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RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES, TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON FAR EASTERN UNIVERSITY PUBLIC POLICY CENTER'S FINDINGS THAT ELEMENTARY TEXTBOOKS CONTAIN FACTUAL INACCURACIES

WHEREAS, the Constitution requires that all educational institutions include the study of the Constitution as part of the curricula, and shall inculcate patriotism and nationalism, foster love of humanity, respect for human rights, appreciation of the role of national heroes in the historical development of the country, teach the rights and duties of citizenship, strengthen ethical and spiritual values, develop moral character and personal discipline¹;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10533 or the Enhanced Basic Education Act of 2013 provides the standards and principles that the Department of Education shall adhere to in developing the enhanced basic education curriculum²;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 8047 or the Book Publishing Industry Development Act mandated the formulation of a national book policy and a national book development plan. The said law recognized that books are the most effective and economical tools for achieving educational growth, for imparting information and for recording, preserving, and disseminating the nation's cultural heritage³;

WHEREAS, the Far Eastern University Public Policy Center (FPPC), a private research foundation that conducts in-depth research and public discussion that aims to make substantive contribution to evidence-based policymaking, conducted a review of fourteen (14) Araling Panlipunan textbooks of Grade 5 and 6 which were published from 2016 to 2019 and are used in selected private and

in all public elementary schools. The overall aim of the review is to improve the teaching and learning of social studies⁴;

WHEREAS, the FPPC review found that: (1) the textbooks' grand narrative of Philippe history is dominantly political in content, (2) the textbooks contain examples of factual inaccuracies, including unproven statements that are presented as facts. It appears that the textbooks did not undergo a rigorous review process, (3) civic prescriptions in the textbooks also tend to appeal to emotion or public sentiment than to civic knowledge (such as how government works or ought to work, voter registration, basic tenets of the constitution), and (4) the treatment of martial law ranges from only 7% to 11% of the total number of pages in the Grade 6 textbook. Given the overall textbook narrative of the Filipino struggle for freedom and nationhood, martial law occupies a relatively limited space;

WHEREAS, the FPPC recommends the following: (1) correcting historical inaccuracies, (2) discussing neglected and silenced topics, (3) providing more data to support the authors' interpretations, and (4) devoting more space in the textbooks for the discussion of Martial Law;

WHEREAS, considering that Philippine textbooks are of immense importance as they are the primary, in most instances, the sole, learning resource, it is imperative that historical inaccuracies be corrected, facts presented are precise and authors' interpretations are founded on evidence;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the proper Senate committees conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on Far Eastern University Public Policy Center's findings that elementary textbooks contain factual inaccuracies.
