#### AN ACT

RESTRUCTURING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE SECTIONS 25, 26, 29, 30, 31, 35, 36, AND 67 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6975, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT OF 1990", AS AMENDED, AND SECTION 32 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8551, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE REFORM AND REORGANIZATION ACT OF 1998", AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

It was Republic Act No. 6975, or the "Department of Interior and Local Government Act of 1990" which created the Philippine National Police (PNP). Later, this was amended by Republic Act No. 8551, which is also known as the Philippine National Police Reform and Reorganizational Act of 1998.

The original law is already thirty-three years old while the amendment to that original law, in this case R.A. 8551, is itself already twenty-five years old. The number of active force that the PNP had when it was created is nowhere near the number of active force that we have now. At present, we have already reached our desired police to population ratio of one is to five hundred (1:500). The data that was used to craft these old laws no longer apply to us today. We need for these changes to be properly reflected in our legislation.

One of the proposals under the legislative measure is to revamp and strengthen the PNP Organization including the National Operational Support Units which now includes the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group, Civil Security Group, PNP Anti-Cybercrime Group, Maritime Group, Highway Patrol Group, PNP Forensic Group, Anti-Kidnapping Group, Explosives and Ordinance and Canine Group, and Women and Children Protection Group, among others. The abovementioned groups will now have a clear legislated mandate to ensure their effective discharge of their duties.

Moreover, under the proposed bill, the cadets of the PNP Academy will be considered as members of the PNP and shall be entitled to the salaries and benefits of an active police personnel. This will put them on the same status and category of those cadets of the Philippine Military Academy.

It is clear that the PNP must be supported by law in terms of being responsive to the needs of the times. All these must be accounted for if we are to properly support the improvement and modernization of our PNP.

In view of these, I humbly request for the swift passage of this bill into law.

## **AN ACT**

RESTRUCTING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE SECTIONS 25, 26, 29, 30, 31, 35, 36, AND 67 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6975, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT OF 1990", AS AMENDED, AND SECTION 32 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8551, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE REFORM AND REORGANIZATION ACT OF 1998", AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- Section 1. Section 25 of Republic Act No. 6975 is hereby amended to read as 1 2 follows: 3 "Section 25. Organization. - [The PNP shall be headed by a Chief who shall be 4 assisted by two (2) deputy chief, one (1) for operations and one (1) for 5 administration, both of whom shall be appointed by the President upon 6 recommendation of the Commission from among the most senior and qualified 7 officers in the service: Provided, however, That in no case shall any officer who 8 has retired or is retirable within six (6) months from his compulsory retirement 9 age be appointed as Chief of the PNP.] The PNP shall be composed of a national 10 office, AREA COMMANDS, regional offices, provincial offices, district offices, 11 **CITY OFFICES**, and city or municipal stations. 12 13 At the national level, the [PNP shall maintain its office in Metropolitan 14
- Manila which] CHIEF OF THE PNP SHALL HAVE A COMMAND GROUP 15 COMPOSED OF THE OFFICES OF THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR 16 THE PNP FOR ADMINISTRATION, THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF 17 OPERATIONS, AND THE CHIEF OF THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF. THE 18 NATIONAL OFFICE shall [house the] HAVE A directorial staff, [service staff] 19

**NATIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE AND OPERATIONAL SUPPORT UNITS**, and special [support units] **POLICE OFFICES**.

## IN CLUSTERED POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES, THE PNP SHALL HAVE AREA POLICE COMMANDS.

At the regional level, the PNP shall have **POLICE** regional offices, including that of the National Capital Region **POLICE OFFICE**, which may be divided into two (2) separate regions, without prejudice to the pertinent provisions of the Organic Act for the Autonomous Regions of the Cordilleras and Muslim Mindanao relative to the creation of a [regional] [p]Police **REGIONAL** [force] **OFFICE** in the area of autonomy. [Each of these regional offices] **POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES** shall be headed by [a-regional director] [for peace and order] **REGIONAL DIRECTORS**.

AT THE METROPOLITAN LEVEL, THERE SHALL BE A DISTRICT OFFICE, EACH HEADED BY A DISTRICT DIRECTOR.

At the provincial level, there shall be a [PNP] **POLICE PROVINCIAL** office, each headed by a [p]Provincial [d] Director. In the case of large provinces, police districts may be established by the Commission to be headed by a [d]District [d]Director.

# AT THE HIGHLY URBANIZED AND INDEPENDENT COMPONENT CITY LEVEL, THERE SHALL BE A CITY POLICE OFFICE, EACH HEADED BY A CITY DIRECTOR.

At the **COMPONENT** city or municipal level, there shall be a [PNP] **POLICE** station, each headed by a chief of police.

The Chief of the PNP shall, within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act and in accordance with the broad guidelines set forth herein, recommend the organizational structure and staffing pattern of the PNP to the Commission.

Such command and direction of the Chief of the PNP may be delegated to subordinate officials with respect to the units under their respective commands, in accordance with the rules and regulations prescribed by the Commission. The Chief of the PNP shall also have the power to issue detailed implementing policies and instructions regarding personnel, funds, properties, records, correspondence and such other matters as may be necessary to effectively carry out the functions, powers and duties of the Bureau. The Chief of the PNP shall be appointed by the President from among the senior officers down to the rank of Police Brigadier General [, subject to confirmation by the Commission on Appointments]: Provided, That the Chief of the PNP shall serve a term of office not to exceed four (4) years[+] AND SHALL BE COMPULSORILY RETIRED AT THE MAXIMUM TENURE IN POSITION HEREIN PRESCRIBED, OR AT AGE FIFTY-SIX (56), WHICHEVER IS EARLIER: Provided, further, that in times of war or other national emergency declared by Congress, the President may extend such term of office."

TO ENHANCE POLICE OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS, THE CHIEF OF THE PNP MAY CONSTITUTE, MODIFY, OR MERGE PNP UNITS AND OFFICES AS MAY BE NECESSARY INCLUDING THE CORRESPONDING CHANGES IN THE NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF RANKS, OR OTHERWISE IMPLEMENT NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS IN THE ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, STAFFING, FUNCTIONS, AND FUNCTIONAL RELATIONSHIPS SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSION: PROVIDED, THAT NO PNP UNITS AND OFFICES HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL OR HIGHER CAN BE CREATED UNLESS PROVIDED FOR BY LAW."

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Sec. 6. Section 29 of Republic Act No. 6975 is hereby amended to read as

NO. 11279, OR THE ACT 18 TRANSFERRING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE ACADEMY 19 (PNPA) AND THE NATIONAL POLICE TRAINING INSTITUTE (NPTI) 20 FROM THE PHILIPPINE PUBLIC SAFETY COLLEGE (PPSC) TO THE 21 **PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE."** 22

Sec. 8. Section 31 of Republic Act No. 6975 is hereby amended to read as 23 24 follows:

[(3) Communications Unit. -- Headed by a Director with the rank 3 of chief superintendent, the Communications Unit-shall be responsible 4 for establishing an effective police communications network.] (3) 5 Logistics **SUPPORT SERVICE**. – Headed by a Director with the rank of 6 Police Brigadier General, the Logistics SUPPORT SERVICE shall be 7 responsible for the procurement, distributions, and management of all 8 the logistical requirements of the PNP including firearms and 9 ammunition. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY 10 DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF 11 **POLICE COLONEL.** 12

[(4) Computer Center. -- Headed by a Director with the rank of chief 13 superintendent, the Computer Center shall be responsible for the design, 14 implementation and maintenance of a database system for the PNP.] (4) 15 Communications AND ELECTRONICS SERVICE. – Headed by a Director 16 with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the communications AND 17 ELECTRONICS SERVICE shall be responsible for establishing an effective 18 police communications network. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY 19 A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK 20 **OF POLICE COLONEL.** 21

[(5) Finance Center. -- Headed by a Director with the rank of chief 22 superintendent, the Finance Center shall be responsible for providing finance 23 services to the PNP.] (5) INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY 24 MANAGEMENT SERVICE. - Headed by a Director with the rank of Police 25 Brigadier General, the INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT 26 **SERVICE** shall be responsible for the design, implementation, and 27 maintenance of a database system for the PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE 28 ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH 29 THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 30

31 [(6) Civil Security Unit. – Headed by a Director with the rank of chief
 32 superintendent, the Civil Security Unit shall provide administrative services and

- general supervision over the organization, business operation and activities of
   all-organized private detectives, watchmen, security guard agencies and
   company guard forces.
- 4 The unit shall likewise supervise the licensing and registration of firearms

The approval of applications for licenses to operate private security 6 agencies, as well as the issuance of licenses to security guards and the licensing 7 of firearms and explosives, shall be decentralized to the PNP regional offices.] 8 (6) Finance SERVICE. - Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier 9 General, the Finance SERVICE shall be responsible for providing finance 10 services to the PNP. (10) HEADQUARTERS SUPPORT SERVICE. - HEADED BY A 7 DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE 8 HEADQUARTERS SUPPORT SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE 9 FOR PROVIDING GENERAL HOUSEKEEPING AND CAMP SECURITY 10 SERVICES TO THE NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS OF THE PHILIPPINE 11 NATIONAL POLICE. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY 12 DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR 13 **OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE** 14 COLONEL. 15

(11) CHAPLAIN SERVICE. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE 16 RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CHAPLAIN SERVICE 17 SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING SPIRITUAL AND OTHER 18 SERVICES FOR THE MORAL GROWTH AND COUNSELING 19 ENHANCEMENT OF PNP PERSONNEL AND DEPENDENTS. THE 20 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF 21 OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 22

(12) ENGINEERING SERVICE. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH 23 THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE ENGINEERING 24 SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OVERALL PLANNING, 25 IMPLEMENTATION, SUPERVISION, AND EVALUATION OF ALL PNP 26 ENGINEERING PROGRAMS, SUCH AS CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR 27 PROJECTS, LAND UTILIZATION PROJECTS, HOUSING AND 28 QUARTERING PROJECTS, AND OTHER RELATED ACTIVITIES. police forces in civil disturbance control, counterinsurgency, hostage-taking
 rescue operations, and other special operations.

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THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL AND CHIEF OF STAFF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

6 [(4) Criminal Investigation Unit. -- Headed by a Director with the rank of 7 chief superintendent, the Criminal Investigation Unit shall undertake the 8 monitoring, investigation and prosecution of all crimes involving economic 9 sabotage, and other crimes of such magnitude and extent as to indicate their 10 commission by highly placed or professional criminal syndicates and 11 organizations.

This unit shall likewise investigate all major cases involving violations 12 of the Revised Penal Code and operate against organized crime groups, unless 13 the President assigns the case exclusively to the National Bureau of 14 Investigation (NBI).] (4) PNP ANTI-CYBERCRIME GROUP. - HEADED BY 15 A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, THE 16 ANTI-CYBERCRIME GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE 17 IMPLEMENTATION OF PERTINENT LAWS ON CYBERCRIMES AND 18 ANTI-CYBERCRIME CAMPAIGNS OF THE PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL 19 BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, 20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL 21 WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 22

[(5) Special Action Force. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief 23 superintendent, the Special Action Force shall function as a mobile strike force 24 or reaction unit to augment regional, provincial, municipal and city police forces 25 for civil disturbance control, counterinsurgency, hostage-taking rescue 26 operations, and other special operations.] (5) Maritime GROUP. - Headed by 27 a Director with the rank of Police MAJOR General, the Maritime GROUP shall 28 perform all police functions over Philippine territorial waters and rivers. THE 29 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR 30 ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND 31 CHIEF OF STAFF ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 32

[(6) Narcotics Unit. - Headed by a Director with the rank of chief 1 superintendent, the Narcotics Unit shall enforce all laws relative to the 2 protection of the citizenry against dangerous and other prohibited drugs and 3 substances.] (6) Intelligence **GROUP**. – Headed by a Director with the rank of 4 Police MAJOR General, the Intelligence **GROUP** shall serve as the intelligence 5 and counterintelligence operating unit of the PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE 6 ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY 7 DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE 8 **RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.** 9

(7) Aviation Security [Unit] GROUP. - Headed by a Director with the 10 rank of Police [Brigadier] MAJOR General, the Aviation Security [Unit] GROUP, 11 in coordination with airport authorities, shall secure all the country's airports 12 against offensive and terroristic acts that threaten civil aviation, exercise 13 operational control and supervision over all agencies involved in airport security 14 operation, and enforce all laws and regulations relative to air travel protection 15 and safety. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY Α DEPUTY 16 DIRECTOR FOR DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY 17 **OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE** 18 COLONEL. 19

(8) [Traffic Management Unit] HIGHWAY PATROL GROUP. – Headed
 by a Director with the rank of Police [Brigadier] MAJOR General, the [Traffic
 Management Unit] HIGHWAY PATROL GROUP shall enforce traffic laws and
 regulations. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY
 DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR
 OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE
 COLONEL.

[(9) Medical and Dental Centers. – Headed by a Director with the rank
 of chief superintendent, the Medical and Dental Centers shall be responsible for
 providing medical and dental services for the PNP.] (9) PNP FORENSIC
 GROUP. – There shall be established a FORENSIC GROUP to be headed by a
 Director with the rank of Police General, which shall provide scientific and

technical investigative aid and support to the PNP and other government
 investigative agencies.

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- It shall also provide forensic examination, evaluation, and identification of physical evidence involved in crimes with primary emphasis on their medical, chemical, biological and physical nature.
  - There shall likewise be established regional, district, provincial, and city forensic units as may be necessary in all regions and cities of the country.

THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

- [(10) Civil Relations Units. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief 12 superintendent, the Civil Relations Unit shall implement plans and programs 13 that will promote community and citizens'-participation in the maintenance of 14 peace and order and public safety.] (10) DRUG ENFORCEMENT GROUP. -15 Headed by a Director with the rank of Police [ Brigadier] MAJOR General, the 16 DRUG ENFORCEMENT GROUP shall enforce all laws relative to the 17 protection of the citizenry against dangerous and other prohibited drugs and 18 substances. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY 19 DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR 20 **OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE** 21 22 COLONEL.
- (11) Police Security AND PROTECTION GROUP. Headed by a
   Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the Police Security AND
   PROTECTION GROUP shall provide security for government officials, visiting
   dignitaries and private individuals authorized to be given protection. THE
   DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF
   OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.
- (12) POLICE COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AND DEVELOPMENT
   GROUP. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the
   POLICE COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AND DEVELOPMENT GROUP shall
   implement plans and programs that will promote community and citizens'

participation in the maintenance of peace and order and public safety. THE
 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR
 ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND
 CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(13) ANTI-KIDNAPPING GROUP. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR 5 WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE ANTI-6 KIDNAPPING GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE IN ADDRESSING 7 KIDNAPPING MENACE IN THE COUNTRY AND IN HANDLING 8 HOSTAGE SITUATIONS. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A 9 FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR DEPUTY DIRECTOR 10 FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF 11 **POLICE COLONEL.** 12

(14) EXPLOSIVES AND ORDNANCE AND CANINE GROUP. -13 HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER 14 GENERAL, THE EXPLOSIVES AND ORDNANCE/K9 GROUP SHALL BE 15 **RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MANAGEMENT, DEPLOYMENT, UTILIZATION,** 16 AND DEVELOPMENT OF EOD AND CANINE UNITS OF THE PNP. THE 17 DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR 18 ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND 19 CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 20

(15) INTEGRITY MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT GROUP. –
 HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER
 GENERAL, THE INTEGRITY MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT GROUP
 SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR INFORMATION GATHERING AND
 CONDUCT OF OFFENSIVE OPERATIONS AGAINST ERRING PNP
 PERSONNEL.

27THE GROUP SHALL CONDUCT INTELLIGENCE BUILD-UP AND28LAW ENFORCEMENT OPERATIONS AGAINST PNP PERSONNEL29REPORTED TO BE INVOLVED OR PROTECTING ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES30SUCH AS, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DRUG TRAFFICKING, HUMAN31TRAFFICKING, FINANCIAL CRIMES, CYBERCRIME, MALVERSATION,

1 PILFERAGE, GRAFT AND CORRUPT PRACTICES, AND SECURITY 2 VIOLATIONS.

3 THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR
 4 FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND
 5 CHIEF OF STAFF ALL, WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

6 (16) WOMEN AND CHILDREN PROTECTION GROUP. – HEADED
 7 BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL,
 8 THE GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF
 9 PERTINENT LAWS ON VIOLATIONS AGAINST WOMENAND
 10 CHILDREN, AND TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS.

11THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR12FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND13CHIEF OF STAFF ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL."

14 Sec. 10. Section 36 of Republic Act No. 6975 as amended by Section 36 of 15 Republic Act No. 8551 is further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 36. Status of Members of the Philippine National Police. - The 16 uniformed members of the PNP INCLUDING POLICE CADETS shall be 17 considered employees of the National Government and shall draw their salaries 18 therefrom. [They shall have the same salary grade level as that of public school 19 teachers:] THEY SHALL HAVE SALARY GRADE LEVELS PROVIDED 20 UNDER EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 107 SERIES OF 1999: PROVIDED, 21 THAT POLICE CADETS SHALL HAVE SALARY GRADE LEVEL AT LEAST 22 EQUIVALENT TO THAT OF POLICE EXECUTIVE MASTER SERGEANT. 23 Provided, That PNP members assigned in Metropolitan Manila, chartered cities 24 and first class municipalities may be paid financial incentive by the local 25 government unit concerned subject to the availability of funds." 26

27 Sec. 11. Section 32 of Republic Act No. 8551 is hereby amended to read as 28 follows:

29 "SEC. 32. Promotion by Virtue of Position. - Any PNP personnel
 30 APPOINTED OR designated to any key position whose rank is lower than that
 31 which is required for such position shall, [after six (6) months of occupying the
 32 same] UPON RECOMMENDATION BY THE COMMISSION, be entitled to a

rank adjustment corresponding to the position: [Provided, That the personnel
 shall not be reassigned to a position calling for a higher rank until after two (2)
 years from the date of such rank adjustment]: Provided, [further,] That any
 personnel **APPOINTED OR** designated to the position who does not possess
 the established minimum qualifications therefor shall occupy the same
 temporarily for not more than six (6) months without reappointment or
 extension."

8 Sec. 12. *Appropriations*. - The amount necessary to cover the initial 9 implementation of this Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations 10 of the Philippine National Police. Thereafter, the amount necessary for its continued 11 implementation shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act of the PNP.

Sec. 13. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) and the PNP shall, within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate the rules and regulations to effectively implement the provisions of this Act.

16 Sec. 14. *Separability Clause.* If any part or provision of this Act is held 17 unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected 18 shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

Sec. 15. *Repealing Clause.* - All other provisions of Republic Act No. 6975, as amended by Republic Act No. 8551, otherwise known as the 'Philippine National Police Reform and Reorganization Act of 1998', that have reference to the foregoing police offices and support units, the heads thereof and their corresponding ranks, and all other laws, executive orders, rules and regulations, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act shall be deemed modified or repealed accordingly.

25 Sec. 16. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 26 publication in a newspaper of general circulation.
