AN ACT

SEPARATING THE SITIOS OF KIMBUAYA, LONGBOY, BULALA, KINAPIAN, INDADANGAN, KUMANIBE AND MACAAG FROM BARANGAY SUYO PROPER IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF SUYO, PROVINCE OF ILOCOS SUR AND CONSTITUTING IT INTO A DISTINCT AND INDEPENDENT BARANGAY TO BE KNOWN AS BARANGAY KINAPIAN

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Section 9 of Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that "The State shall promote a just and dynamic social order that will ensure the prosperity and independence of the nation and free the people from poverty through policies that provide adequate social services, promote full employment, a rising standard of living, and an improved quality of life for all."

The Local Government Code of the Philippines or Republic Act 7160 provides that the barangay serves as the primary planning and implementing unit of government policies, plans, programs, projects, and activities in the community, and as a forum wherein the collective views of the people may be expressed, crystallized and considered, and where disputes may be amicably settled. To serve the aforementioned purposes in establishing a barangay, the population of the barangays must be maintained in such a manner that the constituents will be represented accordingly.

The Municipality of Suyo is a 4th class municipality in the province of Ilocos Sur. The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) conducted the census-taking for the 2015 Census of Population (POPCEN 2015) in August to September 2015. According to POPCEN 2015, Suyo is politically subdivided into eight (8) barangays only while it has a population of 11,446 people.

The purpose of this bill is to make government programs, services, and facilities closer to the constituents by creating a new barangay. This bill is also deemed relevant to meet the demand for socio-economic development and more efficient access to government resources especially during this time of pandemic.

This bill seeks the creation of a new barangay to be known as Barangay Barangay Kinapian in the municipality of Suyo, Ilocos Sur, to be composed of Sitios of Kimbuaya, Longbo, Bulala, Kinapian, Indadangan, Kumanibe and Macaag, separating them from the mother barangay, Barangay Suyo Proper.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT SEPARATING THE SITIOS OF KIMBUAYA, LONGBOY, BULALA, KINAPIAN, INDADANGAN, KUMANIBE AND MACAAG FROM BARANGAY SUYO PROPER IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF SUYO, PROVINCE OF ILOCOS SUR AND CONSTITUTING IT INTO A DISTINCT AND INDEPENDENT BARANGAY TO BE KNOWN AS BARANGAY KINAPIAN

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Creation of Barangay Kinapian. —The sitios of Kimbuaya, Longboy, Bulala, Kinapian, Indadangan, Kumanibe and Macaag in Barangay Suyo, Municipality of Suyo, Province of Ilocos Sur are hereby separated from Barangay Suyo Proper in the Municipality of Suyo, Province of Ilocos Sur and constituted as a distinct and independent barangay to be known as Barangay Kinapian.

SEC. 2. *Territorial Boundaries.* – The territorial boundaries of Barangay Kinapian are hereby described as follows:

SEC. 3. Conduct and Supervision of Plebiscite. – Pursuant to Section 10 Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, the new Barangay Kinapian shall exist upon the approval of a majority of qualified voters of Barangay Suyo through the votes cast in a plebiscite to be conducted and supervised by the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act.

The expenses for the plebiscite shall be borne by the Municipality of Suyo, Province of Ilocos Sur.

SEC. 4. Barangay Officials. – The first set of barangay officials of Barangay Kinapian shall be appointed by the President of the Philippines and shall hold office until such time that a new set of officers have been duly elected and qualified.

- **SEC. 5.** Public Infrastructure and Facilities. All public infrastructure and facilities existing therein at the time of the approval of this Act are hereby transferred without cost or compensation to and shall be administered by the new Barangay Kinapian.
- **SEC. 6.** *Internal Revenue Allotment Shares.* Barangay Kinapian shall be entitled to Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) shares pursuant to Section 285 of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended.
- **SEC. 7.** Effectivity. This Act shall take effect effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
