"AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A MAGNA CARTA FOR BARANGAY OFFICIALS PERSONNEL AND VOLUNTEER WORKERS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

EXPLANATORY NOTE

As the primary planning and implementing unit of our current political setup the barangay plays a vital role in the delivery of basic services to the people. Barangay officials, personnel and volunteer workers serve as the backbone of the nation. However, they have been neglected for the longest time in terms of benefits, salaries, and allowances.

This bill seeks to remedy such predicament. The bill imposes a more extensive set of grants for the benefits, subsidy and compensation for barangay officials, personnel and volunteer workers. It imposes a minimum and maximum salary rate in which they are entitled to. It also requires that these public servants be covered by the of GSIS social insurance program, PhilHealth Insurance Program and PagIBIG Fund. Hazard Allowance, as well as Death and Burial Benefits, are also granted to the public servants.

Finally this measure aims to provide a preferential treatment for barangay officers in their conferment of civil service eligibility and in government appointments.

It is imperative that we recognize the tireless effort and sacrifices of our barangay officials, personnel and volunteer workers by giving them their due.

Hence, the immediate passage and approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

NINETEENTH CONGRESS OF THE REPUBLIC) OF THE PHILIPPINES

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"AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A MAGNA CARTA FOR BARANGAY OFFICIALS PERSONNEL AND VOLUNTEER WORKERS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. This Act shall be known as the "Magna Carta for Barangay Officials, Personnel and Volunteer Workers."

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Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.*- It is hereby declared the policy of the State to empower government officials and personnel, and public volunteer workers especially at the grassroots level. In line with this policy and in cognizance of the crucial role of barangay officials and volunteer workers in nation-building, the State shall, through the recognition of their rights as civil servants and the provision of remuneration, benefits, allowances and other entitlements commensurate to the service they render to the country, ensure the promotion of the rights and welfare

of barangay officials, personnel and volunteer worker and the faithful execution of their duties and functions.

- Sec. 3. Definition of Terms.- For the purpose of this Act:
- (a) Barangay Elective Officials shall refer to the following: the Punong Barangay; Members of the Sangguniang Barangay; Chairperson of the Sangguniang Kabataan; and Members of the Sangguniang Kabataan;
- (b) Barangay Appointive Officials shall refer to the following: Barangay Secretary; and Barangay Treasurer; Members of the Lupong Tagapamayapa; Secretary of the Sangguniang Kabataan; and Treasurer of the Sangguniang Kabataan;
- (c) Barangay Personnel shall refer to other personnel of the barangay who regular functions in the maintenance of public order, protection and security of life and property, settlement of disputes, preservation of a desirable and balanced environment or delivery of basic social services within the jurisdiction of the barangay government who received compensation in the form of salary or honorarium; and
- (d) Barangay Volunteer Workers shall refer to individuals who have undergone basic training courses conducted by government agencies or non-government organizations and who voluntarily provide ancillary social services in a barangay under a memorandum of agreement between the volunteer worker and the barangay government concerned, which include, among others health workers and tanods.

Sec. 4. *Entitlement to salaries, benefits or allowances*.- Barangay officials personnel and volunteer workers shall be entitled to salaries, benefits or allowance as compensation for services rendered. The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) shall develop a standardized Position Classification and

Compensation Scheme for Barangay Officials, Personnel, and Volunteer Workers, 1 taking into consideration the educational qualification and nature of work 2 performed and the financial capability of barangay and subject to the minimum 3 qualification standards and quidelines to be prescribed by the Civil Service 4 Commission (CSC). Such position classification and compensation and scheme 5 6 shall conform with the following guidelines: 7 a) The Position Classification and Compensation Scheme for Barangay Official 8 9 and Personnel shall be comprised of three salary grades, namely: i. Barangay Salary Grade I for the barangay appointive officials and 10 11 other barangay personnel: Barangay Salary Grade II for barangay elective officials in the 12 ii. Sangguniang Kabataan and Sangguniang Kabataan with the 13 exception of the Punong Barangay, and 14 15 iii. Barangay Salary Grade III for the Punong Barangay. b) The minimum salary for barangay officials and personnel shall be as follows: 16 i. 17 Barangay Salary Grade I Php 7,500 ii. Php 10,000 18 Barangay Salary Grade II Php 12,500 19 iii. Barangay Salary Grade III 20 21 The minimum salary indicated herein may be increased to a maximum rate equivalent to the first step of the following salary grade level and its corresponding 22 salary being implemented by the city and municipality where the barangay 23 belongs: 24

i. Barangay Salary Grade I Salary Grade 6
 ii. Barangay Salary Grade II Salary Grade 10
 iii. Barangay Salary Grade III Salary Grade 15

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- Provided, That no barangay officials or personnel shall suffer any reduction,
 diminution or withdrawal of salaries being implemented by the city and
 municipality where the barangay official or personnel concerned.
 - c) Barangay volunteer workers shall be entitled to honoraria and other benefits, incentives or allowance to be determined in accordance with this Act.

Sec. 5. The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) shall establish a social insurance program to provide life insurance and social protection to barangay officials and personnel.

Sec. 6. The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) shall enroll barangay officials and personnel into the National Health Insurance Program in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

Sec. 7. Barangay officials and personnel shall be covered under the mutual provident savings system of the Home Development Mutual Fund (PagIBIG Fund).

Barangay governments shall include in its annual appropriations the amounts necessary for its share of contributions. The amount of contributions due from barangay officials and personnel and barangays government, mode of collection and remittance of contributions, including penalties for violations thereof, shall be in accordance with Republic Act. No. 9679, otherwise known as the "Home Development Mutual Fund Law of 2009"

Sec. 8. Barangay officials, personnel and volunteer workers who render service in areas declared under state calamity or emergency shall be entitles to hazard allowance equivalent to ten percent (10%) of their monthly salary or

1	honoraria, whichever is applicable, until such declaration has been lifted by a
2	competent authority.
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4	Sec. 9. In the event of death of barangay officials, personnel and volunteer
5	workers during their incumbency, their respective legal beneficiaries shall be
6	entitled to the following death and burial benefits:
7	a) Barangay Salary Grade I – Five thousand pesos (Php
8	5,000.00)
9	b) Barangay Salary Grade II- Fifteen thousand pesos (Php
10	15,000.00)
11	c) Barangay Salary Grade III- Twenty-five thousand pesos (Php
12	25,000.00)
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14	In addition to the death benefits herein provided, a burial benefit of Two thousand
15	pesos (Php 2,000.00) shall be paid to the beneficiaries of barangay officials,
16	personnel and volunteer workers within twenty-four (24) hours after written notice
17	and satisfactory proof of death.
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19	In case of death of barangay official, personnel or volunteer worker occurred by
20	reason, or on the occasion of the barangay officials, personnel, or volunteer worker
21	concerned shall be entitled to twice the death and burial indemnity provided
22	herein.
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24	Sec. 10. Qualified barangays officials, personnel and volunteer workers shall
25	be conferred with the appropriate civil service eligibility in accordance with existing
26	laws, rules and regulations.
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Sec. 11. Barangay officials and personnel shall be entitled to an equitable legal indemnification package in the form of legal assistance and other forms of legal protection and indemnification for all legal costs and expenses reasonably incurred in any administrative, civil, or criminal action, suit or proceeding to which they have been made a party by reason of the performance of their official functions or duties, unless they are finally adjudges in such action or proceeding to be guilty of an offense.

Sec. 12. Qualified barangay personnel and volunteer workers shall be accorded with preferential treatment in employment with national government agencies, local government units, or government-owned-or controlled corporations, subject to the minimum standards and guidelines prescribed by the CSC, and in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

Sec. 13. The budget ceiling for annual personnel services appropriations of fifty-five percent (55%) of the total annual income actually realized from local sources during the next preceding fiscal year, as provided in Section 331 (b) of the Republic Act No. 7160, as amended, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991," shall apply.

Sec. 14. The Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) shall develop, maintain and update a registry system for barangay officials, personnel and volunteer workers to effectively implement the provisions of this Act. The registry system shall be the basis for the release of appropriations for the payment of the salaries and honoraria to barangay officials, personnel and volunteer workers.

1	Sec. 15. The DILG shall, in coordination with the DBM, Department of
2	Finance, Civil Service Commission, Liga ng mga Barangay, and other government
3	agencies concerned, promulgate the necessary implementing rules and regulations
4	within thirty (30) days upon the effectivity of this Act.

Separability Clause In any provision, section or part of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional on invalid, such judgement shall not affect, invalidate or impair any other provisions, sections parts hereof. Sec. 17. Repealing Clause All laws, act, decrees, executive orders, issuances, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are contrary to an inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
13	Sec. 18. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take fifteen (15) days following
14	its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation or in the Official
15	Gazette.
