RESOLUTION

RAISING THE ALARM ON THE REPORTED "BUKAS MALETA" INCIDENTS AT THE NINOY AQUINO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (NAIA) WITH THE END IN VIEW OF ENSURING A SECURE BAGGAGE AND PASSENGER SYSTEM IN ALL PHILIPPINE AIRPORTS

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 5 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution puts emphasis on the maintenance of peace and order, protection of life, liberty, and property, and promotion of the general welfare as essential to the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy;

WHEREAS, the Joint DOTC-DTI Administrative Order No. 01 of 2012 or the Air Passenger Bill of Rights requires air carriers to reimburse up to half of the amount allowed in the Montreal Convention, in its peso equivalent;

WHEREAS, international flights are covered by the Montreal Convention of 1999 or the Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules for International Carriage by Air, which provides financial compensation of up to \$1,700 for damaged, delayed, or lost luggage;

WHEREAS, despite government efforts to improve the operations and infrastructure of the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA), it remains to be one of the most stressful airports in Asia due to various problems such as baggage issues, as reported by travel surveys in 2022;¹

WHEREAS, there are numerous reports concerning stolen items and damaged luggage of air passengers upon arriving at NAIA;

WHEREAS, news articles reported an incident involving passenger Efren San Sebastian who lost some of his personal belongings including a Louis Vuitton bag worth \$2,000, chocolates, and other expensive items inside his luggage after arriving at NAIA Terminal 3 from New York on 29 December 2021:²

WHEREAS, another incident which went viral in TikTok relates the unfortunate experience of Mr. Ady Cotoco who reported that his luggage lock was broken and \$200,000.00 worth of luxury items like shoes, bags, perfumes, and clothes were stolen from his baggage last 08 September 2022 at NAIA Terminal 3;3

WHEREAS, in a vlog released on 22 January 2023, Vanjo Merano, more popularly known as "Panlasang Pinoy", aired his frustrations when he discovered that he lost valuable items in his luggage such as branded bags, sunglasses, perfumes, and even chocolates upon arriving at NAIA Terminal 1 from Chicago via Philippine Airlines (PAL) on December 2022;⁴

WHEREAS, in a Facebook post, actress and Quezon City 5th District Councilor Aiko Melendez complained to the management of PAL about her damaged luggage during her flight to Taiwan from the Philippines last 01 February 2023;⁵

WHEREAS, these incidents prove that stolen and damaged baggages are a recurring problem at NAIA. As early as 2015, airport intelligence agents found jewelries, wristwatches, blankets, and several padlocks inside the lockers of six baggage handlers at NAIA Terminal 3;⁶

WHEREAS, such incidents negatively affect the economy and our reputation in the international community, ultimately discouraging foreign tourists and investors from entering the country;

WHEREAS, "Bukas Maleta" incidents in our airports should not be the norm and must be properly addressed by the Department of Transportation and the Manila International Airport Authority, in accordance with the redress provided under the Air

WHEREAS, existing protocols in handling passenger baggage in airports must be evaluated and strengthened considering that these incidents reinforce our unfortunate image as the world's worst airport and, ultimately, affect the country negatively;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate of the Philippines, to raise the alarm on the reported "Bukas Maleta" incidents at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) with the end in view of ensuring a secure baggage and passenger system in all Philippine airports.
