RESOLUTION

COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE NATIONAL YOUTH CHESS TEAM FOR EMERGING AS THE OVERALL CHAMPION IN THE EASTERN ASIA YOUTH CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP HELD IN BANGKOK, THAILAND FROM NOVEMBER 4-12, 2022

WHEREAS, the Senate of the Philippines has, on numerous occasions, recognized exemplary Filipinos for their remarkable achievements in international sports competitions which brought great honor and pride to the country;

WHEREAS, the Philippine National Youth Chess Team composed of 40 male and female players emerged as the overall champion in the Eastern Asia Youth Chess Championships held from November 4 to 12, 2022 in Bangkok, Thailand.

WHEREAS, the National Youth Chess Team garnered a total of 32 gold, 27 silver and 21 bronze medals in the individual and team categories of the regional tilt which was participated by almost 200 players from twelve nations. The Philippine team also secured several World Titles such as Woman International Master, FIDE Master, Woman FIDE Master and candidate masters from the event;
