AN ACT

DECLARING THE FIRST DAY OF FEBRUARY OF EVERY YEAR AS NATIONAL HIJAB DAY

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. *Short Title.* — This Act shall be known as "National Hijab Day".

Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* — The State recognizes the role of women in nation-building and shall ensure the fundamental equality of women and men before the law. The free exercise and enjoyment of religious profession and worship, without discrimination and or preference, shall forever be allowed.

Sec. 3. *Definition of Terms.* — As used in this Act:
a) *Hijab* refers to a modest garment worn by Muslim women to cover the
hair and neck; and
b) *Hijabi* refers to a Muslim woman wearing a *hijab*.
Sec. 4. *Objectives.* — The objectives of this Act are as follows:

1	a) To protect the freedom of religion and the right of Muslim women to
2	practice their religion;
3	b) To prevent discrimination against hijabis;
4	c) To encourage women to show their solidarity by wearing hijab during
5	the National Hijab Day;
6	d) To promote appreciation for diversity in the expression of oneself and
7	one's faith and religion; and
8	e) To promote tolerance and acceptance of other lifestyles amongst the
9	citizenry.

Sec. 5. *National Hijab Day.* — The first day of February of each year is hereby
declared as the observance of National Hijab Day to foster solidarity with *hijabis* by
encouraging the wearing of *hijab* by women in public.

Sec. 6. *Public Awareness.* — Government agencies, schools, and the private sector are encouraged to observe National Hijab Day in an appropriate manner that promotes the objectives of this Act through awareness activities.

Sec. 7. *Implementing Agency.* — The National Commission on Muslim Filipinos (NCMF) is hereby mandated as the lead agency in promoting and raising consciousness about the practice of wearing a hijab. Towards this end, it may conduct fora, information dissemination campaigns, and other educational drives to effectively meet the objectives of this Act.

Sec. 8. *Separability Clause.* — If any portion or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby shall remain in force and effect.

Sec. 9. Repealing *Clause.* — Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, rule, or regulation inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed or modified accordingly. Sec. 10. *Effectivity.* — This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days following
 its complete publication in the Official Gazette or a newspaper of general circulation.
