AN ACT CREATING THE COUNCIL FOR THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Any country aiming to spur economic growth and development will have to ensure a well-developed infrastructure plan to encourage more investors. "Building" infrastructures towards sustainable growth and development, however, does not rely on a single industry or profession alone.

A country that builds a resilient and sustainable community needs to and must rely on the collective action and competence of several professionals who work in the field of built environment, such as (1) Architecture; (2) Interior Design; (3) Landscape Architecture; (4) Environmental Planning; (5) Geodetic Engineering; (6) Civil Engineering; (7) Electrical Engineering; (8) Mechanical Engineering; (9) Sanitary Engineering; (10) Master Plumber; (11) Electronics Engineering; and (12) Real Estate Services.

Under this bill, "[t]he State recognizes the importance and contributions of the Built Environment Professions in nation-building and development. Hence, the State shall ensure that all practicing Built Environment Professionals meet the minimum requirements to safeguard the life, health, property, and welfare of the public, foster their continuing professional growth and advancement, encourage and enhance collaboration, and continually review and improve the standards of regulation,

professional service, and practice towards Filipino Built Environment Professionals becoming socially and environmentally responsible, and globally competitive."

In view of this recognition, it is, thus, imperative to establish a council which shall have administrative supervision on these Built Environment Professions. This is the objective of the proposed bill.

This bill aims to create a council of the built environment ("Council") to: (1) advise on policy matters concerning the interests of the public in the built environment; and (2) oversee the regulation and facilitate collaboration and cooperation of Built Environment Professions. In relation to these objectives, the Council shall have the powers and functions pertaining to policy advisory, oversight, and collaborative platform.

Among others, it shall:

- 1. Act in an advisory capacity on any and all matters concerning the built environment;
- 2. Provide advice and consultation on national policy that could impact on the built environment, human resource development in relation to the built environment professions, and the recognition of new professions;
- Ensure the consistent application of policy for the Built Environment Professions
 with regard to registration requirements of registered professionals, identifying
 key elements of competence testing of registered
 professionals; establishment and implementation of codes of conduct, and
 delineation of scope of services;
- 4. Promote coordination between the Commission on Higher Education and the Academic Sectors for the Built Environment Professions in relation to the accreditation of education institutions; and
- 5. foster and encourage collaboration and cooperation between Built Environment Professionals by setting up guidelines, terms of reference and standards.

With the foregoing salient provisions, the proposed bill will be able to help professionalize and promote synergy and cooperation among the built environment professions.

This measure was filed by Sen. Richard J. Gordon and endorsed by the United Architects of the Philippines during the Eighteenth Congress.

The approval of this bill is most earnestly sought.

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AN ACT

CREATING THE COUNCIL FOR THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	ARTICLE I
2	GENERAL PROVISIONS
3	Section 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Council for the Built
4	Environment Act of 2022."
5	Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy The State recognizes the importance and
6	contributions of the Built Environment Professions in nation-building and development.
7	Hence, the State shall ensure that all practicing Built Environment Professional meets
8	the minimum requirements to safeguard life, health, and property, foster their
9	continuing professional growth and advancement, encourage and enhance
10	collaboration, and continually review and improve the standards of regulation,
11	professional service, and practice towards Filipino Built Environment Professionals
12	becoming socially and environmentally responsible and globally competitive.
13	Sec. 3. Definition of Terms As used in this Act, unless the context otherwise
14	requires, the following terms shall be defined as follows:
15	a. Built Environment means the field within which the registered professionals
16	practice;
17	b. Built Environment Professions means the following professions -
18	i. Architecture;

- ii. Interior Design;
- 2 iii. Landscape Architecture;
- 3 iv. Environmental Planning;
- 4 v. Geodetic Engineering;
- 5 vi. Civil Engineering;
- 6 vii. Electrical Engineering;
- 7 viii. Mechanical Engineering;
- 8 ix. Sanitary Engineering;
- 9 x. Electronics Engineering;
- 10 xi. Master Plumber; and
- 11 xii. Real Estate Services.

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- 12 c. *Council* means the Council for the Built Environment created under Section 8 of this Act;
- d. *Professional* means a person who is registered as such under any of the Professional Regulatory Laws;
 - e. *Professional Regulatory Laws* refer to the legal framework governing the practice of a specific profession; the legal charter creating and governing the various Boards, defining their functions and providing for the rules and policies that govern the practice of a specific profession;
 - f. Accredited and Integrated Professional Organization (AIPO) refers to the concerned Board and PRC Accredited Integrated Professional Organization for a given profession which is specifically mandated by the provision of the PRL to integrate the professionals into one national organization and where membership therein by professionals is automatic and mandatory;
- g. *Accredited Professional Organization (APO)* refers to the PRC Accredited Professional Organization where membership therein by professionals is only voluntary;
 - h. CHED refers to the Commission on Higher Education;
- i. MRA refers to Mutual Recognition Agreements between or among states;
- i. PRC refers to the Pro
- k. fessional Regulation Commission;
- I. PRB refers to the Professional Regulatory Board.

1 ARTICLE II

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ORGANIZATION OF MULTIPARTITE COUNCILS FOR BUILT ENVIRONMENT PROFESSIONS

- Sec. 4. Creation of Multipartite Councils for the Built Environment Professions.
- A Multipartite Council for each of the Built Environment Professions (herein referred
 to as "MC"), is hereby created to be attached to the PRC.
- Sec. 5. *Objectives of the MC.* The objectives of the MC are to:
- a. Provide a platform to discuss policy concerns in the education, internship, professional regulation, and continuing professional development; and
- b. Promote and encourage collaboration between the different stakeholders in the
 regulation and practice of the Built Environment Professions.
- Sec. 6. *Functions, Powers and Duties of the MC*. The MC shall perform the following functions:
- a. Monitor local and international benchmarks in professional education, internship, regulation and practice;
- b. Study and evaluate educational innovations that shall lead to curriculum
 development;
- c. Regularly review the subjects for examination;
- d. Develop and regularly review the Table of Specifications for the Licensure Examination;
- e. Develop and regularly review Internship/Guidelines in the areas, such as diversification of experience, duties and responsibilities of Mentors and collaborative work;
- f. Develop and regularly review Continuing Professional Development Guidelines;
- g. Develop and regularly review of Standards of Professional Practice in areas, such as Scope of Services, Schedule of Fees, and inter-professional collaboration; and
- h. Develop and regularly review professional education, internship, regulation and practice standards in reference to the Philippine Qualifications Framework Act.

 Sec. 7. *Composition of the MC*. The MC shall be composed of the following:
- a. Chairperson of the Professional Regulatory Board;
- b. President of the AIPO;

1 c. President of the Academic Organization (Deans and Heads of Schools) duly accredited by the PRC upon the recommendation of the CHED; 2 d. One (1) representative from Private Practice; and 3 e. One (1) representative from Government Practice. 4 5 **ARTICLE III** 6 ORGANIZATION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT 7 Sec. 8. Creation of the Council of the Built Environment. – The Council of the 8 Built Environment ("Council") is hereby created to be attached to the PRC. 9 Sec. 9. *Objectives of the Council.* – The Council is an overarching body that has 10 the following objectives: 11 a. Advise on policy matters concerning the interests of the public in the Built 12 Environment, including, but not limited to: 13 i. Sustainable development; 14 ii. Human resource development; and 15 iii. Health, safety and environmental protection standards; 16 b. Oversee the regulation of Built Environment Professions, providing guidance 17 on: 18 i. Required qualifications; 19 Standards of education; ii. 20 iii. Training and competence; 21 Promotion of professional status; and iv. 22 Uniform application of standards and guidelines set by the PRC; and 23 c. Facilitate collaboration and cooperation of the Built Environment Professions 24 25 with: i. Other Built Environment Professions; 26 ii. Foreign Professionals; and 27 Non-professional creatives and artists. iii. 28 Sec. 10. Mandate, Functions, and Powers of the Council. – The Council shall 29 30 exercise the following powers and functions:

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Academic Sectors and submit a summary to the Commissioner.

- g. Promote coordination between the CHED and the Academic Sectors for the Built Environment Professions in relation to the accreditation of education institutions;
- h. Coordinate the establishment of MRAs for Built Environment Professionals, providing guidelines on the practice of Filipino Professionals abroad, as well as Foreign Professionals in the Philippines;
- Foster and encourage collaboration and cooperation between Built Environment Professionals by setting up guidelines, terms of reference and standards;
- j. Establish terms of engagement to facilitate the efficient and mutually beneficent collaboration of Built Environment Professional with Non-Professional creatives and artists.
- Sec. 11. *Composition of Council*. The Council shall be composed of *ex officio* members and regular members.

The ex officio members of the Council are:

a. Chairperson of the PRC;

- b. Chairperson of the CHED;
- c. Chairpersons of the PRBs of all Built Environment Professions;

The regular members of the Council are:

- a. One (1) representative from each of the Multipartite Councils (non-PRB) of all Built Environment Professions.
- Sec. 12. *Appointment of Members of the Council.* The *ex officio* members of the Council, except the Chairperson of the PRC, who shall serve as Chairperson of the Council, may designate their respective next-in-rank officials as permanent alternates whose acts are considered as the acts of their principals.

Every regular member shall be appointed by the President from a list submitted by the Chairperson of the PRC, upon consultation with the other ex officio members of the Council, drawn from a nomination process resulting from public consultations with stakeholders engaged in each Built Environment Profession, nominating at least three (3) nominees for every regular member seat: *Provided*, That each of the nominees is not a holder of any government position and must have at least ten (10) years of experience in the profession which the nominee belongs to: *Provided*, *further*,

- 1 That each of the nominees shall have been officially endorsed by the AIPO and the
- duly recognized association of academics of their profession: *Provided, finally,* That
- the list of nominees shall be vetted by a joint task force constituted by the PRC and
- 4 CHED representing the professional and academic interests of the Filipino people,
- 5 respectively.

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- Sec. 13. *Removal From Office*. The Chairperson of the Council may remove
- a member of the Council from office on account of misconduct or inability to perform
- 8 the duties after due process.
 - Section 14. *Disqualification, Vacation and Filling of Vacancies.* A person may not be appointed as a member of the Council if that person:
 - a. Is not a Filipino citizen and resident in the Philippines;
 - b. Has been convicted of a criminal involving moral turpitude;
 - c. Has in terms of this Act been found guilty by the Council of improper conduct; or
 - d. Is not a registered professional.
 - A member of the Council must vacate the office if:
 - a. Becomes disqualified from being appointed as a member of the Council;
 - b. Resigns by written notice addressed to the Chairperson;
 - c. Has, without leave of the Council, been absent for more than two consecutive meetings of the Council;
 - d. Ceases to be permanently resident in the Philippines; or
 - e. Is removed from office under Section 13 of this Act.
 - If a member of the Council dies or vacates the office before the expiration of the term of office, the Chairperson must, within sixty (60) days from the date on which the vacancy occurred, appoint the person nominated by the Council, to fill the vacancy for the unexpired portion of the period for which that member was appointed.
 - Sec. 15. *Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson.* The Council shall be chaired by the Chairperson of the PRC.
 - The Council shall elect a deputy chairperson among the regular members.
 - The regular members of the Council shall serve for a term of six (6) years, unless sooner separated from the service due to death, voluntary resignation, or removal for cause. In case of death, resignation, or removal for cause, their

replacements shall serve only the unexpired terms of the replaced members. Of the first set of regular members, eleven (11) shall hold office for a term of three (3) years and the remaining eleven (11) for a term of six (6) years.

The regular members of the Council shall receive *per diem* every meeting in accordance with existing rules and regulations.

Sec. 16. *Meetings of the Council.* – The Council shall meet at least once every six (6) months, or as often as necessary at the call of the Chairperson or majority of the members. Members of the Council who cannot physically attend or vote at Council meetings can participate and vote through remote communication technologies or other electronic means such as videoconferencing, teleconferencing, or other alternative modes of communication that allow them reasonable opportunities to participate. A majority of the incumbent members of the Council shall constitute a quorum to do business.

Sec. 17. *Executive Committee*. – The Council shall have an Executive Committee consisting of the Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson of the Council and not more than three other members elected by the Council. The Council may appoint alternate members to the Executive Committee.

A member of the Executive Committee:

- a. Serves on the executive committee for a period of one year;
- b. May be re-elected; and

c. Remains in office until his or her successor is elected.

No two members of the Executive Committee shall come from the same Built Environment Profession.

The Executive Committee must hold a meeting as and when necessary, but at least four (4) times per year.

Sec. 18. *Powers of the Executive Committee.* – The Executive Committee shall exercise the following powers:

- a. Ensure that the resolutions of the Council are carried out;
- b. Consider any matter delegated to it by the Council in terms of any law,
 and to advise the Council in connection therewith;
- c. Exercise or perform any power, duty or function delegated to it by the Council; and

1	d. Report at every ordinary meeting of the Council on the activities of the
2	Executive Committee.
3	Sec. 19. Committees of Council The Council may establish any Committee
4	to:
5	a. Assist it in the performance of its functions; or
6	b. Investigate and make recommendations on matters relating to any of its
7	functions.
8	The Council shall designate a Chairperson for any such Committee, and
9	determine the quorum for meetings. The Council shall also determine the terms of
10	reference of the Committees.
11	Sec. 20. Secretariat and Staff. – The Council:
12	a. Shall establish a Secretariat; and
13	b. May employ such staff, as it may deem necessary, for the carrying out
14	of its functions, on such conditions, including the payment of
15	remuneration and allowances, as it may determine, and may dismiss for
16	cause any person so appointed.
17	Sec. 21. Delegation of Powers. – The Council may delegate any power, duty or
18	function conferred or imposed on it by this Act to:
19	a. A Committee established under Section 19;
20	b. The Executive Committee elected under section 17;
21	c. The Chairperson of the Council or any member of the Council; or
22	d. Any officer of the Council.
23	Sec. 22. Annual Reporting. – The Council shall furnish the Commissioner an
24	Annual Report with regard to the functions and affairs of the Council including, but
25	not limited to:
26	a. A report regarding the execution of the functions of the council;
27	b. A report regarding the envisaged strategies of the council; and
28	c. Such other information as the Commissioner may from time to time
29	determine.
30	Sec. 23. Delineation of Scope of Work and Terms of Reference for
31	Collaboration. – The Council must, after receipt of the recommendations submitted to
32	it by the MCs in terms of the Professional Regulatory Laws:

1 a. Determine policy with regard to the identification of work for the different Built Environment Professions: 2 b. Consult with any person, body or industry that may be affected by the 3 identification of work in terms of this section; 4 c. Identify the scope of work for every Built Environment Profession; and 5 d. Establish terms of reference for collaboration between 6 Environmental Professionals, Foreign Professionals and Non-Professional 7 creatives and artists. 8 9 ARTICLE IV 10 **FINAL PROVISIONS** 11 Sec. 24. Appropriations. – The amount necessary for the immediate 12 implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act. 13 Sec. 25. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). -The Professional 14 Regulation Commission (PRC), the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), together 15 with the Professional Regulatory Boards (PRBs) and AIPOs of the Built Environment 16 Professions are tasked to prepare the IRR required for the implementation of this Act. 17 The IRR shall be promulgated within ninety (90) days upon approval of this Act. 18 Sec. 26. Separability Clause. – If, for any reason, any section or provisions of 19 20 this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections and provisions, which are not affected by it, shall continue to be in full force and effect. 21 Sec. 27. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, executive orders, agreements, 22 rules, and regulations, or parts thereof contrary to, or inconsistent with, the provisions 23 of this Act, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly. 24 25 Sec. 28. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
