AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION OF OUR NATIONAL CULTURAL HERITAGE, THROUGH AN ENHANCED CULTURAL POLICY AND CULTURAL MAPPING PROGRAM, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10066 OR THE "NATIONAL CULTURAL HERITAGE ACT OF 2009"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 SECTION 1. Republic Act No. 10066, otherwise known
- 2 as the "National Cultural Heritage Act of 2009," is hereby
- 3 amended to read as follows:

17	and authenticity of design.
18	(b) "Anthropological [area] SITE" shall
19	refer to any [ <del>place</del> ] LOCATION where studies
20	of specific ethnolinguistic groups are

1	undertaken [ <del>, the</del> ] AND WHOSE properties [ <del>of</del>
2	which are of value] CONTRIBUTE to [our]
3	THE NATION'S cultural heritage.
4	(c) "Antique" shall refer to a cultural
5	property found locally which is AT LEAST one
6	hundred (100) years [ <del>in age, more or less</del> ] OLD,
7	the production of which has ceased.
8	(d) "Archaeological [ <del>area</del> ] SITE" shall
9	refer to any [ <del>place, whether above or</del>
10	<del>underground, underwater or at sea level,</del> ]
11	LOCATION containing fossils, artifacts, and
12	other cultural, geological, botanical, AND
13	zoological materials [ <del>which</del> ] THAT depict and
14	document culturally relevant paleontological,
15	prehistoric, [ <del>and/or]</del> OR historic events[ <del>.</del> ],
16	WHETHER ABOVE OR BELOWGROUND,
17	UNDERWATER, OR AT SEA LEVEL, AS
18	DECLARED BY LAW OR THE PERTINENT
19	CULTURAL AGENCY.

1 (e) "Archives" shall refer to public and 2 private records in any format [which] THAT 3 have been selected for permanent preservation 4 because of their evidential, historical, AND informational value; [otherwise] ALSO known 5 6 as archival materials collections or archival 7 holdings; [the] A place (building/room/storage area) where archival materials are kept and 8 9 preserved; [and] OR an organization or agency, ALSO KNOWN AS ARCHIVAL AGENCY, or 10 11 thereof whose [main] PRIMARY part 12 responsibility is to appraise, arrange, describe, 13 conserve. promote. and make archival 14 materials available for reference and research [, also known as archival agency]. 15

16 (F) "ASEAN HERITAGE PARKS" SHALL
17 REFER TO PROTECTED AREAS
18 RECOGNIZED BY ASEAN TO BE OF HIGH
19 CONSERVATION IMPORTANCE,
20 PRESERVING IN TOTAL A COMPLETE

1 SPECTRUM OF REPRESENTATIVE 2 ECOSYSTEMS OF THE ASEAN REGION. 3 THEY ARE ESTABLISHED TO GENERATE 4 GREATER AWARENESS. PRIDE, 5 APPRECIATION, ENJOYMENT AND 6 CONSERVATION OF ASEAN'S RICH 7 NATURAL HERITAGE, THROUGH А 8 REGIONAL NETWORK OF REPRESENTATIVE PROTECTED 9 AREAS. 10 AND TO GENERATE GREATER 11 COLLABORATION AMONG THE ASEAN 12 MEMBER STATES IN PRESERVING THEIR 13 SHARED NATURAL HERITAGE.

14[(f)] (G) "Built heritage" shall refer to15architectural and engineering structures such16as, but not limited to, bridges, government17buildings, houses of ancestry, traditional18dwellings, quartels, train stations, lighthouses,19small ports, educational, technological, and20industrial complexes, and their settings [,] and

landscapes with notable historical and cultural
 significance.

3 (H) "CLASSIFIED HISTORIC 4 STRUCTURES" SHALL REFER TO SITES 5 AND STRUCTURES NOT FALLING UNDER ANY OF THE FIVE (5) CATEGORIES OF 6 7 HISTORIC SITES AND STRUCTURES, 8 NAMELY: NATIONAL HISTORICAL 9 SHRINES. NATIONAL HISTORICAL 10 MONUMENTS, NATIONAL HISTORICAL 11 LANDMARKS, HERITAGE HOUSES AND 12 HISTORIC **CENTERS/HERITAGE** ZONES 13 BUT ARE RECORDED IN THE NATIONAL 14 HISTORICAL COMMISSION OF THE 15 PHILIPPINES' (NHCP) NATIONAL 16 REGISTRY OF HISTORIC SITES AND 17 STRUCTURES.

[(g)] (I) "Collector" shall refer to any
person who or institution that acquires cultural
property for purposes other than sale.

[(h)] (J) "Commission" shall refer to the
 National Commission for Culture and the Arts
 (NCCA).

[(i)] (K) "Conservation" shall refer to all 4 5 [the] processes and measures [<del>of</del>] FOR 6 maintaining the cultural significance of a cultural property, including, but not limited to, 7 8 restoration. preservation. reconstruction. 9 protection, adaptation, or any combination 10 thereof.

11 (L) "CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT PLAN (CMP)" SHALL REFER TO THE MAIN 12 13 DOCUMENT GUIDING FOR THE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF 14 IMMOVABLE CULTURAL PROPERTIES. IT 15 16 STATES WHAT IS SIGNIFICANT ABOUT A 17 PLACE AND CONSEQUENTLY WHAT 18 POLICIES AND ACTIONS ARE 19 APPROPRIATE WHICH ENABLE THAT

1 SIGNIFICANCE TO BE RETAINED IN ITS 2 FUTURE USE AND DEVELOPMENT. 3 [(i)] (M) "Cultural agencies" shall refer to the following national government agencies 4 5 with their specific areas of responsibility: THE COMMISSION: National Museum [(cultural 6 7 property)] OF THE PHILIPPINES (NMP); 8 [the] National Library [(books)] OF THE 9 PHILIPPINES (NLP); [National Historical 10 Institute (Philippine history) NHCP; National 11 Archives [(documents)] OF THE PHILIPPINES 12 (NAP); Cultural Center of the Philippines 13 (CCP) [<del>(culture and the arts)</del>: and] Komisvon sa Wikang Filipino (KWF) [(language)]; AND 14 FILM DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL OF THE 15 16 PHILIPPINES (FDCP).

17 [(k)] (N) "Cultural education" shall refer
18 to the teaching and learning of cultural
19 concepts and processes.

12	(R) "CULTURAL MAPPING" SHALL
13	REFER TO THE IDENTIFICATION AND

15	WHICH COMMUNITIES DEEM IMPORTANT
16	AND/OR SIGNIFICANT TO THEM. IT IS A
17	SYSTEMATIC SET OF ACTIVITIES
18	AND METHODOLOGICAL PROCESSES
19	FOR, DISCOVERING, DOCUMENTING,
20	ANALYZING, INTERPRETING,

1 PRESENTING, AND SHARING 2 INFORMATION RELATED TO PEOPLE. 3 COMMUNITIES, SOCIETIES, PLACES, AND 4 THEIR MATERIAL PRODUCTS. 5 PRACTICES, AND NARRATIVES.

6 [(o)] (S) "Cultural property" shall refer to 7 all products of human creativity by which a 8 people and a nation reveal their identity, 9 including churches, mosques and other places 10 of religious worship, schools and natural history specimens and sites, whether [public] 11 12 OWNED PUBLICLY or privately [owned], 13 movable or immovable, [and] OR tangible or 14 intangible.

15 [(p)] (T) "Dealers" shall refer to natural or
16 juridical persons who acquire cultural property
17 for the purpose of engaging in the acquisition
18 and disposition of the same.

(U) "GABALDON SCHOOL BUILDINGS"
 SHALL REFER TO SCHOOL BUILDINGS

DESIGNED BY AMERICAN ARCHITECT
 WILLIAM PARSONS AND FUNDED
 THROUGH ACT NO. 1801 AUTHORED BY
 ASSEMBLYMAN ISAURO GABALDON.

5 (V) "GLOBAL GEOPARKS" SHALL SINGLE, UNIFIED 6 REFER ТО GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS WHERE SITES 7 8 AND LANDSCAPES CONSIDERED BY 9 OF INTERNATIONAL UNESCO GEOLOGICAL SIGNIFICANCE, MANAGED 10 11 WITH A HOLISTIC CONCEPT OF 12 PROTECTION, EDUCATION, AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT. 13

(W) "HERITAGE HOUSES" SHALL 14 REFER TO HOUSES OF ANCESTRY OF 15 16 HISTORICAL, NOTABLE CULTURAL, SOCIAL, ARCHITECTURAL, AND ARTISTIC 17 18 VALUE AND SIGNIFICANCE, AS 19 DECLARED BY THE NHCP.

1 (X) "HERITAGE TREES" SHALL REFER TO TREES THAT SHARE COMMON AND 2 3 EXTENSIVE HISTORIES THE WITH PEOPLE WITH WHOM AND PLACES IN 4 5 WHICH THEY ARE FOUND. AS DETERMINED BY 6 THE **APPROPRIATE** 7 AGENCY OR AGENCIES.

8 [(q)] (Y) "Heritage zone" shall refer to 9 historical. anthropological, archaeological. 10 AND artistic geographical areas and settings that are culturally significant to the [country, 11 12 as declared by the National Museum and/or the 13 National Historical Institute | NATION AND DECLARED AS SUCH BY LAW OR THE 14 CULTURAL 15 PERTINENT AGENCY OR 16 AGENCIES.

17 (Z) "HISTORIC CENTER" SHALL
18 REFER TO (1) HISTORIC ZONE, DISTRICT,
19 CORE, PRECINCT, TOWN, LEGACY ZONE,
20 HERITAGE AREA, ZONE, OR TOWN; (2) A

1 DESIGNATED AREA WITH HISTORICAL 2 AND OTHER SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE. 3 CONSISTING OF BUILDINGS OR GROUP OF BUILDINGS, AND THEIR ENVIRONS 4 5 THAT COLLECTIVELY CONTRIBUTE TO 6 THE AREA'S IMPORTANCE AND CHARACTER; (3) A PLACE WHERE A 7 8 SIGNIFICANT EVENT IN HISTORY 9 OCCURRED: OR (4) ANY TOWN, DISTRICT 10 OR ANCIENT SETTLEMENT SITE WITH SPECIAL HISTORIC AND/OR CULTURAL 11 12 SIGNIFICANCE. 4	[record] ACCOUNT of past events [relating to]
5	IN Philippine history.
6	[ <del>(v)</del> ] (CC) "[Historical street] HISTORIC
7	PLACE name" shall refer to a [street] PLACE
8	name [ <del>which</del> ] THAT has been in existence for
9	at least fifty (50) years and [ <del>over time</del> ] has
10	[ <del>been considered</del> ] BECOME historic OVER
11	TIME.
12	[ <del>(w)</del> ] (DD) "Important cultural property"

1 [(x)] (EE) "Intangible cultural heritage" 2 shall refer to the practices, representations, 3 expressions, knowledge, and skills, as well as 4 the instruments. objects and artifacts 5 therewith. associated that communities. groups, and individuals recognize as part of 6 7 their cultural heritage, such as: (1) oral traditions, languages, and expressions; (2) 8 9 performing arts; (3) social practices, rituals, 10 and festive events; (4) knowledge and practices concerning nature and the universe; [and] (5) 11 craftsmanship; 12 traditional AND (6)13 CUSTOMARY SYSTEMS FOR JUSTICE AND CHILD WELFARE. 14

15 [(y)] (FF) "Intangible cultural property"
16 shall refer to [the] peoples' learned processes,
17 along with the knowledge, skills, and creativity
18 that inform and are developed by them, the
19 products they create, and the resources, spaces,

1 and other aspects of social and natural context 2 THAT ARE necessary for their sustainability. 3 [(z)] (GG) "Library" shall refer to an 4 institution where the collection of books, 5 manuscripts, computerized information, and 6 other materials [are] IS organized to provide 7 physical, bibliographic, and/or intellectual access to the public, with a librarian [that] 8 9 WHO is trained to provide services and 10 programs related to the information needs of 11 its clientele. 12 (HH) "MARKED STRUCTURE" SHALL REFER TO SITES WITH A MARKER FROM A 13 CULTURAL AGENCY. 14 (II) "MEMORY OF THE WORLD (MOW) 15 16 REGISTER" SHALL REFER TO 17 DOCUMENTARY HERITAGE INSCRIBED BY 18 UNESCO BECAUSE OF ITS 19 INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE AND ITS 20 OUTSTANDING UNIVERSAL VALUE. THIS

1 INCLUDES DOCUMENTARY HERITAGE 2 LISTED IN THE **INTERNATIONAL** 3 REGISTER, MOW COMMITTEE FOR ASIA 4 AND THE PACIFIC REGIONAL REGISTER, 5 AND NATIONAL REGISTER. INSCRIPTION IN THESE REGISTERS PUBLICLY AFFIRMS 6 SIGNIFICANCE 7 THE OF THE 8 DOCUMENTARY HERITAGE, MAKES IT 9 BETTER KNOWN AND ALLOWS FOR 10 GREATER ACCESS TO IT. THEREBY 11 FACILITATING RESEARCH, EDUCATION, ENTERTAINMENT, AND PRESERVATION 12 13 OVER TIME.

10 SEC. 2. Appropriations. - The amount of Two hundred fifty million pesos (P250,000,000.00) necessary to carry out 11 the provisions of this Act shall be appropriated from the 12 funds not otherwise appropriated and are available in the 13 14 National Treasury. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Act 15 shall be included in the Annual General Appropriations 16 17 Act.

18 SEC. 3. Joint Congressional Oversight Committee. –
19 There is hereby created a Joint Congressional Committee
20 (JCOC) to oversee, monitor, and evaluate the

implementation of this Act. The JCOC shall be composed of 1 2 five (5) members each from the Senate and the House of 3 Representatives, with the Chairpersons of the Senate Committee on Culture and the Arts and House Committee 4 5 Education and Culture on Basic serving  $\mathbf{as}$ Co-6 Chairpersons. The Senate President and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate the other four 7 (4) members of the JCOC from among the members of the 8 Senate Committee on Culture and the Arts and House 9 10 Committee on Basic Education, respectively, one (1) member of which shall be from the minority. 11

12 SEC. 4. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – 13 Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the 14 Commission shall, in coordination with concerned agencies 15 of the government, promulgate the necessary rules and 16 regulations for the proper implementation of this Act.

SEC. 5. Separability Clause. - Any portion or
provision of this Act that may be declared unconstitutional
shall not have the effect of nullifying other portions or

provisions hereof as long as such remaining provisions can
 still subsist and be given effect.

3 SEC. 6. *Repealing Clause.* – All other laws, 4 presidential decrees, executive orders, and rules and 5 regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are 6 hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 7. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect after
fifteen (15) days following the completion of its publication
in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general
circulation.
