permit and Licensing Office, hereinafter referred to as the Office, which shall, among others, handle the issuance of business permits and licenses as well as formulate and implement policies and proactive measure to increase local employment, draw local and foreign investments, and increase local revenues in all municipalities or cities.

Sec. 4. *Powers, Duties and Functions* – The Business Permits and
 Licensing Office (BPLO) shall be responsible for the following:

15a.Process all business permits and licenses as well as occupational16permits, including the assessment of business taxes, fees and17charges of the various businesses in the city or municipality.

Provided, however, that all assessments are subject to the
 authority of the local treasurer to conduct examination of books of
 accounts as well as all other authorities as provided in the Local
 Government Code (LGC);

- b. Monitors and enforces applicable tax ordinances and other
  pertinent laws, ordinances, rules and regulations in the operations
  of businesses and occupations within the jurisdiction of the LGU;
- 8 c. Formulates policies as a proactive measure to draw local and 9 foreign investments especially in priority areas/industries and as a 10 tool to define the development thrust of the LGU;
- 11 d. Initiates, reviews and recommends to the Mayor revenue-12 generating measures to increase local revenues;
- e. Enforces all the LGU's tax ordinances and other pertinent laws,
  ordinances, and rules and regulations;
- 15f.Sits as a member of the Local Finance Committee, Local16Investment Board and such other bodies as the Mayor shall17identify; and
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- g. Performs such other functions as may be provided by law.

Sec. 5. *Appointment of the Chief, BPLO* – The Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) shall be headed by a Chief, with the rank and salary of a Department Head. S/He shall be qualified by the Personnel Selection and Promotions Board (PSPB) of the LGU. The position of Chief, BPLO, shall henceforth be included under the mandatory appointive local officials common to all municipalities, cities and provinces under Book III, Title Five of Republic Act 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code.

Sec. 6. *Composition and Office Structure* – The Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) shall be composed of four (4) principal divisions, namely:

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- a. Administration Division This division is tasked to handle
   administrative functions of the Investments and Business Permits
   and Licensing Office (BPLO)
- b. Business Permits and Licensing/Occupational Permits Division –
  This division shall act on all applications for business and/or
  mayor's permits and occupational permits as required under
  applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations;
- 8 c. *Investments Division* This division is tasked to craft policies that 9 shall increase local investments in the local government in 10 coordination with concerned offices for submission to the local 11 *sanggunian* (council) for ratification. It shall also supervise 12 compliance of business establishments that have partnered with 13 the local government on investment opportunities.
- 14d.Inspection Division This division shall handle the technical15function of the Office through:
- i. Tax mapping and regular inspections of all business
  establishments existing and/or operation within the
  territorial jurisdiction of the LGU;
- ii. Issue and/or implement notices and/or orders to theconcerned establishments; and
- 21 iii. Perform such other matters and functions that may be22 assigned by the Chief, BPLO.

*Sec. 7. Staffing Pattern.* – For purposes of the creation of the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO), officers and employees of the local government unit holding permanent appointments shall be given preference for appointment to the new positions created. All other personnel currently employed in this office shall be prioritized by the Personnel Selection and Promotions Board (PSPB), provided, they are eligible and qualified for such position.

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1 No new employees shall be taken in until all permanent employees have 2 been appointed, including temporary and casual employees who possess the 3 necessary qualification requirements, among which is the appropriate civil 4 service eligibility, for permanent positions.

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The Office shall determine its organizational structure and create new divisions or units as it may deem necessary, and shall appoint officers and employees in accordance with the Civil Service Law, rules and regulations.

8 Sec. 8. Appropriation. – The corresponding appropriations shall be 9 charged against any available funds in the Annual Budget of the LGU. The 10 corresponding appropriations therefor shall be incorporated in all succeeding 11 annual executive budgets in years thereafter.

Sec. 9. Implementing Rules and Regulations – The Office, in coordination with the concerned offices in the local government unit and in consultation with the stakeholders shall, within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, must issue the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

*Sec. 10. Separability Clause.* If any part or provision of this Act is held unconstitutional or invalid, the other parts or provision hereof which are not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

20 Sec. 11. Repealing Clause. All laws, orders, rules or regulations that are 21 inconsistent or contrary to the provisions of this Act are hereby amended or 22 repealed accordingly.

*Sec. 12. Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) national newspaper of general circulation.
