

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC ORDER AND DANGEROUS DRUGS AND OTHER APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE ALLEGED INCREASING KIDNAPPING INCIDENTS AND RECENT SPATE OF OTHER CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES, WITH THE END IN VIEW OF STRENGTHENING PEACE AND ORDER MECHANISM IN THE COUNTRY

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 5 of the Constitution provides that the State shall promote "the maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy";

WHEREAS, Article 267 of the Revised Penal Code on Kidnapping and Serious Illegal Detention states that "any private individual who shall kidnap or detain another, or in any other manner deprive him of his liberty, shall suffer the penalty of reclusion perpetua to death: If the kidnapping or detention shall have lasted more than five days";

WHEREAS, the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime has estimated that more than 10,000 people are kidnapped, often unreported for fear of retaliation, throughout the world every year;¹

WHEREAS, there have been observed spike on incidents about kidnappings, abductions and disappearances in the country involving members of the Filipino-Chinese communities, women, Chinese POGO workers, among others reported in the media;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Chinese Chamber of Commerce and Industry Inc. (PCCCI), reported that the kidnapping cases targeting Chinese Filipinos in the last ten (10) days have surged to fifty-six (56) and mostly in the southern Metro cities of Pasay, Parañaque, Makati and Taguig. It is also alarming that most of these kidnappers are reportedly foreigners and Chinese in particular;²

WHEREAS, PNP reported that there were only 27 kidnapping cases from January to September this year with 15 POGO-related, 11 kidnap-for-ransom (KFR) cases and 1 casino-related case;

WHEREAS, the Philippine National Police (PNP) have claimed that many of the abduction reports being sent to them involved older cases that have already been acted upon by their investigators, and have requested PCCCI to provide supporting evidence to substantiate their claims;

WHEREAS, with the conflicting claims, it becomes necessary for the PNP and the National Police Commission to review the figures. It would also be helpful in setting the record straight especially since kidnappings only make it to their public list of index crimes when they are "complexed" or are committed with other crimes like murder, robbery, among others so it would be easy for citizens to verify the actual incidents of kidnappings being reported;

WHEREAS, abduction and torture are acts of cruelty that should be condemned, and their perpetration should be nipped in the bud. In so doing, it would also send a message to everyone that the Philippines is not a haven for undeterred criminality, and that no one is above the law;

WHEREAS, these increasing incidents if left unaddressed may exacerbate the state of fear, uneasiness and terror among Filipinos, and may undermine trust to institutions;

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the government to act with urgency to put an end to these alleged increasing kidnapping incidents and other criminal activities and assure our people that the situations are within their control and work in full force to maintain peace and order in the country;

WHEREAS, there is a need to prevent, investigate and counter kidnapping through legal, institutional and operational technical assistance. Hence, it is imperative that the Congress, through timely legislation, ensure that general public are keep safe from these crimes;

WHEREAS, the legislative power of the Senate to conduct inquiries in aid of legislation is indubitable. For the body to enact sensible laws, it necessarily requires for the Senate to be well-informed of the factual background behind intended legislation. It is for this same reason that the Senate must now exercise this power and mandate to determine whether the laws now written demand review and amendment in order to ensure that they are not circumvented and transgressed;

WHEREAS, peace and order, and the safety and security of our citizens and of those who are within the territorial jurisdiction of our country must be upheld and protected. Our laws must be enforced for the general welfare, and they must apply equally to all people who live, reside or merely sojourn in our country. And since both citizens and aliens are bound by our laws, these same laws must be sufficient enough to protect them and their welfare while they are within our territorial jurisdiction;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, to direct the Senate Committee on Public Order and Dangerous Drugs and other appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the alleged increasing kidnapping incidents and recent spate of other criminal activities, with the end in view of strengthening peace and order mechanism in the country.
