AN ACT

GRANTING ADDITIONAL BENEFITS TO FILIPINO CENTENARIANS, RECOGNIZING OCTOGENARIANS AND NONAGENARIANS, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10868, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE 'CENTENARIANS ACT OF 2016'

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Senior citizens are an integral part of our society with their significant contribution to the labor force, families, and the state by performing their civic duties. In 2020, the Philippines had 9.22M senior citizens as part of our population with half of them actively contributing to the workforce. The State's appreciation and support of our senior citizens, aligned with the 1987 Philippine Constitution Articles XIII and XV declares the state's responsibility to adopt policies that ensure the social security and health of the elderly people, culminated in the Republic Act No. 10868 or the Centenarians Act of 2016. This act grants centenarians \$100,000, a Letter of Felicitation, and other benefits from their respective Local Government Units.

The potential beneficiaries of the Centenarians Act of 2016, remain limited because most of the elderly population do not become centenarians. Therefore, this bill, also inspired by the concept of healthy and active aging aims to amend the Act to provide senior citizens with greater assistance. Many senior citizens live in poverty and suffer from poor health; a 2018 study found that 46% of senior citizens live under the poverty line.² Additionally, most senior citizens do not enjoy some form of pension mechanism.³ Even with the slowing down of the COVID-19 pandemic, the elderly's exacerbated predicaments remain as many seniors struggle to access sufficient food, medicine, and income.⁴

Considering the hardship our senior citizens are facing, this bill aims to expand the benefits of the Centenarians Act of 2016 to include octogenarians, nonagenarians, and increase the cash gift provided to centenarians. This would benefit the elderly population by providing them with needed funds and motivating them continue to live productive lives.

The passage of this measure is thus earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 10868 is amended to read as follows:
2	"SEC. 2. [Letter of Felicitation and Cash Gift] BENEFITS FOR CENTENARIANS.
3	 All Filipinos who reach the age of one hundred (100) years old, whether residing
4	in the Philippines or abroad, shall be honored with:
5	(a) A letter of felicitation from the President of the Philippines congratulating
6	the celebrant [for his and her] ON ONE'S longevity AND
7	CONTRIBUTION TO SOCIETY; and
8	(b) A Centenarian Gift in the amount of one hundred thousand pesos
9	(P100,000.00)
10	"ALL FILIPINO CENTENARIANS WHO REACH THE AGE ONE
11	HUNDRED AND ONE (101) YEARS OLD SHALL RECEIVE A CASH
12	GIFT IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION OF PESOS
13	(P1,000,000.00) ON THEIR BIRTHDAY."
14	Sec. 2. A new section denominated as Section 3 of the same Act is added to read
15	as follows:
16	"SEC. 3. BENEFITS FOR OCTOGENARIANS AND NONAGENARIANS. – ALL
17	FILIPINOS WHO REACH THE AGE OF EIGHTY (80), EIGHTY-FIVE (85),
18	NINETY (90) AND NINETY-FIVE (95) YEARS OLD SHALL ALSO RECEIVE
19	A LETTER OF FELICITATION FROM THE PRESIDENT AND A CASH GIFT
20	OF TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND PESOS (P25,000.00)."
21	Sec. 3. Sections 3 and 4 of the same Act are renumbered as Sections 4 and 5
22	respectively.
23	Sec. 4. A new section denominated as Section 6 of the same Act is added to read
24	as follows:
25	"SEC. 6. LEAD AGENCY. — THE NATIONAL COMMISSION OF SENIOR
26	CITIZENS (NCSC) SHALL IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT."
27	Sec. 5. Section 5 of the same Act is renumbered as Section 7 and amended to read
28	as follows:

"SEC. [5]7. [Funding. – During the initial year of the implementation of this Act, the requisite fund shall be sourced from the available funds of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and subsequently the amount necessary to implement the provisions of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act."]

"APPROPRIATIONS. – THE AMOUNT NECESSARY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ACT SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT.

Sec. 6. Section 6 of the same Act is renumbered as Section 8 and amended to read as follows: 14

"SEC. [6]8. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, the [Secretaries of the DSWD] CHAIRPERSON OF THE NCSC SHALL, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE SECRETARY OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT, the [Department] SECRETARY of the Interior and Local Government, the [Department] **SECRETARY** of Health, [and] the Executive Director of the Commission on Filipino Overseas, THE UNDERSECRETARY OF THE PHILIPPINE STATISTICS OFFICE, [shall] promulgate the necessary [guidelines for and shall take the lead in] RULES AND **REGULATIONS FOR** the effective implementation of this Act."

- Sec. 7. Sections 7 and 8 of the same Act are renumbered as Sections 9 and 10 respectively.
- Sec. 8. All laws, presidential decrees, issuances, executive orders, letters of instruction, rules or regulations, or parts thereof inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Act are repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
- Sec. 9. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
