AN ACT GRANTING PHILIPPINE CITIZENSHIP TO JUVENAL SANSO

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to grant Philippine citizenship to a true master of the arts, whose work carries international prestige and who has had a profound impact in the art community from around the world, but whose heart remains a Filipino.

Juvenal Sanso was born in Spain in 1929, but moved with his family to Manila five years later. Here, he experienced both an idyllic childhood and the horrors of war, and eventually pursued formal education in art. As a student, he received tutelage from renowned artists such as Fernando Amorsolo, Alejandro Celis, Guillermo Tolentino, and Irineo Miranda.¹ He also won competitions such as first prize in the 1950 competition by the Art Association of the Philippines for his painting *Sorcerer*, and again in the 1951 competition by the same association for his work entitled *Incubus.*²

He left the country in 1952 in order to pursue further studies in art. In time, he achieved world renown for his artistic talents and creations, receiving various awards and citations such as "Print of the Year" by the Cleveland Museum of Art for his work *Leuers*.³ He held numerous one-man shows and exhibits here in the country and in other parts of world such as in Italy, the United States, the United

Kingdom, and Mexico.⁴ His works are featured in prestigious museums like the Metropolitan Museum of New York, Chicago Art Institute, and the Philadelphia Museum of Art.⁵

For his invaluable contribution to visual arts in the country, Sanso received *The Presidential Medal of Merit* from Former President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo in 20 May 2006.⁶ He also received *The Distinguished King's Cross of Isabela* from the Spanish King Juan Carlos in 08 January 2007 as recognition for his exemplary work across national boundaries, and *The Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres* from the Ministry of Culture and Communications of the Republic of France in 26 February 2008.⁷

His profound legacy also shines through with his earnest generosity and unwavering commitment to help fledgling artists. He often visited his alma mater, UP College of Fine Arts, to donate funds for students having difficulty in finances.⁸ In 2008 and 2009, he served as the artist-in-residence of the Shell National Students' Art Competition.⁹ And in 2015, the Fundacion Sanso (Sanso Museum) was established in San Juan City with his guidance and support.¹⁰ Aside from showcasing and managing his works, it also established a Fine Arts Student Stipend Program for select students to help augment their financial resources and cover their expenses related to their art studies.¹¹

After 50 years of living in Paris, *Señor Sanso* decided to come home in 2008 and establish permanent residence here in Manila.¹² Now in his 90s, he continues to inspire generations of Filipino artists and enrich our local artistic heritage. With his

AN ACT GRANTING PHILIPPINE CITIZENSHIP TO JUVENAL SANSO

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- Section 1. Mr. Juvenal Sanso is hereby granted Philippine Citizenship with all the rights, privileges and prerogatives, as well as the duties and obligations appurtenant thereto under the Constitution and the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.
- Sec. 2. Mr. Sanso shall take the Oath of Allegiance to the Republic of the Philippines before an officer duly authorized to administer the same. The Oath of Allegiance shall be registered with the Bureau of Immigration.
 - Sec. 3. Upon registration of the Oath of Allegiance, the Bureau of Immigration shall issue a Certificate of Naturalization to Mr. Sanso who shall thereupon enter into the full enjoyment of Philippine citizenship.
- Sec. 4. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the
 Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
