AN ACT

STRENGTHENING THE CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION OF PHILIPPINE CULTURAL HERITAGE THROUGH CULTURAL MAPPING AND AN ENHANCED CULTURAL HERITAGE EDUCATION PROGRAM, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10066, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "NATIONAL CULTURAL HERITAGE ACT OF 2009"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Article II, Section 3 of Republic Act No. 10066, otherwise known as the *"National Cultural Heritage Act of 2009,"* is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 3. *Definition of Terms*. – For purposes of this Act, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

(a) "Adaptive reuse" shall refer to the utilization of buildings, other built-structures and sites of value for purposes other than that for which they were intended originally, in order to conserve the [site, their engineering integrity and authenticity of design.] SIGNIFICANCE AND VALUE OF THE SITE, WHILE ENSURING THEIR SUSTAINABILITY.

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15 (O) "CULTURAL MAPPING" SHALL REFER TO THE APPROACHES 16 EMPLOYED TO IDENTIFY, RECORD AND USE CULTURAL HERITAGE 17 **RESOURCES AND ACTIVITIES FOR BUILDING AND EMPOWERING** 18 COMMUNITIES. IT IS A SYSTEMATIC SET OF ACTIVITIES AND 19 METHODOLOGICAL PROCESSES FOR EXPLORING. DISCOVERING. 20 DOCUMENTING, EXAMINING, ANALYZING, INTERPRETING, 21 PRESENTING, AND SHARING INFORMATION RELATED TO PEOPLE, 22 COMMUNITIES, SOCIETIES, PLACES, AND THEIR MATERIAL PRODUCTS, 23 PRACTICES, AND NARRATIVES.

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(EE) "NATURAL HERITAGE" SHALL REFER TO FLORA AND FAUNA, PHYSICAL, GEOLOGICAL AND PHYSIOGRAPHICAL FORMATIONS OF THE ENVIRONMENT, AND OTHER RELATED ECOSYSTEMS, WHETHER TERRESTRIAL, WETLAND, OR MARINE, AND THE ECOSYSTEM SERVICES THEY PROVIDE.

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[(dd)] (FF) "Natural property of cultural significance" shall refer to [areas possessing outstanding ecosystem with flora and fauna of national scientific importance] NATURAL HERITAGE CHARACTERIZED BY INTENSE BEAUTY. ENDEMICITY, AND UNIOUE BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY under the National Integrated Protected Areas System[.] PURSUANT TO R.A. 7586, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "NATIONAL INTEGRATED PROTECTED AREAS SYSTEM ACT OF 1992," AS AMENDED. THIS INCLUDES OTHER PROTECTED AREAS RECOGNIZED **INTERNATIONALLY** UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PHILIPPINE GOVERNMENT, SUCH AS HERITAGE PARKS. BIOSPHERE RESERVES, AND RAMSAR SITES DESIGNATED UNDER THE CRITERIA OF THE RAMSAR CONVENTION OF WETLANDS OF THE UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND ORGANIZATION. IT SHALL LIKEWISE **CULTURAL INCLUDE** THREATENED SPECIES OF PLANTS AND ANIMALS IDENTIFIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF R.A. 9147, OTHERWISE AS THE "WILDLIFE RESOURCES CONSERVATION AND KNOWN PROTECTION ACT."

[(ee)] (GG) "NCCA Portal Cultural Databank" shall refer to the specific domain in the Commission's [intranet for cultural information that is accessed only internally with control and confidentiality.] ONLINE DATABASE WHERE DIGITIZED CULTURAL MAPS ARE LODGED FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE PUBLIC AND FOR SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND ACADEMIC PURPOSES. It includes the registry of national cultural property.

All other laws, 13 executive orders, presidential decrees, proclamations, rules, regulations, issuances, and 14 enactments or parts thereof inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified 15 accordingly.

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- SEC. 10. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
